# DISTRICT ONE DISTRICTWIDE ROADWATCH REPORT #15 FOR WEEK APRIL 14 - 20, 2024

District One is twelve counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee, Polk, and Sarasota

**BARTOW, Fla.** – <u>This weekly report is prepared by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to inform the public about upcoming road work in Southwest Florida.</u> Below are the work schedule and lane closure locations for major state road projects.

Motorists are reminded to wear safety belts and drive with caution, courtesy, common sense, and patience as they travel through work zones. Remember, speeding fines are doubled in work zones.

As a reminder, travelers can visit <a href="www.FL511.com">www.FL511.com</a> or dial "511" from their phone to learn about traffic conditions on major roadways across the state. If you know before you go, you can plan accordingly and save time and money.

# **CHARLOTTE COUNTY**

- **US 41 from Midway Boulevard to Paulson Drive:** Maintenance project: Motorists should expect intermittent outside northbound closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 8:30 p.m. to 6 a.m. weekdays, while crews perform geotechnical work.
- **US 41 and Harbor View Road:** Traffic operations: From 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., crews will be replacing traffic signal heads. Motorists should expect temporary lane shifts and possible slow-moving traffic. A police officer will be present to ensure both motorist and crew safety.

Main Street to Peace River Bridge: Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime and nighttime/overnight hours while crews resurface the roadway, construct curb, gutter, sidewalk, lanes widenings, drainage, signage, Street Light, and signalization improvements.

Motorists should expect intermittent southbound and northbound lane closures from Aqui Esta Drive to Payne Street during daytime hours from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. and during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.

Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway.

**US 41/Tamiami Trail from Payne Street to Rio Villa Drive:** Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during daytime and nighttime/overnight hours while crews resurface the roadway, construct curb, gutter, sidewalk, lanes widenings, drainage, signage, streetlight, and signalization improvements.

Motorists should expect intermittent south and northbound lane closures from Aqui Esta Drive to Payne Street during daytime hours from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. and during night/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.

Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway. The expected project completion is early 2024.

- US 17 from Piper Road to West of Golf Course Road: Construction project:

  Crews will be constructing new turn lanes as well as milling and resurfacing existing roadway on US 17. Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound lane closures during daytime and nighttime hours. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and possible delays.
- **US 41 and SR 776 at Various Intersections:** Hurricane Ian signal repair project: Crews will be installing illuminated signs along US 41 in Punta Gorda and Port Charlotte at several intersections. Motorists should expect minor traffic delays and slow-moving traffic. Please use caution as crews install signs.
- SR 17 from Bernadean Boulevard to Argo Road: Maintenance Project: Crews will be constructing a turn lane addition on SR 17 northbound. Motorists should expect lane closures and possible delays through Monday, April 29, 2024, during the nighttime/overnight hours between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. Please use caution when traveling through this area.
- SR 776 from River Lane to Manor Road: Maintenance Project: Crews will be working on SR 776 westbound to relocate utilities during the overnight/nighttime hours of 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. Lane closures are scheduled from Tuesday, May 14 through

Wednesday, May 15, 2024. Slow-moving traffic and possible delays are to be anticipated.

# **COLLIER COUNTY**

I-75 from Mile Marker 76 to Mile Marker 100/Toll Plaza: Construction project: Crews will widen and resurface the roadway as well as construct new guardrail and wildlife crossings.

Motorists should expect intermittent southbound and northbound lane closures during daytime hours throughout the duration of the project.

Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway. The expected project completion is spring 2024.

I-75 from the Broward County line to the east of the bridge over Wildlife Crossing #15: Construction project: Crews will widen and resurface the roadway as well as construct new guardrail and wildlife crossings.

Motorists should expect intermittent southbound and northbound lane closures during daytime hours throughout the duration of the project.

Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway. The expected project completion is spring 2024.

- I-75 at SR 951 (exit 101) Interchange Improvements: FDOT is reconstructing the I-75 southbound on and off-ramp connections and the northbound on-ramp connection to the mainline lanes at SR 951 (exit 101). The northeast quadrant loop ramp will be connected to, and accessible only by, a direct flyover ramp from northbound Collier Boulevard starting south of the Davis Boulevard intersection. This single-lane flyover ramp will carry traffic over Beck Boulevard and a reconstructed I-75 southbound on-ramp. A single-lane flyover ramp extension will carry I-75 southbound traffic over Davis Boulevard to a new signalized intersection at Collier Boulevard and Business Circle North. This ramp will extend along the western side of Collier Boulevard.
  - Beginning Monday, April 15, motorists should expect the outside right turn lane from southbound SR 951 to westbound SR 84/Davis Boulevard closed. Drivers will be able to turn right from the through lane. This closure is needed for crews to begin work for the force main and bridge foundation installation and will remain in place through job completion.
  - Pedestrians should expect a sidewalk closure along SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) just west of SR 951 (Collier Boulevard) and along SR 951 (Collier Boulevard) between SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) and Business Circle

- North. Pedestrians may use SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) to Market Street to Business Circle South to access SR 951 (Collier Boulevard).
- Motorists are advised that the SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) eastbound direct access ramp heading south to SR 951 (Collier Boulevard) is permanently closed. The eastbound to southbound right turn will be available at the intersection.
- Motorists should expect reduced lane widths for southbound Collier Boulevard between Business Circle North and Business Circle South.
- Motorists can expect daytime lane closures between 10 a.m. and 1 p.m. on northbound Collier Boulevard from just south of Beck Boulevard to just south of the southbound on-ramp at I-75.
- During the month of March, motorists can expect lane closures during the overnight/nighttime hours of 9:30 p.m. to 6 a.m. on southbound Collier Boulevard between Beck Boulevard and Business Circle North.
- Crews continue to drive pile for the new bridge over Beck Boulevard, east of Collier Boulevard. This work is expected to continue through April.

Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. The expected completion date is spring 2026. For more information please visit: https://www.swflroads.com/project/425843-2.

**US 41 at Oasis Visitor Center:** Construction project: Crews will construct an eastbound left turn lane from US 41 at the Oasis Visitor Center. Additional improvements include lane widening, guardrail installation, resurfacing, and new signage and pavement markings at the intersection.

Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures and shifts during daytime hours from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. throughout the duration of the project.

Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway.

Shoulder closures and bicyclists flagging operation during daytime working operations.

- **US 41 at the Treviso Bay Entrance east of Johns Street:** Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent northbound lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. while crews make turn lane modifications. Motorists should use caution as crews work on the roadway.
- SR 84/Davis Boulevard from Ospreys Landing to West Crown Point Boulevard:

  Maintenance permit project: Motorists should expect intermittent westbound

lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. while crews replace underground utilities. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and possible delays.

US 41 From East of Whistler's Cove Boulevard to West of Collier Boulevard:

Construction project: Crews will be working on widening areas, curb construction, and installation of permanent signs throughout project limits.

No anticipated lane closures during this time. Crews will utilize turn lanes if needed.

Motorists should use caution as crews work near the roadway.

**US 41 from Immokalee Road to Wiggens Pass:** Construction Project: Crews will be working in the southbound direction on US 41 from Immokalee Road to Wiggens Pass installing a turn lane. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours through May 5, 2024.

Please use caution when traveling in the area.

SR 45 from Trail Terrace Drive to Michigan Avenue: Maintenance project:

Driveway installation and turn lane median realignment is scheduled to start Monday, March 18 through Monday, April 29, 2024. Temporary lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours between 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. on US 41 northbound as crews work in the roadway.

Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic while traveling in the area.

- **US 41 from Peters Avenue to Harrison Road:** Utility project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on US 41 southbound from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. on the right turn lane on Davis Road from Airport Pulling Road. Motorists should expect minor delays and slow-moving traffic. Verizon Wireless utility pole will be installed. Please use caution when traveling in the area.
- **US 41 from onto Airport Pulling Road:** Utility project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures on Airport Pulling Road eastbound from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. on the right turn lane on Davis Road from Airport Pulling Road. Tentative start date of Thursday, March 28, 2024. Motorists should expect minor delays and slow-moving traffic. Verizon Wireless utility pole will be installed.

Please use caution when traveling in the area.

SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) from US 41 to Commercial Drive: Maintenance Project:

Crews will be in the area working to dismantle and remove crane used to construct high-rise building.

SR 84 (Davis Boulevard) eastbound will have overnight/nighttime lane closures from US 41 to Commercial Drive from Friday, April 12 through Friday, April 19, 2024, between the hours of 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. Slow-moving traffic and possible delays are anticipated.

A detour is set in place to continue eastbound on US 41 from Davis Boulevard to Airport Road.

Motorists are encouraged to use caution while traveling in the area.

# **DESOTO COUNTY**

- SR 70 from Peace River to Southeast Baker Street: Construction project: Crews will reconstruct approximately 3.4 miles of SR 70 within the City of Arcadia, add new drainage facilities, add new and relocate sanitary and watermain utilities, install new traffic signals, reconstruct sidewalks, and add street lighting in various locations. During construction there will be lane closure on SR 70. Temporary pedestrian pathways will be installed for pedestrians during construction while sidewalks are under construction and detours will be in place during construction, while crews work on side roads; please follow signage and use caution in these areas.
  - Motorists should expect lane closures on westbound and eastbound SR 70 from Baker Street to the apex of eastbound and westbound SR 70.
  - Robert Ave at eastbound SR 70 is closed. A detour is in place at Luther Avenue. Please follow detour signs and allow extra travel time.
  - Motorists should expect nighttime lane closures on SR 70 westbound of the Peace River and east of US 17, while crews work on utilities.
  - New traffic pattern: Northbound US 17 traffic will merge into one lane at SR 70 westbound. All truck traffic travelling westbound on SR 70 wanting to go northbound on US 17 will be detoured to US 17 southbound, then to SR 70 eastbound and then to US 17 northbound.

Estimated completion is summer 2026.

SR 70 from Manatee County Line to CR 661: Construction project: Crews will resurface SR 70 from the Manatee County line to CR 661, widen turn lanes and road shoulders, regrade ditches and improve drainage, and perform full depth roadway reconstruction at various locations. During construction the speed limit has been reduced to 50 mph and there will be periodic lane closures on SR 70 from the Manatee County line to CR 661.

- Motorists should expect intermittent shoulder closures along SR 70 throughout the project.
- Motorists should expect lane closures on SR 70 from Manatee County line to County Road 661 throughout the project.

Please use caution in the area and watch for workers in the construction zone. Estimated completion is summer 2024.

# **GLADES COUNTY**

- US 27 from Fisheating Creek to the Highlands County line: Construction project: Crews will be milling and resurfacing US 27 form Fisheating Creek to the Highlands County line. Other improvements include widening, guardrail, and signing and pavement markings. The bridge over Fisheating Creek will be repaired/rehabilitated including pile jacketing and spall repairs. During construction daytime lane closures may occur on US 27.
  - Motorists should expect daytime and nighttime intermittent lane closures on US 27 throughout the project limits until project completion.

Please use caution in the construction zone and watch for workers in the work zone. Estimated completion is spring 2024.

SR 78 from US 27 to Okeechobee County Line: Maintenance project: Crews will be reworking and sodding shoulder on SR 78 from US 27 to Okeechobee County Line. No lane closures are expected but crews will be working near the travel lane. Please use caution in the area and watch for workers in the work zone.

### HARDEE COUNTY

- SR 64 from Main Street to Spruce Street: Construction project: Crews will resurface SR 64 from Main Street to Spruce Street, improve drainage and cross slope correction, construct sidewalks on both sides of SR 64 in various locations, and install guardrail, signing, and pavement markings. During construction motorists should expect the possibility of daytime and nighttime lane closures on SR 64 from Main Street to Spruce Street. Please use caution in the area and watch for workers in the work zone.
  - Eastbound and westbound SR 64 lane closures/flagging operations continue from Main Street to US 17 from April 15-19, 2024.

- Milling and paving operations which will entail longer closures and longer queues are expected.
- Anticipated completion is mid-2024.
- SR 64 in Hardee County: Maintenance project: Crews will be patching potholes on SR 64 east from US 17 towards Greenleaf Road in Hardee County on April 17 and April 18, 2024, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on SR 64 in both directions. Please follow flagger directions and use caution in the area.
- SR 66 in Hardee County: Maintenance project: Crews will be patching potholes on SR 66 from Charlie Creek to US 17 in Hardee County on April 15 and April 16, 2024, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on SR 66 in both directions. Please follow flagger directions and use caution in the area.
- **US 17 (SR 35 NB) from Bay Street to Palmetto Street:** Permit project: lane and sidewalk closures with law enforcement at night while contractor removes and installs poles on the east side of US 17. Please use caution in this area and watch for workers and equipment during overnight hours.

# **HENDRY COUNTY**

- US 27 Sidewalks in Clewiston at Various Locations and from Royal Palm Avenue and Ponce De Leon Avenue: Construction project: Crews will be adding sidewalks along the north and south side of US 27, the east side of San Luiz Avenue, the west side of Berner Road, and on US 27 extending north along Ponce De Leon Avenue and Royal Palm Avenue to Balboa Plaza. Additional work includes drainage improvements and resurfacing the intersection between US 27 and Berner Road, side streets, and turnouts. During sidewalk construction, pedestrian detours will be in place; please follow signage. During construction there may be lane closures on Berner Road, San Luiz Avenue, Royal Palm Avenue, and Ponce DeLeon Avenue. Please use caution and watch for crews working in the work zone.
  - Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures at the intersections of Royal Palm Avenue and Osceola Avenue, and San Luiz Avenue and Ventura Avenue.
- US 27 from Palm Beach County Line to East of San Diego Street: Construction project: Crews will be resurfacing US 27 from the Palm Beach County line to east of San Diego Street, widening and paving road shoulders along medians, making drainage improvements and cross slope corrections, replacing guardrail, reconstructing ADA ramps to ensure compliance, and install signing

and pavement markings. During construction there will be lane closures on US 27 from the Palm Beach County line to east of San Diego Street. Please use caution in the area and watch for workers in the work zones.

- Motorists should expect rolling lane closures on April 14 and 15, 2024, for rumble strip installation.
- Motorists should expect rolling lane closures from April 17-20, 2024, for thermoplastic striping application.

# HIGHLANDS COUNTY

- US 27 from Glades County Line to Polk County Line: Maintenance contract project: Crews will be mowing and picking up litter along US 27 northbound and southbound from the Glades County line to the Polk County line. Please watch for workers in the work zone and use caution in the area.
- US 27 from South of SR 70 to North of SR 70: Construction project: Intersection improvements. Crews will be reconstructing the intersection with concrete pavement, resurfacing SR 70 and US 27 near the intersection, shoulder work, drainage improvements, signalization, and lighting, and signing and pavement markings.
  - Motorists should expect daytime and nighttime intermittent lane closures on US 27 and SR 70 near the intersection.
  - The driveways for Circle K and the BP Station will be impacted while crews place concrete at the intersection. Motorists will need to access Circle K from SR 70 and BP from US 27. The Circle K driveway off US 27 will be utilized as an Exit Only and the BP driveway off SR 70 will be utilized as an Exit Only.
  - Motorists can expect partial closures of the BP driveways on SR 70 and US 27 for concrete pours.
  - Motorists can expect nighttime lane closures on US 27 eastbound and a nighttime traffic shift on US 27 northbound and southbound.

Estimated completion is winter 2024.

**US 27 Median Modification Safety Improvements:** Safety project: temporary lane delineators will be installed along US 27 in Highlands County to enhance safety at the following intersections: Lake Francis, Lake Josephine, Whisper Circle, Ponce De Leon and Lake Damon. Please be aware of these changes and exercise caution when navigating these intersections.

- US 98 from East of CR 621 to the Okeechobee County Line: Construction project: Crews will resurface US 98 from east of CR 621 to the Okeechobee County line, reconstruct US 98 in various areas, widen shoulders, replace guardrail, and install signing and pavement markings. During construction there may be daytime and nighttime lane closures and traffic will be reduced to one lane in various areas; temporary signals will be installed to guide motorists. Please use caution in the area and watch for workers in the work zones.
  - Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures between Kissimmee River Bridge and approx. 0.7 miles south of CR 621 to install temporary barrier wall, attenuator pads, and temporary striping.
  - Temporary traffic signals will be utilized starting at 500 feet north of the Kissimmee River Bridge to 500 feet south of the bridge reducing bridge traffic to one lane. This will allow bridge and guardrail work from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. through April 26, 2024. Traffic will stop at the designated stop bar and proceed as directed by the signal system.
  - Please Note: Temporary traffic signals will be utilized per FDOT index 102-606, bringing the roadway down to one lane for bridge and guardrail work. Please be aware that the lane width will only be 11.5 feet wide, and motorists should use caution.

Anticipated completion is summer 2024.

SR 17 Sebring Circle and Parts of North Ridgewood and South Ridgewood Drive:

Permit Project: Crews from HGTV will be working on various buildings around the Circle. There will be renovations requiring the use of the sidewalk and parking spaces off and on from now until May 2024. Please watch for workers in the work zone and use caution in the area.

# LEE COUNTY

- Pine Island Road Causeway and Bridge Permanent Repairs: Construction project: As part of the Emergency Restoration of the Pine Island Road Causeway and Bridge, crews will be working in the project boundaries along CR 78 Pine Island Road from west of Little Pine Island Bridge (Bridge No. 120111) to West of Shoreview Drive.
  - Motorists can expect traffic shifts and flagging operations as crews continue installing utilities throughout the causeway.
  - Please be alerted to construction equipment in the construction zone. To maintain safety, motorists should find alternate parking areas.

- Motorists can expect occasional delays due to flagging operations for delivery/removal of materials, transfer of equipment.
- Crews are maintaining two-lane traffic on causeway.
- Pedestrians and bicyclists are not permitted within the construction zone.
- Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and exiting the roadway.
- Noise from construction equipment in the area is to be expected.
- Please be patient and plan for additional travel time as it may be slower than usual in the area.

Sanibel Causeway Emergency Restoration: Crews have moved traffic to the permanent lanes on the Sanibel Causeway. The causeway islands surrounding the temporary roadway are an active work zone and are currently closed for public access, including from the water.

Motorists should expect one lane of eastbound travel to continue from the toll plaza to Shell Point Road on the south (beach) side of McGregor Boulevard. The shoulder (south/beach side) remains FULLY CLOSED TO ACCESS. This closure is necessary for crew to install underground devices (marine mattresses) to reinforce the shoreline. Work activities include earthwork and installation of underground erosion control devices (marine mattresses). This closure is expected to be in place through May 2024. The contractor may intermittently use this lane for materials delivery.

Motorists traveling westbound on McGregor Boulevard may experience short delays for FHP to stop vehicles to allow materials deliveries to access the staging area at Punta Rassa.

Crews continue earthwork and debris removal along the causeway islands. Please expect construction equipment periodically entering/leaving the travel lanes when necessary. The contractor is limiting this interruption during peak hours.

The westbound merge location is now west of the toll plaza. Motorists are urged to use caution and obey the 20 MPH speed limit. Construction vehicles and equipment continue to enter/exit the staging area near this location.

Many oversized vehicles are crossing the causeway to assist with recovery efforts on the island. Please be patient as travel may be slower than usual. Bicyclists are encouraged to utilize another mode of transportation to travel the causeway and pedestrians are not permitted on the Sanibel Causeway.

# MOTORISTS ARE REMINDED TO OBEY THE POSTED SPEED LIMIT OF 20 MPH.

I-75 at Colonial Boulevard (mile marker 136): Construction project: Crews begin construction on the I-75 at Colonial Boulevard Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) Project. Other improvements along Colonial Boulevard include a Continuous Flow Intersection (CFI) at the intersection of Six Mile Cypress Parkway/Ortiz Avenue and a Superstreet intersection at the Colonial Boulevard/Forum Boulevard intersection. I-75 will also be widened to provide an auxiliary lane in each direction from Colonial Boulevard to SR 82/Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. The off-ramps at Colonial Boulevard DDI and the northbound off-ramps at SR 82 will have emergency stopping sites.

Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on I-75 and the on and off ramps at SR 884/Colonial Boulevard during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of construction.

Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on SR 884/Colonial Boulevard during the nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the construction.

Drivers should exercise caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting the roadway throughout the duration of the project. The expected completion date is mid-2024.

# SR 867/McGregor Boulevard from Cypress Lake Drive to Edinburgh Drive:

Construction Project: FDOT crews will be providing roadway median improvements from Cypress Lake Drive to Edinburgh Drive to enhance safety for drivers when traveling on SR 867.

Motorists should expect intermittent nighttime/overnight lane closures throughout the duration of the project.

Please proceed with caution as crews work on the roadway.

**US 41 from South of Hickory Drive to Emerson Square Boulevard**: Construction project: Crews are resurfacing and widening the roadway along with

reconstructing medians at Hickory Drive, San Carlos Boulevard, Shadow Creek Boulevard, and Harborage Drive.

Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from Sunday, April 14 through Thursday, April 18, 2024.

The contractor plans to activate the new signal at San Carlos Boulevard and US 41 Wednesday, April 17, followed with the closing the median at Hickory Drive for reconstruction.

The median opening on US 41 at Emerson Square Boulevard is closed for construction.

The median opening on US 41 at San Carlos Boulevard is closed for construction.

The median opening on US 41 at Harborage Drive/Babcock Road is closed for construction.

The median opening on US 41 at Shadow Creek Boulevard is closed for construction.

Daytime activities will include signalization work at San Carlos Boulevard and miscellaneous shoulder closures for turn lane widening and driveway reconstruction throughout the project limits.

**SR 884 (Colonial Boulevard) and Fowler Street:** Construction project: Crews are constructing turn lanes, drainage upgrades, signalization upgrades and milling and resurfacing at the intersection of Colonial Boulevard and Fowler Street.

Motorists should anticipate right turn lane closures onto westbound SR 884 (Colonial Boulevard) when traveling southbound on Fowler Street.

Motorists should anticipate right turn lane closures onto eastbound SR 884 (Colonial Boulevard) when traveling northbound on Fowler Street.

Three lanes on SR 884 (Colonial Boulevard) headed eastbound will be reduced to two lanes when approaching Fowler Street.

Motorists should expect intermittent nighttime/overnight lane closures as crews work on signalization of the intersection.

The expected project completion is mid-2024.

**US 41 and Crystal Drive Intersection:** Construction project: Project consists of intersection improvements at US 41 and Crystal Drive.

- SR 865/San Carlos Boulevard at Pine Ridge Road: Hurricane Ian maintenance project: Motorists should expect intermittent Iane closures while crews perform repairs to the traffic controller cabinet. Police officers will be on site to direct traffic as needed. Please use caution and expect delays while traveling through this area.
- SR 80 (Palm Beach Boulevard)/Veronica South Shoemaker Boulevard to Alta Vista Avenue: Construction project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. during the week while crews perform soil boring operations to gather design criteria for upcoming improvements to the corridor. This week, crews will work on I-75 paving; drainage, utility, and sidewalk work on US 301; and, beam installation, and decking for the construction of the new bridges over the Manatee River.

- Motorists should expect double lane closures on I-75 northbound during nighttime/overnight hours from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the construction; double closures on I-75 southbound during the nighttime/overnight hours from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should expect lane closures on US 301 during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. through the duration of the construction.

- **US 301 and Moccasin Wallow Road Roundabout:** Permit project: Crews are constructing the Manatee County roundabout at the intersection of US 301 and Moccasin Wallow Road. Plan for additional travel time or consider an alternate route. Please use caution. Completion is expected by late spring 2024.
- **US 41 and Moccasin Wallow Road**: Permit project: Manatee County will be installing a watermain across all lanes of US 41 and Moccasin Wallow Road starting April 14 thru April 25 from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.
  - April 14 -18: southbound lanes will have alternating inside and outside lane closures.
  - April 21 25: northbound lanes will have alternating inside and outside lane closures.
- SR 70 from Lorraine Road to Bourneside Boulevard, Bradenton: Construction project: This project includes widening SR 70 from Lorraine Road to Bourneside Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane or six-lane divided roadway, depending on the location, construction of roundabouts on SR 70 at Uihlein Road, Del Webb Boulevard, and Bourneside Boulevard, intersection improvements at the existing signalized intersection of Greenbrook Boulevard and Lorraine Road, construction of four bridges over Braden River crossings, new drainage system, construction 10-foot shared use paths, street lighting, and landscaping, and installation of new fiber optic cable connecting the two signalized intersections to Manatee County's regional Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS).

This week, crews will be clearing existing vegetation between Lorraine Road and De Webb Boulevard on the south side of SR 70 and clearing the Pond A area on the north side of SR 70, west of Uihlein Road and excavating. Crews

will continue excavating the Pond area on the southeast corner of Bourneside Boulevard and SR 70. Material will be hauled to the south side of SR 70 between Bourneside Boulevard and Uihlein Road and placed as roadway fill.

Crews will begin mobilizing bridge equipment and materials at Uihlein Road. Construction of the eastern eastbound bridge over the Braden River will begin the week of April 15th. The work will involve driving bridge piles via hydraulic hammer. This work will occur during daytime hours and produce noise that may be audible to the surrounding area. Bridge work will continue into summer.

All work will be off the roadway with no planned lane closures.   - Crews will be working on curb removal in the corridor.
  - Expect noise and light from construction equipment.

• Motorists should consider additional travel time or an alternate route.

# **OKEECHOBEE COUNTY**

- **SR 70 at SE 10th Avenue:** Driveway permit project: Crews are re-constructing sidewalks and modifying utilities. Watch for workers close to and in the roadway.

This week the contractor will be paving. Expect double lane closures on I-4, both east and westbound at night/overnight, Sunday night, April 14 through Friday night, April 20. Expect delays and be prepared to merge. For more information on this project, visit <a href="www.swflroads.com/i4-557">www.swflroads.com/i4-557</a>. Estimated project completion is spring 2024.

- I-4 at CSX Railroad Bridge approximately 1200 feet west of Kathleen Road (Exit 31): Construction project: This project includes replacing the existing 250-foot bridge with two new 400-foot bridges to provide for CSX double tracking and will accommodate future expansion of I-4. This week the contractor will be working off the roadway with no planned lane closures.
- **US 98 (East Broadway Avenue) from Church Street to the Fort Meade Recreation Area:** Construction project: This project includes bridge construction and demolition, milling and resurfacing, pedestrian, and drainage improvements, signing and pavement markings, and lighting improvements. Crews will be taking delivery of materials, pouring bridge deck, delivering bridge beams, working on drainage, curb, sidewalk, and building the temporary trestle bridge. Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.
- US 98 (East Broadway Avenue) from Church Street to Pine Avenue: Maintenance permit project: The City of Fort Meade will replace a gravity sewer line and manhole at the intersection of East Broadway Avenue and Lanier Avenue. Watch for traffic shifts and changes in the traffic pattern starting Monday, April 15 and lasting for approximately four weeks. Motorists wanting to turn left onto Broadway Avenue from Lanier Avenue should follow posted detour signs using Pine Avenue. Two-way traffic is expected to be maintained on Broadway

- Avenue throughout the work. Use caution and be prepared to use an alternate route.
- US 98 from West Socrum Loop Road to CR 54: Construction project: The improvements under this project include widening US 98 to a 4-lane divided highway, creating roundabouts at the Big Cypress Boulevard and SR 471 intersections, relocating utilities, improving drainage, adding pedestrian crosswalks, and building shared use paths from W Socrum Loop Road / Hall Road to just north of Rock Ridge Road.
  - Expect intermittent flagging operations throughout the project limits between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday, April 15 through Friday, April 19. Be prepared to stop.
  - Speed limits have been reduced to 45 MPH.
- **US 98 from SR 60 to Crystal Lake Road:** Maintenance: Watch for daytime lane closures as crews fill potholes and sweep the northbound roadway. Use caution and be prepared to merge.
- US 98 from Mount Zion Road to east of Old Stokes Road and from Keller Road to west of Ridge Road: Construction project: Project improvements include removing the old asphalt and resurfacing, drainage and shoulder improvements, tree removal and guardrail repairs. This week the contractor will continue grading and placing sod on the shoulders along US 98 during the day. Watch for daytime lane closures with flaggers directing traffic. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

- US 27 at SR 60 Interchange: Construction project: Crews will replace the bridges carrying SR 60 over US 27 and reconstruct the interchange from a partial cloverleaf design to a Single Point Urban Interchange. Other improvements include widening the roadways from four lanes to six 11-foot lanes, bicycle lanes, curb and gutter, a closed drainage system, and six-foot sidewalks. Crews will construct an urban frontage road in the southwest quadrant along SR 60 for access to local businesses. The project also includes construction of a noise wall along SR 60 from South Miami Street to west of Sharp Street, resurfacing Central Avenue from west of US 27 to Miami Street, installing signals, lighting,

signage and pavement markings on US 27 and SR 60. Daytime and nighttime lane closures will occur on US 27 and SR 60 during construction.

- Motorists should expect eastbound and westbound lane closures on SR 60 throughout the project limits while crews mill and pave final friction.
- Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures on US 27 southbound and northbound while crews mill and pave friction course.

Please use caution in the area and watch for workers in the construction zone. Estimated completion is early 2025.

- US 27 from Polo Park Boulevard to Lake County Line: Maintenance permit project: Expect northbound single lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., Monday, April 15 as crews finish paving and striping the new turn lane. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.
- **US 27 at Four Corners:** Maintenance permit project: Watch for left turn lane closures at Four Corners through mid-April as crews extend the turn lanes. Use caution and be prepared to merge.
- US 27 from Minute Maid to Florida Development Road: Maintenance permits: Duke Energy will be setting new poles at night/overnight from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m., Monday through Thursday, and working during the day from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday. Expect periodic southbound lane closures and be prepared to merge. This work is expected to continue through early May.
- US 27 from SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) to Kokomo Road: Construction project: This project includes removing and replacing the asphalt, reworking shoulders, and widening and adding a new signal at Kokomo Road. This week, crews will continue paving. Next week, work is expected to begin at Kokomo Road.

- SR 570 (Polk Parkway) from I-4 to Old Dixie Highway: Construction project: Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is converting an 18-mile portion of Polk Parkway/SR 570 to electronic tolling between I-4 and Old Dixie Highway/CR 546 in Polk County. This project includes constructing three new toll gantries at the Western Mainline (milepost 8), Central Mainline (milepost 13), and SR 540 New Mainline (milepost 15.5), removing cash toll collections and replacing them with SunPass and TOLL-BY-PLATE and demolishing the existing Western and Central Mainline toll plazas. Work is anticipated to be completed in mid-2024. This is a Florida Turnpike Enterprise project. - SR 570 (Polk Parkway) from US 92 to I-4: Construction project: Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is widening a four-mile segment of Polk Parkway/SR 570 to four lanes, between Old Dixie Highway/CR 546 and south of Pace Road and resurfacing the existing 4-lane portions between US 92 and I-4 in Polk County. This project includes constructing a new interchange at Polk Parkway and Braddock Road, widening Braddock Road from west of Polk Parkway to Berkley Road and constructing new electronic tolling points on Polk Parkway and Braddock Road ramps. Work also consists of resurfacing the ramps at CR 546. improving signage, pavement markings, signalization lighting and drainage throughout the project and improving local roads including the realignment of the City of Auburndale Water Treatment Plant access road and the neighborhood access road south of Braddock Road, as well as minor resurfacing on Berkley Road at the Braddock Road intersection. - SR 570B (Central Polk Parkway): Turnpike project: Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is constructing Central Polk Parkway/State Road (SR) 570B, a new, four-lane (two lanes in each direction) tolled roadway. This new stretch of roadway will begin at Polk Parkway/SR 570 and Winter Lake Road/SR 540 and extend approximately 6.5 miles to US 17/SR 35. Expect lane closures and intermittent work on SR 540 (Winter Lake Road) and at the on and off ramps for SR 570 (Polk Parkway). Use caution and be prepared to merge. **SR 559 at Lake Van Road Intersection:** Utility project: Expect lane closures and workers in the intersection as utility crews install a new pole and perform overhead work. Use caution watch for cross traffic and be prepared to merge. Also watch for potential sidewalk closures with pedestrian detours.

# SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) from east of US 17 to west of 1st Street: Construction project: Improvements under this Contract consist of resurfacing US 17, SR 540 and 1st Street, adding turn lanes, lengthening existing turn lanes, replacing the temporary traffic separators with a permanent concrete traffic separator on SR 540, improving crosswalk striping and adding pedestrian countdown signals, upgrading signal equipment and replacing streetlights with LED lights. Northbound 1st Street South at the intersection with SR 540 has been reduced to one lane and will remain that way as this is a permanent alignment. This week, crews will be paving the final layer of asphalt, installing sidewalk, signalization, and lighting items along US17, SR 540, and 1st Street South.

- Northbound 1<sup>st</sup> Street South at the intersection with SR 540 has been reduced to one lane and will remain that way as this is a permanent alignment. A new permanent traffic separator is being built in the location of the old northbound inside lane.
- Southbound 1st Street South will be reduced to one lane from 9 p.m. to 7:30 a.m., Sunday, April 14, through Thursday, April 18, 2024.
- SR 540 westbound approaching US 17 will be reduced to two lanes from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday, April 14, through Thursday, April 18, 2024.
- SR 540 eastbound from US 17 to 1<sup>st</sup> Street will be reduced to one lane from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday, April 14, through Thursday, April 18, 2024.
- US 17 northbound will be reduced to one lane at the intersection with SR 540 from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday, April 14, through Thursday, April 18, 2024.
- US 17 southbound will be reduced to one lane at the intersection with SR 540 from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday, April 14, through Thursday, April 18, 2024.
- Use caution, be prepared to merge and expect delays.
- SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) from Roosevelt Drive Southeast to Cypress Gardens Road: Utility project: Expect single lane closures as utility crews install utility poles and perform miscellaneous overhead work. Use

- caution and be prepared to merge or stop. Also watch for potential sidewalk closures with pedestrian.
- SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) from Cypress Gardens Road to East Lake Fox Road: Utility project: Expect single lane closures as utility crews install utility poles and perform miscellaneous overhead work. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop. Also watch for potential sidewalk closures with pedestrian detours.
- SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) from Old Helena Road to Waterview Way:

  Maintenance permit project: Expect eastbound and westbound lane shifts and changes to the traffic pattern as crews construct a new intersection starting,

  Monday, April 22. Work is expected to take about six weeks to complete. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.
- SR 540 (Cypress Gardens Boulevard) from Waterview Way to Lake Ruby Drive: Maintenance permit project: Watch for westbound daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. as crews install new turn lanes. Use caution and be prepared to merge.
- SR 540 (Winter Lake Road) from Polk Parkway on-ramp to Thornhill Road: Utility project: Expect single lane closures as utility crews install utility poles and perform miscellaneous overhead work. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop. Also watch for potential sidewalk closures with pedestrian detours.
- SR 540 (Winter Lake Road) from US 98 (Bartow Road) to SR 570 (Polk Parkway):

  Construction project: This project includes milling and resurfacing the roadway and side street entrances, upgrading lighting and signal equipment, upgrading pedestrian crossings and signals at Reynolds Road, replacing guardrail throughout the project. This week crews will be placing temporary asphalt at night/overnight and working on shoulder widening at the turn lanes during the day. Expect lane closures with flaggers directing traffic and be prepared to stop or merge.
- SR 540 (Winter Lake Road) at the intersection with DeCastro Road: Utility project: Expect single lane closures as utility crews perform overhead work. Use caution, watch for workers close to the road and be prepared to merge or stop.
- SR 471 from SR35 (US 98) to Sumter County Line: Construction project: Improvements under this contract consists of milling and resurfacing, guardrail replacement, turn lane widening, overbuild and signing and pavement markings along SR 471 from SR 35 to Sumter County line. Crews are scheduled to continue constructing the right turn lane widening to add a keyhole bike lane at Colt Creek Park. Watch for daytime lane closures with flaggers directing traffic, use caution and be prepared to merge.

- SR 60 from Hillsborough County line to CR 555: Maintenance contracts project: Watch for westbound and eastbound lane closures from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., through Tuesday, April 30, as the contractor performs shoulder rework in the medians. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.
- SR 37 (Florida Avenue) from West Lemon Street to East Beacon Road: Maintenance: Crews will be conducting storm drain maintenance and desilting through April 2024. Expect nighttime/overnight temporary road closures with traffic shifts along the corridor from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. and be prepared to merge or stop.
- SR 33 (North Commonwealth Avenue) at Flanders Station Drive Intersection:

  Utility project: Expect lane closures and workers in the intersection as utility crews install new poles and perform overhead work. Use caution, watch for cross traffic and be prepared to merge. Also watch for potential sidewalk closures with pedestrian detours.
- **SR 17 at Hughes Road:** Maintenance contracts project: Expect northbound daytime lane closures at Hughes Road from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. through the first week of April, as crews install drainage structures. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.
- SR 17 (Scenic Highway) from East Cook Street to BF Cook Road: Maintenance permits: Watch for lane closures with flaggers directing traffic from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. while crews construct a new turn lane. Use caution and be prepared to stop.

# SARASOTA COUNTY

- I-75 at SR 72/Clark Road (Exit 205): Construction project: Project improvements include reconstructing the existing interchange to a Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI), adding auxiliary lane on I-75 northbound from SR 72 to Bee Ridge Road, widen I-75 southbound from Proctor Road to SR 72, and improvements on Clark Road. This week, crews will work on the ramps, drainage, retaining walls, and paving.
  - Motorists should expect single lane closures on I-75 during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. bound through the duration of the construction.
  - Motorists should expect double lane closures on I-75 during nighttime/overnight hours from 10 p.m. to 4:30 a.m. through the duration of the construction.

- Motorists should expect lane closures on SR 72 during nighttime/overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. through the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should expect lane shifts on I-75 and SR 72 through the duration of the construction.
- Drivers should exercise caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting the interstate through the duration of the construction.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion is mid-2024.

- I-75 and Toledo Blade: Landscaping project: Through the end of June, FDOT will be installing landscaping and associated irrigation within the interchange.
   Motorists can expect occasional shoulder closures on Toledo Blade and I-75 ramps. Please use caution in the area.
- **US 41 and Boulevard of the Arts:** Maintenance: City of Sarasota has scheduled intermittent lane closures on Monday, April 15, from 1 a.m. to 6 a.m. to install thermo striping at the crosswalks.
- US 41 from North of Port Commons from north of Port Commons to State College of Florida: Construction project: Project improvements include milling and resurfacing, guardrail, drainage improvements, signing and pavement markings, and signalization improvements. Expected completion is fall 2024.

# **Daytime Activities:**

- Install barrier walls for upcoming lane shifts and close median openings for roadway crossover reconstruction.
- Median openings at Myakka Drive, Riverwalk Drive, Boardwalk, Ortega Place, De Miranda Avenue, Eager Street and Hoffman Street will be closed for reconstruction work.
- Hoffman Street crossover will be removed and remain permanently closed.
- Motorists will be able to turn right only onto US 41 at these locations.
- Daytime lane closures Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

# **Nighttime Activities:**

 Curb removal and turn lane reconstruction between Tuscola Boulevard and Ortiz Boulevard.

- Nighttime lane closures Sunday through Friday from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.
- Motorists should use caution when making U-turns and be aware of workers in the area.
- **US 41 from Caribbean Drive to Stickney Point:** Construction: Construction on the next phase along a 1.4-mile area of US 41 from Caribbean Drive to Stickney Point Road is actively underway. Work consists of implementing safety improvements along the corridor including resurfacing, lighting and signalization, median improvements, shoulder reconstruction, improved sidewalks, improved bicycle lanes, as well as needed infrastructure improvements to drainage, curb and gutter.
  - At the left turn from US 41 North turning onto SR 72 at Stickney Point towards Siesta Key, the lane width will be reduced. Please use caution as drivers acclimate.
  - Lane Closures: For the next three weeks single lane closures will be needed. Motorists should expect slower moving traffic and consider alternate routes.
  - Crews continue to work on drainage in the project corridor.
  - From Caribbean Drive to Gulf Gate Road: Temporary lane closures maybe necessary to maintain crew safety.
- **US 41 at Wellen Park Villages D&E Roundabouts:** Permit project: Construction of two roundabouts is underway on US 41. Lane closures are required. Consider alternate routes or add additional travel time during peak hours.
  - Upcoming traffic shift is expected. Use caution in the area.
- SR 72 Clark Road and the Legacy Trail: Construction Project: Crews have begun constructing two new pedestrian bridges and intersection improvements along the Legacy Trail in Sarasota County. Expect noise from construction equipment, large trucks, and back-up alarms. Occasional nighttime shoulder and/or lane closures during construction to install beams will also be needed. Expected completion is winter 2024/2025. Occasional flagging operations will be needed. Use caution in the area as large vehicles enter/ exit the roadway.
  - Occasional daytime flagging operations will be needed. Use caution in the area as large construction vehicles enter/ exit the roadway.
  - Nighttime shoulder and/or lane closures to install beams will also be needed.

- Expected completion is winter 2024/2025.
- **SR 758 Bee Ridge Road at the Legacy Trail:** Construction Project: Crews have begun constructing two new pedestrian bridges and intersection improvements along the Legacy Trail in Sarasota County. Expect noise from construction equipment, large trucks, and back-up alarms.
  - Occasional daytime flagging operations will be needed. Use caution in the area as large construction vehicles enter/ exit the roadway.
  - Nighttime shoulder and/or lane closures to install beams will also be needed.
  - Expected completion is winter 2024/2025.
- SR 776 at the Northeast Corner of Manasota Beach Road: Permit project: Through the end of May, Sarasota County will be constructing intersection improvements, including a right turn lane and signalization. From 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. motorists can expect an intermittent outside northbound lane closure on SR 776. Please use caution in the area.
- SR 777 River Road from I-75 to US 41: Construction project: Motorists can expect final pond grading near Venice Avenue and just north of Rambler's Rest RV Park on the northbound roadway. Embankment activities continue on the southbound roadway from US 41 to Stoney Creek Boulevard. Drainage structures, pipe, curb and gutter, and gravity wall installations will also continue throughout the project. Signal, ITS, and lighting work is also on-going throughout the project. Trucks will be crossing the road at various locations using intermittent flagging operations.
- SR 789 between Longboat Key Club Drive to Harbourside Drive: Permit project: Town of Longboat Key is relocating existing underground utilities and installing sewer line while a new development will be constructing right and left turn lanes and constructing driveways, sidewalk, and drainage. Motorists can expect alternating intermittent northbound / southbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Please use caution in the area.
- **SR 681 from I-75 to US 41:** Construction project: The resurfacing project will improve drainage, provide a cross-slope correction for leveling and comfort, new guardrail, updated signing and marking, install intelligent transportation equipment and signalization. Crews will have temporary lane closures on SR 681 from Honore Avenue to US 41 for the duration of the project.
