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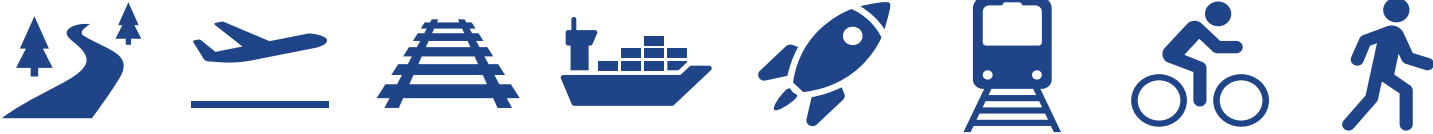

About FDOT District One

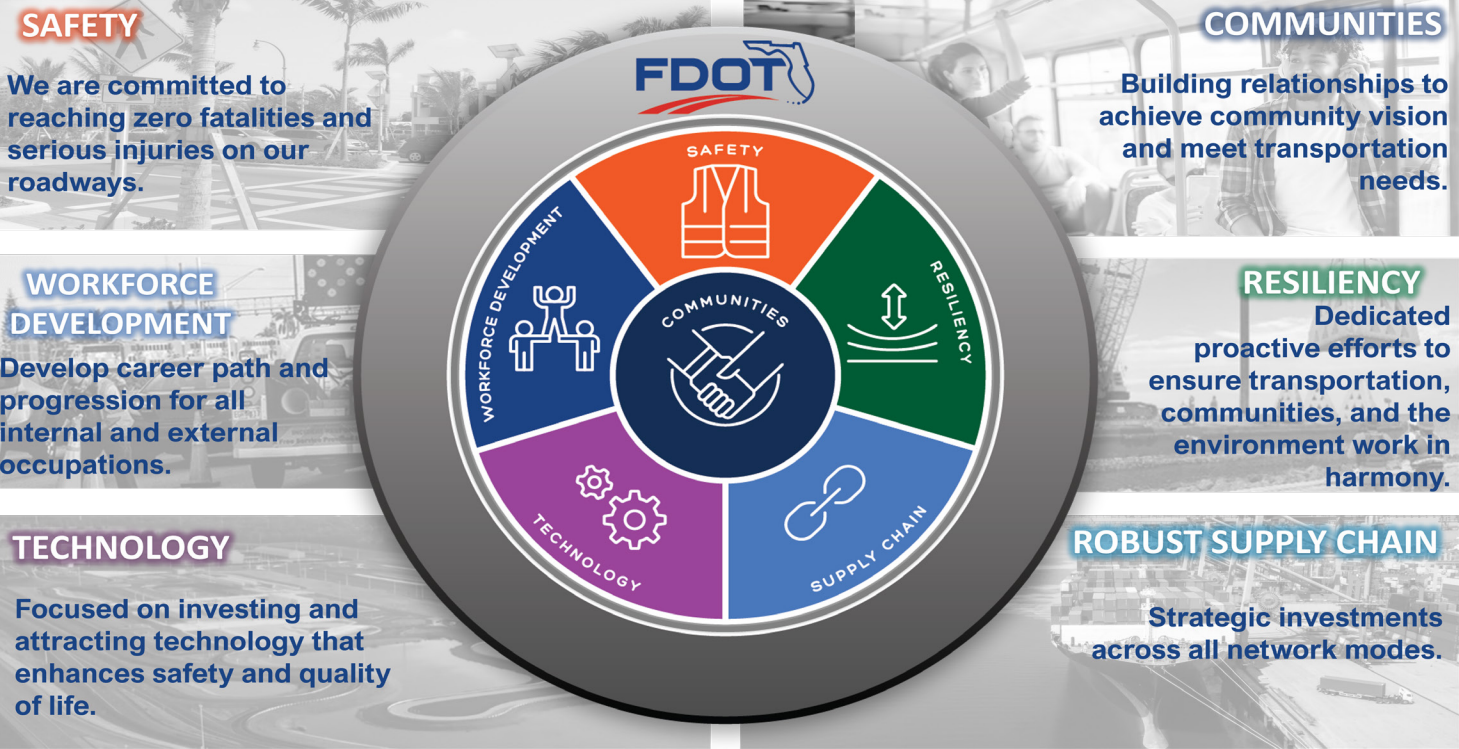

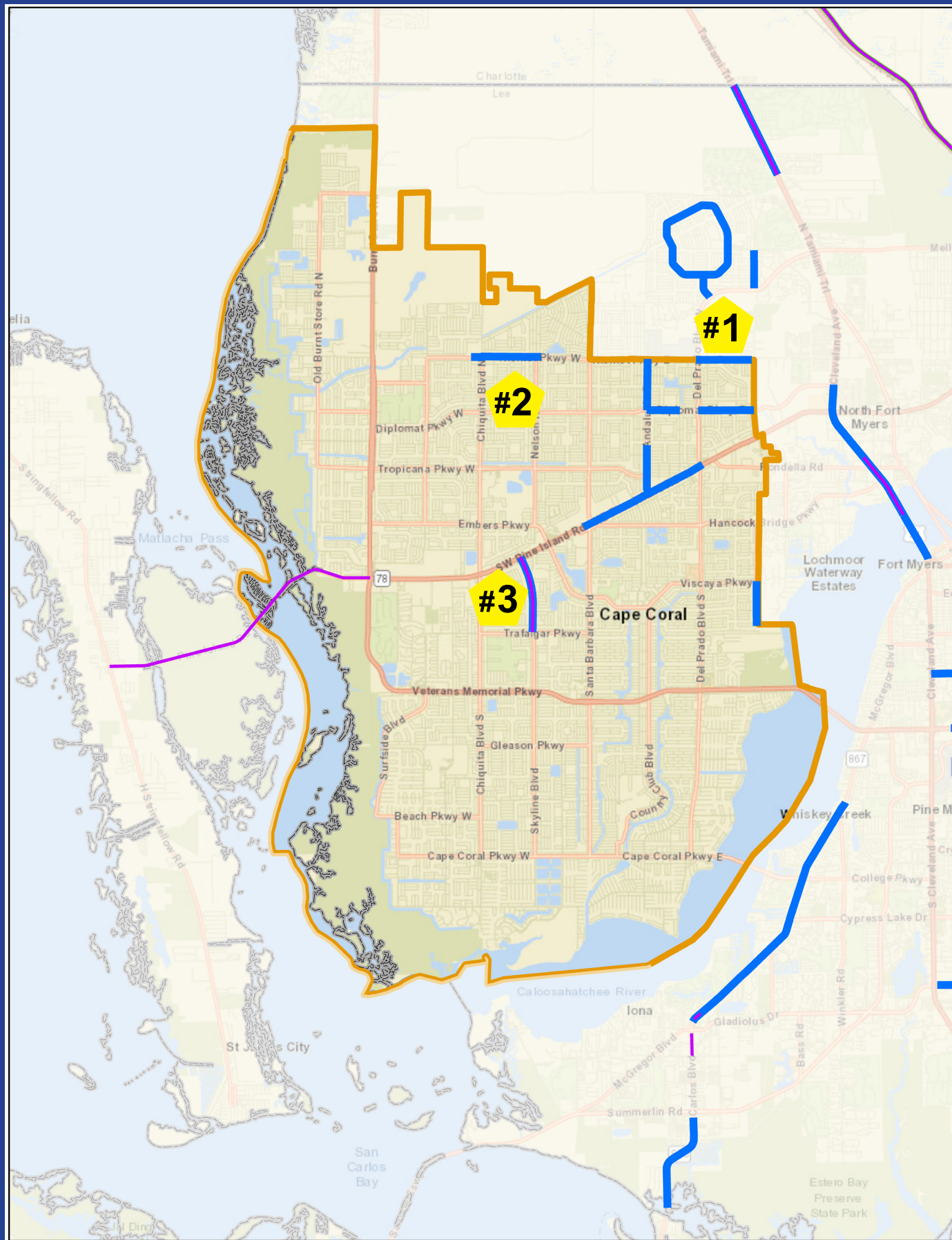
District One Fast Facts
