BARTOW, Fla. – This weekly report is prepared by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to inform the public about upcoming road work in Southwest Florida. Below are the work schedule and lane closure locations for major state road projects.

Motorists are reminded to wear safety belts and drive with caution, courtesy, common sense, and patience as they travel through work zones. Remember, speeding fines are doubled in work zones.

As a reminder, travelers can visit <u>www.FL511.com</u> from their phone to learn about traffic conditions on major roadways across the state. If you know before you go, you can plan accordingly and save time and money.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY

I-75 Punta Gorda Weigh Station Improvements near Mile Marker 160: Construction Project: FDOT is improving the northbound and southbound Punta Gorda Weigh Stations on I-75 near Mile Marker 160 in Charlotte County. Improvements include pavement resurfacing and replacement, replacement of sidewalk and pedestrian features, replacement of static weighing technology and new signing and pavement markings.

The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and other unforeseen circumstances.

Crews will be working on grinding concrete.

The northbound Weigh Station is closed until summer 2025.

Crews may be working close to the roadway. Please exercise caution in the work zone. Construction is anticipated to be completed in spring 2026.

- US 41 (Tamiami Trail) from William Street to Peace River Bridge: Construction Project:
 - The contractor will perform drainage work at the intersection of Rhetta Esplanade and northbound US 41, which will require the closure of the side street and detour of traffic. <u>Motorists should follow the posted</u> <u>detour.</u>
 - Motorists should expect double lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours while the contractor is milling and paving the right lane of SR 45 (US 41) northbound from Virginia Avenue to Marion Street.
- **US 41 from Midway Boulevard to Paulson Drive:** Maintenance project: Motorists should expect intermittent outside northbound closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 8:30 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays while crews perform geotechnical work.
- **US 41 and Harbor View Road:** Traffic operations: From 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., crews will be replacing traffic signal heads. Motorists should expect temporary lane shifts and possible slow-moving traffic. A police officer will be present to ensure both motorist and crew safety.
- **US 41 and SR 776 at Various Intersections:** Hurricane Ian signal repair project: Crews will be installing illuminated signs along US 41 in Punta Gorda and Port Charlotte at several intersections. Motorists should expect minor traffic delays and slow-moving traffic. Please use caution as crews install signs.
- **US 41 from Main Street to Peace River Bridge:** Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime and nighttime/overnight hours while crews resurface the roadway, construct curb, gutter, sidewalk, lane widenings, drainage, signage, streetlight, and signalization improvements.
- **US 41 (South Tamiami Trail) at Olean Boulevard:** Permit project: Motorists should expect the right turn lane from Olean Boulevard onto northbound US 41 to be closed beginning Thursday, July 10 through Friday, July 11, 2025. Work will begin at approximately 7 a.m. for crews to install a new mast arm at the northeast corner of the intersection. Motorists should use caution as crews will be working on and near the roadway.

- **US 17 from Piper Road to West of Golf Course Road:** Construction project: Crews will be constructing new turn lanes as well as milling and resurfacing existing roadway on US 17. Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound lane closures during daytime and nighttime hours. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and possible delays.
- SR 45 (Tamiami Trail) from Kings Highway to Melbourne Street: Construction project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on US 41 (SR 45) northbound and southbound on Thursday, July 24, 2025, between the hours of 7 p.m. through 5 a.m. This closure will be taking place for the installation of new mast arms at the Sunseeker Resort. Motorists should use caution, expect delays, and slow-moving traffic as crews will be working on and near the roadway.
- SR 45 (US 41) from Peace River Bridge (#010050) to South of Charlotte Avenue: Construction project: The improvements under this contract include milling and resurfacing of the roadway, upgrading signing and pavement markings, and traffic loops.
 - Motorists can expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on SR 45 (US 41) southbound from the Peace River Bridge to south of Charlotte Avenue.
 - Motorists should anticipate potential delays at streets intersecting SR 45 (US 41) southbound.
 - Motorists are asked to exercise caution and reduce their speed while driving through the work zone.
 - The estimated completion is Fall 2025.
- SR 45 (Tamiami Trail) from South of Morningside Drive to North of Saint Pierre Road: Construction project: The improvements under this contract include milling and resurfacing of the roadway and upgrading the signing and pavement markings.
 - During construction, motorists should expect daytime and nighttime/overnight lane closures for paving of the mainline and turn lanes.
 - Motorists are asked to exercise caution and reduce their speed while driving through the work zone.

- The estimated completion is fall 2025.
- SR 45 (US 41) over the Peace River Bridge: State materials test: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on the Peace River Bridge, both northbound and southbound, between the hours of 9 p.m. through 4 a.m. Work will begin Monday, July 7, through Thursday, July 10, 2025. Crews will be performing wet-weather field tests on permanent tape. Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway.
- SR 35 (US 17) from Tamiami Trail (US 41) to Bermont Road: Construction project: The contractor is continuing to mill and repave SR 35 (US 17) from Cross Street to Dupont Street; motorists should expect nighttime double lane closures.
 - Motorists should expect daytime lane closures on SR 35 (US 17) eastbound and westbound for the installation of guardrail.
 - The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.
- SR 31 at CR 74 (Bermont Road) Roundabout Construction: Construction project: These improvements will include constructing a roundabout, milling and resurfacing, upgrading drainage, installing new lighting, adding landscaping, signing and pavement marking. Throughout construction, motorists should expect intermittent daytime and nighttime/overnight lane closures.
 - No lane closures are expected for the week.
 - The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.
- **SR 31 north of Myrtle Slough:** Warranty project: Motorists should expect daytime lane closures with flagging operations on southbound State Road 31 beginning Monday, July 7, 2025. Work will take place between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. Crews will be working on coring operations on the roadway and shoulders. Motorists should use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.

COLLIER COUNTY

I-75 at Pine Ridge Road (exit 107) Interchange Improvements: FDOT is reconstructing the I-75 at Pine Ridge Road interchange. The interchange improvements include reconstruction of the Pine Ridge Road Interchange converting to a Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) design, reconstruction of the interchange on and off ramps, construction of pedestrian and bicycle accommodations through the interchange, installation of new signals at the ramps, and resurfacing of Pine Ridge Road through the project area.

The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.

- On Monday, July 7, during the nighttime/overnight hours of 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., motorists should expect lane closures for crews to shift the westbound lanes of Pine Ridge Road one lane to the south in order to complete signal work. In addition, traffic on the southbound off-ramp will shift one lane to the east. These traffic shifts will remain in place until further notice. Please use extra caution when driving through this area and expect delays.
- Crews will be working on drainage installation and roadway work.
- Crews will be working on clearing and grubbing and installing erosion control throughout the project area.
- Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. The expected completion date is mid-2027. For more information please visit: https://www.swflroads.com/project/445296-1.
- I-75 from (Alligator Alley) Resurfacing from Mile Marker 97 to Mile Marker 85: Construction project: FDOT is resurfacing I-75 (Alligator Alley) from Mile Marker 97 (just east of the Alligator Alley West Toll Plaza) to Mile Marker 85 in Collier County. Improvements include resurfacing of the road, replacement of sections of guardrail, shoulder improvements, and new signing and pavement markings.

The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and other unforeseen circumstances.

- Crews will be working on earthwork in the median and guardrail.
- Motorists should anticipate lane closures throughout the duration of construction.

Crews are working close to the roadway. Please exercise caution in the work zone, obey the posted speed limits, and anticipate delays. The expected completion date is spring 2026.

I-75 at SR 951 (exit 101) Interchange Improvements: FDOT is reconstructing the I-75 southbound on- and off-ramp connections and the northbound on-ramp connection to the mainline lanes at SR 951 (exit 101). The northeast quadrant loop ramp will be connected to, and accessible only by, a direct flyover ramp from northbound Collier Boulevard starting south of the Davis Boulevard intersection. This single-lane flyover ramp will carry traffic over Beck Boulevard

and a reconstructed I-75 southbound on-ramp. A single-lane flyover ramp extension will carry southbound I-75 traffic over Davis Boulevard to a new signalized intersection at Collier Boulevard and Business Circle North. This ramp will extend along the western side of Collier Boulevard.

The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.

- Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures for southbound and northbound CR 951/Collier Boulevard during nighttime/overnight hours for crews to move equipment, deliver materials, and construct the overhead bridge work.
- Motorists should expect both northbound and southbound CR 951/Collier Boulevard travel lanes to shift from Business Circle South to I-75 to create work zones for crews to construct the elevated roadway.
- Motorists should expect the outside right turn lane from southbound SR 951 to westbound SR 84/Davis Boulevard closed. Drivers can continue to turn right from the remaining open turn lane. This closure is needed for crews to begin work for the bridge foundation installation and will remain in place through job completion.
- Pedestrians should expect a sidewalk closure along SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) just west of SR 951 (Collier Boulevard) and along SR 951 (Collier Boulevard) between SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) and Business Circle North. Pedestrians may use SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) to Market Street to Business Circle South to access SR 951 (Collier Boulevard).
- Motorists are advised that the SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) eastbound direct access ramp heading south to SR 951 (Collier Boulevard) is permanently closed. The eastbound to southbound right turn will be available at the intersection.
- Motorists should expect reduced lane widths for southbound Collier Boulevard between Business Circle North and Business Circle South.

Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. The expected completion date is summer 2026. For more information please visit: https://www.swflroads.com/project/425843-2.

SR 951 (Collier Boulevard) from Mainsail Drive to Capri Boulevard: Permit Project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on southbound State Road 951 beginning Monday, June 2, through Friday, July 11, 2025, between the hours of 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. Crews will be installing conduit. Motorists should use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.

- CR 846 (Immokalee Road) from Sandra Bay Drive to Oakes Boulevard: Permit Project: Motorists should expect a daytime moving operation on Wednesday, July 9, 2025, beginning at 9:30 a.m. through 1 p.m. Crews will be conducting coring operations. Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway.
- SR 82 from the Hendry County Line to Gator Slough Lane: Construction Project:

 Motorists should expect intermittent southbound and northbound lane closures during the daytime and nighttime/overnight hours throughout the duration of the project.
 - Work consists of bridge construction, adding lanes and reconstruction, milling and resurfacing, drainage, grass median, sidewalk, guardrail, shared-use path, detention ponds excavation, signalization, lighting, and signing and pavement markings.
 - Crews will be performing roadway widening, including clearing & grubbing, excavations, and embankment construction on westbound and eastbound of the roadway. Crews will be performing pile driving on the westbound of the roadway.
 - Motorists should anticipate lane closures with flagging operations on State Road 82.
 - Frequent and brief flagging operations are taking place throughout the day to assist trucks in safely crossing the road within project limits
 - Moss Solar is putting up a solar energy field just East of project limits.
 They will have numerous trucks from now until mid to late July
 delivering the solar equipment out to their site, in addition to 200-300
 project personnel traveling through the SR 82 corridor beginning
 sometime in July.
 - Excavation in pond 1 with off-site hauling of materials, including work zone signage and flagging operations within project limits
 - Church Road is reopened to traffic
 - The current work schedule is subject to change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.
 - Motorists should use caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting the roadway throughout the duration of the project. The estimated completion date is January 2027.
- **SR 29 Wildlife Crossing:** Construction project: Crews will be constructing wildlife detection signs.

- Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on State Road 29 just south of Immokalee during daytime hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.
- Motorists should expect both travel lanes on SR 29 to be intermittently closed, bringing them down to a single lane with flagging operations.
- SR 29 and SR 90 (US 41) Resurfacing and Road Improvements: Construction project: FDOT is resurfacing SR 29 from north of Wagon Wheel Road to south of I-75, and on SR 90 (US 41) from south of Southwest Boulevard to north of Thomasson Drive in Collier County. Improvements to both SR 29 and US 41 include milling and resurfacing, shoulder improvements and new signing and pavement markings. Additional improvements to US 41 include reconstruction of concrete sidewalks, replacement of curbs and installation of pedestrian curb ramps, and replacement of traffic signal detection loops.

The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and other unforeseen circumstances.

 Motorists should anticipate lane closures throughout the duration of construction.

Work on SR 29:

 Crews will be working on milling, paving, and temporary striping. Flaggers will be on site to assist motorists.

Crews are working close to the roadway. Please exercise caution in the work zone, obey the posted speed limits, and anticipate delays. The expected completion date is December 2025.

SR 29 from I-75 to Sunnyland Mine Road: Maintenance project: Motorists should expect daytime lane closures with a flagging operation on southbound SR 29 beginning Friday, May 30, 2025, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Crews will be repairing asphalt deficiencies. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and use caution as crews work on and near the roadway

DESOTO COUNTY

SR 70 from Peace River to Southeast Baker Street: Construction project: Crews will reconstruct approximately 3.4 miles of SR 70 within the City of Arcadia. The project includes the installation of new drainage facilities, relocation and addition of sanitary and water and utilities, upgrading traffic signals, reconstructing sidewalks, and installing street lighting in various locations. During construction, lane closures will occur on SR 70. Temporary pedestrian pathways are in place while sidewalks are under construction. Detours will be implemented while crews work on side roads. Please follow posted signage and use caution in the area.

- Eastbound SR 70 traffic is currently using the north lane up to Lee Avenue.
 Between Lee Avenue and Dade Avenue, traffic shifts to the south lane and continues in the south lane until Roger Avenue, where it shifts back to the north lane.
- Westbound SR 70 traffic remains on the north side of the roadway until Volusia Avenue, where it shifts to the south lane. Between Polk Avenue and Monroe Avenue, traffic shifts back to the north lane.
- Westbound SR 70 traffic between Volusia Avenue and Polk Avenue is expected to shift from the south side to the north lane in approximately one month.
- Crews continue paving and installing curb, sidewalk, and drainage structures.
 Intermittent side street closures and flagging operations are in effect throughout the corridor.
- Pedestrian access is maintained via temporary walkways in active sidewalk construction areas.
- Motorists should expect delays, follow posted signage, and use caution in the construction zone.

Estimated completion is early to mid-2027

- SR 70 from DCI (Desoto Correctional Institution) to Desoto/Highlands County Line: Utility maintenance project: Crews will be installing new utility wires and replacing existing poles.
 - Utility work is expected to continue through July 2025. Utility crews and equipment will be active throughout the corridor.
 - Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures with one-lane flagging operations in place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
 - Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures along SR 70 as crews replace poles and install new wiring. Lane closures will be controlled by flagging operations.
 - Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the work zone.
- SR 70 at Lily Avenue in the City of Arcadia: Permit project: NorthStar crews will be performing a source removal project near the intersection of SR 70 and Lily Avenue.

- Crews will implement a lane closure with flagging operations beginning at approximately 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Wednesday and Thursday, June 11–12, 2025. The lane closure is necessary to support the removal of contaminated soil at this location.
- Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures along SR 70. Lane closures will be controlled by flagging operations.
- Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the work zone.

GLADES COUNTY

US 27 (SR 25) at SR 78 Intersection: Construction project: Crews will be reconstructing the intersection with concrete pavement. Other improvements include milling, resurfacing, drainage, guardrail, signing, and pavement markings. Please use caution in the area and watch for workers, traffic signage, detours, and equipment throughout the project.

Beginning on June 22, 2025, and continuing through August 22, 2025, SR 78 will be closed between US 27 and Industrial Drive for roadway reconstruction. Both eastbound and westbound turn lanes from US 27 to SR 78 will be closed during this time. Traffic traveling to and from SR 78 should follow posted signage and use Industrial Drive as a detour route.

Estimated completion is fall 2025.

- **SR 78 Lakeport:** Maintenance project: Crews will be working along the shoulder, resetting guardrail on westbound SR 78 between Old Lakeport Road and US 27.
 - One westbound lane closure will be in place as needed during this operation.
 - Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers, equipment, and signage.

Expected completion is September 2025.

HARDEE COUNTY

- CR 664 from East of Pool Road to North of Palm Drive: Construction project: Crews have begun work on CR 664 from east of Pool Road to north of Palm Drive to remove and replace Bridge No. 060034 over Little Payne Creek.
 - Expect a full road closure on CR 664 between East of Pool Road and North Palm Drive starting January 6, 2025, lasting approximately 250 days.
 - A detour route is in place to guide motorists safely around the construction zone. Access will be maintained for local traffic only.

Completion is expected in late 2025.

- SR 66 from US 17 (SR 35) to Charlie Creek: Construction project: Crews will mill and resurface SR 66 from US 17 to Charlie Creek. Improvements will include milling and resurfacing. Motorists expect a detour for phase I reconstruction at Merle Langford Road when the westbound lane of SR 66 is closed for construction. Eastbound SR 66 will remain open throughout. Other improvements consist of sidewalk construction, drainage structures, guardrails, curb and gutter, new pavement markings and other safety improvements. Please use caution in the area and watch for workers, traffic signage, detours and equipment throughout the project.
 - The detour will remain in place throughout the duration of the project. Westbound SR 66 was closed from Merle Langford Road to US 17, with traffic detoured via Steve Roberts Special and SR 64. Eastbound SR 66 remained open.
 - Reconstruction Phase II work started June 24, 2025. Westbound SR 66 will remain closed, with the same detour route in effect. This closure supports additional resurfacing and safety work. Portable changeable message signs and barricades will be in place. Temporary pedestrian routes will be provided where sidewalks are closed.
 - Temporary signal is in place around the clock eastbound closure from Nursery Road to Oak Thicket Lane July 7, 2025, to July 13, 2025.
 - Lane closures and flagging operations may occur on westbound and eastbound SR 66 during nighttime hours from 6 p.m. to 5 a.m. Crews will perform milling and paving operations.
 - Motorists should anticipate longer delays in queues, follow posted signs, and consider alternative routes.

HENDRY COUNTY

Districtwide Movable Bridges (Hendry County): Construction Project: The Florida Department of Transportation is installing Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) at the SR 29 (Bridge Street) Caloosahatchee River Bridge (Labelle) in Hendry County. Construction began Sunday, June 15, 2025. This project includes the installation of pedestrian/bicycle detection systems, conduits and electrical components, and connection to bridge tender buildings.

- Bridge work is anticipated to take 3-4 weeks to complete construction.
- Motorists are advised that there will be intermittent sidewalk and lane closures throughout the duration of construction.
- Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Motorists are advised to use caution in the construction zone.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion of construction is in October 2025.

HIGHLANDS COUNTY

- US 98 (State Road 700) from East of Floral Drive to East of County Road 621:

 Construction project: Crews have started to mill, resurface, and widen the roadway. The project includes enhancing drainage, installing Shoulder closures will be in place on both northbound and southbound US 98 for drainage improvements from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
 - US 98 will be reduced to one lane with flagging operations to allow for shoulder grading and sod placement.
 - Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone and upgrading guardrails and updating signage.

Estimated completion is expected in late 2025.

US 98 (State Road 700) from US 27 to Tubbs Road: Utility permit project: Starting the week of April 14, 2025, and work will continue until the end of June 2025. Crews will be installing underground utilities along US 98.

- Watch for shoulder closures and workers near the roadway. Motorists should use caution in the area and be alert for equipment and signage.
- SR 17 from Roberta Avenue to Pasadena Avenue in Sebring: Utility permit project:

 Duke Energy crews will be performing utility improvements along SR 17, including pole replacements, transformer upgrades, and overhead line reconductoring as part of a storm hardening initiative. Tree trimming will also take place to ensure proper clearance from electrical infrastructure.
 - Work will occur along SR 17 between Roberta Avenue and Pasadena Avenue in Sebring.
 - Activities include utility pole replacement, line upgrades, transformer installation, and vegetation management.
 - No lane closures are currently anticipated; however, motorists may encounter shoulder work and intermittent traffic impacts. Flaggers may be present to assist with safe traffic flow.

Motorists should use caution in the area and be alert for crews and equipment near the roadway.

- SR 25 (US 27) from Shoreline Drive to Davis and Gaines Road and SR 25 (US 27) from North of Tower Street to South of Tower Street: Construction project: Crews are reconstructing rigid pavement on SR 25 (US 27) from north of Tower Street to south of Tower Street. Additionally, milling and resurfacing work is ongoing on US 27 from Shoreline Drive to Davis and Gaines Road.
 - Traffic has been shifted to the northbound side of the intersection on US 27 at Dal Hall Boulevard and Tower Street for Phase Two. Motorists should expect daytime and nighttime lane closures on both northbound and southbound lanes throughout the project limits.
 - Dal Hall Boulevard at US 27 will be closed starting June 23 for about 21 days, set to reopen on July 14, 2025. Drivers should follow posted detour signs:
 - Northbound and southbound traffic can detour via Heartland Boulevard or East Interlake Boulevard.
 - Local traffic can use Hillcrest Avenue and Heartland Boulevard for northbound travel, or East Interlake Boulevard for southbound access.
 - Northbound and southbound US 27 will remain open.
 - Motorists should use caution, as a new median configuration is in place at Heartland Boulevard.

- Watch for Inside lane closures northbound and southbound between Lake Clay Drive South and Alderman Drive for median widening.
- Watch for shoulder closures in both directions between Shoreline Drive and south of Interlake Boulevard, and from Lake Clay Drive South to Tomoka Boulevard North, for the lighting scope of work.
- Temporary driveway closures at Wawa and Mobil will continue through July 2025.
- Construction operations will be suspended for the Fourth of July holiday
- Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone.

Anticipated completion is late 2026.

- SR 25 (US 27) from South of Horn Road to South of Shoreline Drive: Construction project: Crews have begun milling, resurfacing, and widening the roadway. The project includes enhancing drainage, installing and upgrading guardrails, and adding concrete pavement markings and signage.
 - Motorists should expect daytime and nighttime lane closures on the northbound and southbound outside lanes of US 27, as well as construction activity at the intersection of SR 70.
 - Motorists should use caution, follow posted signs, and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone.

Estimated completion is expected in early 2026.

- Lakeview Drive (SR 17) near Ridgewood Drive in Sebring: Utility permit project: Beginning Monday, June 2, 2025, crews will begin utility work along Lakeview Drive, starting at the north end where Lakeview and Ridgewood Drive merge.
 - The project involves the installation of new equipment and is expected to take approximately two weeks, Monday through Friday, weather permitting.
 - Lane closures will be in place throughout the work zone. During crane operations, both travel lanes on Lakeview Drive will be closed, and traffic will be shifted using the center turn lane.
 - Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers, signs, and equipment.

- SR 66 from South Orange Blossom Boulevard to US 27 (SR 25): Permit project: Crews will install aerial and underground fiber optic lines for Glades Electric, including 9,290 feet of fiber on existing poles and 4,054 feet in new conduit with 10 handholes.
 - Work takes place from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.
 - Traffic will alternate with one lane at a time, and both lanes will be open outside working hours. Motorists should use caution and watch for workers in the work zone.
- **SR 66 from Payne Road to US 27 (State Road 25):** Utility permit project: Crews are installing new utility wires and replacing existing poles along State Road 66. Additional work includes the installation of underground utilities.
 - Watch for shoulder closures and workers near the roadway.
 - Motorists should use caution in the area and be alert for equipment and signage.

Expected completion is September 2025.

- **SR 70 from Highlands County line to Okeechobee**: Utility maintenance project: Crews are installing new utility wires and replacing existing poles along SR 70. Crews began utility work in March 2025, and operations are expected to continue through the end of the year. Utility crews and equipment will be active throughout the corridor.
 - This project is part of a larger pole replacement effort extending from DeSoto County through Highlands County and into Okeechobee County.
 - Night work at the intersection of SR 70 and U.S. 27 will begin July 7, 2025, from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. and continue nightly through July 10. Crews will replace poles and perform related electrical work during overnight hours to minimize traffic impacts.
 - Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures along SR 70 as crews replace poles and install new wiring. Lane closures will be controlled by flagging operations in place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
 - Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the work zone.

Estimated completion end of 2025.

LEE COUNTY

- I-75 at Colonial Boulevard (Mile Marker 136): Construction project: Crews begin construction on the I-75 at Colonial Boulevard Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) Project. Other improvements along Colonial Boulevard include a Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI) at the intersection of Six Mile Cypress Parkway/Ortiz Avenue and a Superstreet intersection at the Colonial Boulevard/Forum Boulevard intersection. I-75 will also be widened to provide an auxiliary lane in each direction from Colonial Boulevard to SR 82/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. The off-ramps at Colonial Boulevard DDI and the northbound off-ramps at SR 82 will have emergency stopping sites.
 - Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on I-75 and the on and off ramps at SR 884/Colonial Boulevard during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of construction.
 - Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on SR 884/Colonial Boulevard during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the construction.

- I-75 From South of Bonita Beach Road to North of Alico: Construction project:

 Nighttime Lane closure operations will continue Sunday Nights through
 Thursday Nights for resurfacing operations for I-75 northbound and southbound.
 - Beginning on Tuesday, July 8, paving operations will resume.
 - Beginning the week of Tuesday, July 8, motorists can expect the northbound Alico Off-Ramp to be closed during the nighttime/overnight hours for paving. Motorists will need to utilize the posted detour.
 - Motorists traveling northbound on I-75 who want to access Alico Road can detour to Corkscrew Road eastbound and then travel northbound on Ben Hill Griffin Parkway until they reach Alico Road.
 - Motorists traveling northbound on I-75 who want to access Alico Road can detour to Daniels Parkway and then travel southbound on Treeline Avenue until they reach Alico Road.
 - Beginning the week of Tuesday, July 8, motorists can expect the northbound Alico On-Ramp to be closed during the nighttime/overnight hours for paving. Motorists will need to utilize the posted detour.

- Motorists traveling on Alico Road who want to access I-75 can detour northbound to Ben Hill Griffin Parkway and then travel on Daniels Parkway until they reach I-75.
- Beginning in June, motorists should expect to see daytime outside shoulder closures of the northbound and southbound shoulders between the Estero Parkway overpasses and Corkscrew Road interchange (MM 124 to MM 123). This is for contractor access for box culvert cleanout and maintenance.
- Daytime activities will include installation of sign bases and conduit installation for ITS items.
 - This work will be performed during the daytime from inside the right-ofway, away from the travel lanes or behind shoulder closures as needed.

The current work schedule is subject to change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

- Pine Island Road Causeway and Bridge Permanent Repairs: Construction project:
 Phase 2 of construction has begun on the Little Pine Island Bridge. All traffic has shifted onto the newly constructed westbound side of the bridge, allowing two-lane traffic on the new bridge. Safety remains the top priority, so FDOT reminds everyone:
 - This 4th of July, please refrain from using the bridge for any holiday festivities, as this is still an active construction zone. Motorists and Boaters are asked to use caution in the area.
 - Motorists are asked to exercise caution and reduce their speed while driving through the work zone.
 - Pedestrian access to the bridge is not allowed during construction, this includes fishing, and all other recreational use.

The following work activities above are scheduled to occur, however, unforeseen underground conditions and weather may affect this schedule.

- Motorists should be aware of continuing work along the frontage road under Span A.
- The contractor continues work to restore the staging area at Punta Rassa in preparation for handing the area back over to Lee County later this summer.
- Motorists are advised that when traveling on island Bay 3 remains closed for Lee County to continue work on toll equipment.
- The contractor is installing signage and lighting east of the toll plaza.
- Work by others: Sanibel-Captiva Conservation Foundation continues to monitor Least Tern nesting on the Causeway and continues work on the north side of McGregor Boulevard for mangrove restoration. For more information visit: www.sccf.org.

All users are urged to be courteous and pay attention as bicyclists share the road on the Causeway and vehicles are entering and existing at public beach access points of the Causeway Islands Park. Visitors may check www.leegov.com/parks for updated park and Punta Rassa boat ramp information.

- **US 41 (Cleveland Avenue) at Hoople Street** Maintenance work: Motorists should expect to see crews performing concrete sidewalk work from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., beginning Thursday, June 19, through Monday, July 14, 2025. Please use caution and expect delays while traveling through this area.
- SR 865 (San Carlos Boulevard) from North of Crescent Street to North of Hurricane Pass Bridge: Construction project: The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District One, is making improvements along San Carlos Boulevard (SR 865). The purpose of the project is to provide additional travel options on a congested corridor, especially during the peak tourist season (January April). The project will enhance mobility and safety for vehicular and non-vehicular transportation and increase accessibility and connections between community points of interest.
 - Beginning Sunday, July 6, through Thursday, July 10, from 6 p.m. to 7 a.m., motorists should expect single lane closures along San Carlos Boulevard throughout the project limits as crews work on bridge joints and striping along Matanzas Pass.

- **SR 82 from 40th Street Southwest to Shawnee Road to:** Permit Project: Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures and delays on northbound and southbound State Road 82 beginning Monday, June 23, through Tuesday, July 1, 2025. Work will occur between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Crews will be conducting cone penetration tests. Motorists should allow for extra travel time and use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.
- **SR 80 from Buckingham Road to Hendry County Line:** Construction project: Crews will be milling and resurfacing 9.5 miles of roadway, shoulder widening, turnout construction, guardrail, drainage, signing and pavement markings and installing intelligent transportation systems. *Motorists should expect intermittent daytime and nighttime/overnight lane closures throughout construction.*
 - Motorists should expect outside lane closures on eastbound and westbound State Road 80 from Brown Road to Buckingham Road.

- SR 80 (Palm Beach Boulevard) from Carolina Avenue and Morse Plaza: Maintenance work: Motorists should expect to see crews performing concrete sidewalk work from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., beginning Thursday, June 19, through

- Monday, July 14, 2025. Please use caution and expect delays while traveling through this area.
- SR 80 (Palm Beach Boulevard) from Miramar Road to Balboa Avenue: Permit project: 2020-A-192-00006: Motorists should expect lane closures on State Road 80 westbound during the nighttime/overnight hours beginning Monday, July 7, through Monday, July 21, 2025. Work will occur between 7 p.m. through 5 a.m. Crews will be working on milling and paving the right turn lane in front of an entrance to the property. Motorists should use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.
- SR 80 (Palm Beach Boulevard) from Veronica South Shoemaker Boulevard to Alta Vista Avenue: Permit project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. during the week while crews perform soil boring operations to gather design criteria for upcoming improvements to the corridor. Please use caution and expect delays while traveling through this area.
- SR 78 (Pine Island Road) from West of Chiquita Boulevard to West of Santa Barbara Boulevard: Construction project: The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District One will be making roadway improvements including milling and resurfacing, widening, turn-lane construction, and median modifications. Other features of this project include signalization, lighting and signing, and pavement markings along State Road 78 from Chiquita Boulevard to Santa Barbara Boulevard.
 - Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures as crews begin paving operations on the mainline and the new traffic signals are hung at Nicholas Parkway, Chiquita Boulevard, and the Hancock Bridge Parkway intersection.
 - Motorists traveling eastbound on Pine Island Road will not be able to access the left (northbound) turn lane onto Southwest 10th Place. Motorists are encouraged to seek an alternate route.
 - Motorists traveling eastbound SR 78 attempting to access Southwest 10th Place are encouraged to continue eastbound until they reach Nicholas Parkway and U-turn at the intersection. They can then continue westbound until they reach Southwest 10th Place.
 - Motorists traveling westbound on Pine Island Road will not be able to access the left (southbound) turn lane onto Skyline Boulevard. Motorists are encouraged to seek an alternate route.
 - Motorists traveling westbound SR 78 attempting to access Skyline Boulevard are encouraged to continue westbound until they reach

- Chiquita Boulevard and U-turn at the intersection. They can then continue eastbound until they reach Skyline Boulevard.
- The current work schedule is subject to change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.
- SR 45 (South Tamiami Trail) from Renaissance Boulevard to Wild Indigo Lane: Permit project (2022-A-192-00022): Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on northbound and southbound US 41 beginning Monday, June 30, through Wednesday, July 30, 2025. Work will occur between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. Crews will be extending turn lanes northbound and southbound. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.
- SR 31 from SR 78 (Bayshore Road) to Lake Babcock Drive: Construction project: The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District One, is making improvements to SR 31 from SR 78 (Bayshore Road) to Lake Babcock Drive. These interim improvements include building a new four-lane roadway east of the existing SR 31 roadway that will tie-in to the existing two-lane roadway. Additional improvements to the project corridor include separated multi-use trail facilities along both sides of SR 31, lighting enhancements at all major intersections, and significant enhancements to stormwater facilities. Anticipated completion is spring 2027.
- Districtwide Movable Bridges (Lee County): Construction project: The Florida Department of Transportation is installing Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) at the SR 31 Caloosahatchee River (Wilson Pigott) Bridge in Lee County. Construction will begin on Tuesday, June 17, 2025. This project includes the installation of pedestrian/bicycle detection systems, conduits, and electrical components, and connection to bridge tender buildings.
 - Bridge work is anticipated to take 3-4 weeks to complete construction.
 - Motorists are advised that there will be intermittent sidewalk and lane closures throughout the duration of construction.
 - Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.
 - Motorists are advised to use caution in the construction zone.
 - Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion of construction is in October 2025.
- State Roadways (US 41, SR 31, SR 78, SR 80, SR 82, SR 739, SR 865, and SR 867): Maintenance contract project: Crews are sweeping curb and gutter on

state roadways and bridges. Motorists should expect lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and possible delays.

MANATEE COUNTY

- I-75 at US 301 Interchange (Exit 224): Construction project: Project will widen the I-75 from SR 64 to the Manatee River, reconfigure the I-75/US 301 interchange from a partial cloverleaf interchange to a tight diamond configuration, construct new bridges will be constructed over the Manatee River for a northbound exit ramp and a southbound entrance ramp, and US 301 improvements. This week, crews will work on I-75 paving; utility, and milling and resurfacing on US 301; and, applying sealant on mainline bridges over the Manatee River.
 - Motorists should expect double lane closures on northbound I-75 during nighttime/overnight hours from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the construction and double closures on southbound I-75 during the nighttime/overnight hours from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the construction.
 - Motorists should expect lane closures on US 301 during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the construction.
 - Motorists should expect lane closures on Tidewater Preserve Boulevard through the duration of bridge construction.
 - Motorists should expect lane shifts on I-75 and US 301 through the duration of the construction.
 - Drivers should exercise caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting the interstate through the duration of the construction.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion is late summer 2025.

- I-75 and SR 70: Landscape project: FDOT will be installing landscaping and associated irrigation within the interchange this summer through early fall. Motorists can expect occasional shoulder closures on SR 70 and I-75 ramps as tree and plant material are being offloaded (no landscaping to be installed on the interstate). Please use caution in the area.
- I-75 Overpass at 44th Avenue East Extension Lane Closures: Permit project: Lane closures on I-75 at 44th Avenue East in Bradenton (between SR 64 and SR 70) will be in force while crews are painting the steel girders on the bridge deck being

constructed over the I-75 travel lanes. Expected north and southbound lane closures will continue for the next 10 weeks, weather permitting.

- Drivers should exercise caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting interstate through the duration of the construction.
- **US 301 from 25**th **Court East to 13**th **Avenue East:** Construction project: Crews are in the final stages of a 7.6-mile improvement project consisting of milling and resurfacing the roadway, widening in areas, base work, curb and gutter, sidewalk, guardrail, drainage improvements, bridge expansion joints, signalization, and pavement marking.
 - Motorists can expect daytime shoulder closures along US 301 for shoulder construction at intersections between 25th Court East and 13th Avenue East.
 - Motorists can expect intermittent nighttime shoulder widening at various intersections Sunday through Thursday for the next few weeks.
 - The project's completion is expected summer of 2025.
- US 301 and Moccasin Wallow Road Roundabout: Permit project: This roadway project includes widening approximately one mile of Moccasin Wallow Road from a two-lane to four-lane (two in each direction) between U.S. 301 and 115th Avenue East, roadway drainage, signalized intersections, street lighting, pedestrian-activated crossings, multiuse path, sidewalk, bicycle lanes and construction of a roundabout at the U.S. 301 and Moccasin Wallow Road intersection
 - Occasional traffic shifts will be implemented on Moccasin Wallow Road so travelers are reminded to exercise caution and observe the new traffic patterns, especially at the intersections.
 - Project completion is expected summer of 2025.
- **US 301 and SR 37:** Construction project: Crews are working in the project limits. Please use caution and be prepared to slow down.
- **US 41 Business/Green Bridge from Palmetto to Bradenton:** Special event permit: The Green Bridge will be closed to both north and southbound traffic during the 2025 Fourth of July Fireworks display, July 4, from 8:30 p.m. to 10 p.m. Traffic detours will be in place, and motorists are encouraged to use the Desoto Bridge

to travel across the Manatee River. Watch for pedestrians, detour signage and law enforcement in the area.

- US 41 Business (9th Street West) from 6th Avenue to Manatee Avenue/SR 64:
 Construction project: The improvements consist of milling and resurfacing, drainage upgrades, modification and removal of a left turn lane, signalization, lighting, and signing and pavement markings. Single-lane closures will occur throughout the project through completion.
 - Please be alert for intermittent lane closures overnight as the contractor performs drainage improvements, signal, lighting, and resurfacing operations.
 - Median work on US 41 Business northbound from 6th Avenue West to Manatee Avenue/SR 64 will continue with intermittent lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. throughout the project. Please use caution or plan to use an alternate route.
 - The left-hand turn lane going northbound on US 41 Business from 6th Avenue West to Manatee Avenue/SR 64 westbound has been permanently closed. As an alternate route, motorists wanting to go westbound on Manatee Avenue/SR 64 can turn left on 8th Avenue West and turn right onto 10th Street West northbound and then make a left onto Manatee Avenue/SR 64.
 - Project completion is expected summer of 2025.
- US 41 (SR 45) and 69th Street: Permit project: There will be northbound/southbound outside lane closures overnight on US 41 (SR 45) and 69th Street from June 17 27 from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. The contractor will be milling and resurfacing existing roadway due to construction in the area. Please watch for workers and lane shifts.
- SR 789 (Gulf of Mexico Drive) From South of Broadway Street to North of Sea Club Beach Resort): Maintenance contract: Crews will be removing and replacing damaged sidewalks (southbound only). Work will start at the north end of the island, south of Broadway and working southward to north of Sea Club Beach Resort at the Manatee County Line. Shoulder closures with temporary intermittent lane closures will occur Monday, July 7 through Friday, September 26. This will be a daytime operation within the hours of 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- SR 789 (Gulf of Mexico Drive) from South of Broadway Street to North of Sea Club Beach Resort: Maintenance contract: Crews will be reworking the shoulder and placing Hydroseed in various locations both north and south. Work will start at the north end of the island, south of Broadway and working southward to north of Sea Club Beach Resort at the Manatee County Line. Shoulder closures with temporary intermittent lane closures will occur on Monday, July 7

through Friday, September 26. This will be a **daytime** operation from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

- SR 684 (Cortez Road) from 26th Street to 14th Street West (449980-1-52-01):
 Landscaping project: Motorists can expect periodic temporary lane closures for landscaping maintenance for the next few weeks. No nighttime lane closures, or night work is anticipated.
- SR 684/Cortez Road from 75th Street West to 86th Street West: Permit project: There will be alternating eastbound/westbound inside and outside lane closures on SR 684/Cortez Road from 75th Street West to 86th Street West through September 30 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The contractor will be constructing right turn lanes, median dual left turns, two intersection improvements, side street improvements, signing and pavement markings and drainage improvements. Please watch for lane shifts and construction workers.
- SR 70 from Lorraine Road to Bourneside Boulevard, Bradenton: Construction project: This project includes widening SR 70 from Lorraine Road to Bourneside Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane or six-lane divided roadway, depending on the location, construction of roundabouts on SR 70 at Uihlein Road, Del Webb Boulevard, and Bourneside Boulevard, intersection improvements at the existing signalized intersection of Greenbrook Boulevard and Lorraine Road, construction of four bridges over two Braden River crossing locations, new drainage system, construction of 10-foot shared use paths, street lighting, and landscaping, and installation of new fiber optic cable connecting the two signalized intersections to Manatee County's regional Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS).

This week's work will consist of:

- Crews will install lighting conduit and light poles between Greenbrook Boulevard and Uihlein Road
- Crews will import and grade roadway base material between newly constructed eastbound bridges.
- Sod will be placed along the outside swales for eastbound SR 70 between Uihlein Road and Bourneside Boulevard.
- Clearing of existing vegetation will occur between Bourneside Boulevard and Polo Run on the north side of SR 70.
- Embankment hauling will occur between Bourneside Boulevard and Polo Run on the north side of SR 70. Trucks will be crossing current SR 70 travel lanes. Please be aware of flaggers stopping traffic for this crossing.

Please use caution and watch for trucks and construction vehicles entering or exiting the work zone throughout the construction limits. Work will occur Monday through Saturday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Please use caution and be aware of workers and flaggers in the area.

Bourneside Boulevard is closed to construct the south portion of the Bourneside Boulevard roundabout. During this time, no traffic will be permitted on Bourneside Boulevard between Avenue and SR 70 in either direction while the existing roadway will be under construction. Motorists should use caution in the area and follow the designated detour route provided via The Masters Avenue to Lorraine Road. The closure is expected to be in place through July 2025.

SR 70 from Bourneside Boulevard to Waterbury Road: Construction project: This project includes widening SR 70 from Bourneside Boulevard to Waterbury Road from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway. Safety features will include roundabouts to be constructed at 197th Street East/Lindrick Lane, 213th Street East, 225th Street East/Panther Ridge Trail and County Road 675/Waterbury Road. The project will also include the installation of a new drainage system, new curb and gutter, construction of 10-foot shared-use paths and five-foot paved shoulders on both sides of the roadway, street lighting throughout the project and landscaping inside the roundabouts.

This week's work will consist of:

- Grading for the future shared-use path and roadway on the south side of SR 70 between 197th Street and Meadow Dove Lane.
- Drainage work will continue with the installation of underground storm drainage pipe on the north side of SR 70 at CR 675. Crews will be crossing CR 675 with drainage pipe using lane closures on CR 675. Be aware of flaggers directing traffic.
- Future eastbound construction will continue with embankment hauling and stabilized subgrade and base construction across from the future pond, between 213th Street and 225th Street, on the south side of SR 70. Roadway base will be imported and graded from 197th Street to 213th Street.
- Drainage swale grading will continue between 213th Street and Meadow Dove Lane on the south side of SR 70.
- Utility relocation work will occur on the north side of SR 70 on the shoulder.
- Installation of concrete foundations and pull boxes for future lighting on the south side of SR 70 from west of 213th Street to Meadow Dove Lane.

 Paving will occur at night on the south side of SR 70 between Lindrick Lane and 213th Street. This will occur outside of the travel lanes on future eastbound lanes. The work will occur for one night.

A traffic shift for both directions of SR 70 in between Lindrick Lane and 213th Street is scheduled for July 11, weather permitting. There will be no closures for this shift, but please use additional caution and be advised that the posted speed limit in this area will be reduced to 35 mph. There will not be detours associated with the shift, but message boards will be provided, and advanced notice with specific closure dates will be provided once available.

In the upcoming months, Lindrick Lane, 213th Street, Panther Ridge Trail, and Meadow Dove Lane will be closed at SR 70 to construct the south portions of each intersection's roundabout. The north side of these intersections will not be impacted. These closures are tentatively planned to begin in late summer and will occur one at a time with no concurrent closures. Detours and message boards will be provided, and advanced notice with specific closure dates will be provided once available.

- **SR 64 from 10**th **Street East to Braden River:** Construction project: Crews are working on milling and resurfacing, adding drainage improvements, replacing guardrails, new pedestrian signals, temporary and permanent electrical improvements, pavement reconstruction, sidewalks and curb, ramp reconstruction, signing and pavement markings, signalization, and lighting.

- SR 64 (Manatee Ave) at 25th Street West (Outside Westbound Lane Closure: Maintenance contract: Crews will be making drainage repairs in the outside westbound lane near 25th Street West. Repairs will consist of cutting open and excavating a section of roadway on Monday, July 7 and Tuesday, July 8 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Traffic will be directed to the inside lane. Please use caution-- this will be a daytime operation.

- **SR 62 Starting at SR 37 Westbound towards US 301:** Maintenance contract: Crews will be reworking ditches. Please use caution-- this will be a **daytime** shoulder closure from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Lakewood Ranch Boulevard from SR 70 to University Parkway: Permit project: Manatee County will be milling and resurfacing Lakewood Ranch Boulevard from SR 70 to University Parkway, through December 31, 2025. There will be intermittent alternating westbound SR 70 inside/outside dual left turn lanes onto southbound Lakewood Ranch Boulevard during the project. Please use caution and look for lane shifts and construction workers.
- Manatee County Installation of detection technology on various bridges:

 Construction project: Crews will begin the installation of pedestrian/bicycle detection systems, conduits and electrical components, and connections to the bridge tender buildings.

There are no planned lane or ramp closures scheduled for the week of Sunday, July 6 through Saturday, July 12, as the crews will be working off the roadway.

 - Pedestrians should follow the sidewalk detours and temporary crosswalks at the I-4 ramps located south of I-4, while crews work in the area. Use caution and follow the detour signs.

 Construction project: Project improvements include milling and resurfacing, reconstructing the outside westbound travel lane from Combee Road to North Eastside Drive, removing the traffic separator, adding a keyhole bike lane and upgrading signal equipment at East Lake Paker Drive, drainage improvements, curb, gutter and sidewalk improvements with ADA ramps, driveway reconstruction, and upgrading and adding lighting throughout the project. This week the contractor will work on signals and lighting without any anticipated lane closures. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.
- US 27 from Sand Mine Boulevard to Student Drive: Maintenance permit project: Watch for northbound and southbound daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Mondays through Fridays through the end of July as crews install storm waterpipe and construct turn lanes.
- **US 27 from Ronald Reagan Boulevard to Elgin Boulevard:** Maintenance permits: Watch for nighttime/overnight northbound outside lane closures from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Monday through Thursdays as crews pave turn lanes and for future development.

- **US 27 at Forest Lake Drive:** Maintenance permit project: Crews will be paving the new northbound right turn lane into Forest Lake Drive from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., Mondays through Thursdays. Expect daytime northbound lane closures and be prepared to merge.

- US 27 from Main Street to Blue Heron Boulevard: Maintenance permits project: Watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures from 9 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. while Haines City Utilities contractor bores for a 20" watermain line. Crews are replacing sod in the right-of-way along Main Street. Watch for lane closures and be prepared to merge.
- **US 27 from Hunt Brothers Road to West County Line Road:** Maintenance contracts project: Watch for median shoulder closure from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. through Friday, July 14, as crews work within the medians. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.
- US 17/US 98 from 9th Street NE in Fort Meade to Oak Hammock Loop in Bartow:

 Construction project: Project improvements include milling and resurfacing of the existing pavement, signal upgrades, inside shoulder widening, bicycle keyhole lanes at the existing right turn lanes, intersection improvements at CR 640/Homeland Garfield Road that include additional lighting and pedestrian upgrades, revising the two full access median openings with directional median openings at 3rd Street NE and Pembroke Road North, and widening the median to provide a northbound to southbound U-turn lane approximately 200' north of Pembroke Road. Expect northbound and southbound lane closures throughout the project. Use caution and be prepared to merge.
- **US 17/92 from Tiny Flower Road to Lem Carnes Road:** Maintenance permit project: Expect daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. as crews work on a turn lane and drainage into a new development.
- US 17 from South of Spirit Lake Road to South of Griffin Road: Maintenance contracts project: Watch for north and southbound lane closures at night/overnight from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., through Tuesday, July 22 while crews mill and resurface the roadway. Use caution and be prepared to merge.
- SR 572 from Airport Road to Pipkin Creek Road and SR 572 Roundabout at Waring Road: Construction project: Project improvements include resurfacing

and lane widening on SR 572 and a new roundabout at Waring Road. This week, crews will work on utilities, drainage, and roadway grading.

- SR 570B (Central Polk Parkway): Turnpike project: Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is constructing Central Polk Parkway/State Road (SR) 570B, a new, four-lane (two lanes in each direction) tolled roadway. This new stretch of roadway will begin at Polk Parkway/SR 570 and Winter Lake Road/SR 540 and extend approximately 6.5 miles to US 17/SR 35. Expect lane closures and intermittent work on SR 540 (Winter Lake Road). Use caution and be prepared to merge. The westbound Polk Parkway exit ramp to Winter Lake Road (Exit 14) is expected to remain closed through late 2025. Westbound Polk Parkway/SR 570 traffic wishing to access Winter Lake Road/SR 540 (Exit 14) will be directed to exit at US 92 (Exit 17), travel east on US 92 to Recker Highway/CR 655, travel southeast on Recker Highway to Spirit Lake Road, and travel south on Spirit Lake Road to access Winter Lake Road. - SR 542 (Dundee Road) from Lake Elbert Drive NE to 17th Street NE: Maintenance permit project: Expect traffic shifts, lane closures and pedestrian detours through late July as crews work in front of Elbert Elementary School. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.
- SR 60 from West of Saddlebag Lake Road to East of Tiger Lake Road: Construction project: This project includes milling and resurfacing, drainage improvements, guardrail installation, lighting, bridge railing and pavement grooving. Motorists can expect daytime and nighttime/overnight lane closures of the outside eastbound and westbound lanes at the Weohyakapka Creek Bridge. These closures are necessary for traffic railing wall installation, roadway widening, and drainage work. Use caution when traveling through the area and be prepared to merge.
- SR 60 from CR 555 (Crown Avenue/Agricola Road) to Broadway Avenue and from the Eastbound SR 60 Split to East of the Peace River Overflow Bridge: Construction project: This project includes milling and resurfacing, drainage, sidewalk and guardrail work, signal, lighting and ITS upgrades, and minor bridge rehabilitation. This week crews will be installing signal sensors in the roadway at both the CR 555 and West Main Street intersections and paving from Agricola Road to North Broadway Avenue. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures and be prepared to merge.
- **SR 37 from SR 674 to 4 Corners Mine Road:** Maintenance contracts project: Watch for shoulder closure from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. through July 26, as crews work within the outside shoulders. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.
- **SR 37 (East Church Avenue) from Dean Street to Cameron Street:** Utility project: Utility crews will be replacing 15 poles and performing miscellaneous overhead work. Expect lane closures between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. or after 7 p.m. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.

- SR 33 (Lakeland Hills Boulevard) from Parkview Place to Griffin Road:
 Construction project: Project improvements include roadway reconstruction,
 milling & resurfacing, placing curb and gutter, installing a new drainage system,
 widening sidewalk, upgrading signals and lighting, and upgrading water and
 sewer lines for the City of Lakeland. This week workers will continue installing
 drainage and water lines along the east side of Lakeland Hills Boulevard.
 - Starting, Tuesday, July 8, 2025, and lasting approximately one week, East Bella Vista Street, east of Lakeland Hills Boulevard, will be closed at the intersection. Motorists will be detoured at East Crawford Street to Gilmore Avenue back to East Bella Vista.

- SR 789 (Gulf of Mexico Drive) through Longboat Key: Motorists and cyclists are advised to use caution along the entirety of SR 789 on Longboat Key in both Sarasota and Manatee Counties. Hazardous conditions may remain in isolated areas that were damaged during the storms.
- SR 789 (Gulf of Mexico Drive) between Little Ringling Bridge (Coon Key Bridge) and St. Armand's Circle: Maintenance project: Intermittent right and left lane closures on SR 789 (north and southbound) will be in place from June 16-20 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. for shoulder repairs. Please watch for new traffic patterns, workers and traffic control personnel in the area.
- SR 777 River Road from I-75 to US 41: Construction project: Road embankment installation continues on the northbound roadway from Aucilla Drive to US 41. As embankment is completed, drainage installations, subgrade mixing, curb placement, and roadway grading will continue. Sod installation, signal, ITS, and lighting work is ongoing. Noise wall installation at the Caribbean Village Community will continue until complete. Trucks will be crossing the road at various locations using intermittent flagging operations. Pothole maintenance will continue as necessary on all current travel ways through the project.
- SR 758/Bee Ridge Road from Briggs Avenue to Beneva Road: Permit project: There will be intermittent eastbound outside lane closures on Bee Ridge Road (SR 758) from Briggs Avenue to Beneva Road through July 11, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The contractor will be installing power poles within the FDOT right of way. Please watch for workers and lane shifts.
- SR 758/Bee Ridge Road at the Legacy Trail: Construction project: Crews are constructing two new pedestrian bridges and intersection improvements along the Legacy Trail in Sarasota County.

- **Limited opening:** The Bee Ridge Bridge span is open for cyclists and pedestrians but is still an active construction zone. While the bridge is open, the pedestrian staircases are not yet complete. Please be aware of the potential for workers and construction vehicles in the area.
- Lane closures: As the project is finalized, there will be occasional daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Final project completion is expected late July 2025.

- SR 683/Washington Boulevard from Oak Street to Laurel Street: Permit project: There is a sidewalk closure on US 301 between Oak Street and Laurel Street with possible outside northbound lane closures for construction of a development. Please watch for sidewalk detours, lane shifts and construction workers.
- **SR 72/Clark Road and the Legacy Trail**: Construction project: Crews are constructing two new pedestrian bridges and intersection improvements along the Legacy Trail in Sarasota County.
 - Lane closures: As the project is finalized, there will be occasional daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
 - Detours: The next detours are expected from July 6 through July 8.
 Motorists can expect scheduled detours east and westbound on Clark Road from 7 p.m. through 6 a.m. The detours are necessary so crews can conduct overhead bridge construction and eventually remove the existing Legacy Trail crosswalk at Clark Road.
 - Project completion is expected in July 2025.
- Clark Road (SR 72) from Honore Avenue to West of Gantt Road: Construction project: The Florida Department of Transportation will commence milling, resurfacing, installing curb, gutter, drainage and pavement markings on less than one-half mile on Clark Road (SR 72) from Honore Avenue to west of Gantt Road in Sarasota County in June.
 - Motorists can expect intermittent single- and dual-lane closures overnight throughout the project.
 - Please watch for signs, barricades and workers close to the travel lanes and obey posted speed limits in the construction zone.
 - The Palmer Crossing Mall entrance off Clark Road at Chick-fil-A /Shell gas station/Jimmy John's will have a temporary road closure starting on July 11

that will continue for approximately three months. Patrons can access the businesses via two other entrances to the mall off Clark Road and two entrances off Honore

The project's estimated completion is in mid-2026.
