

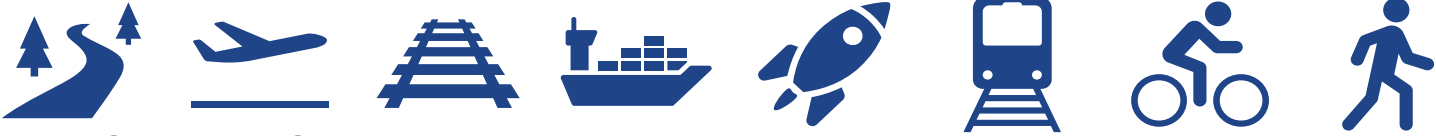

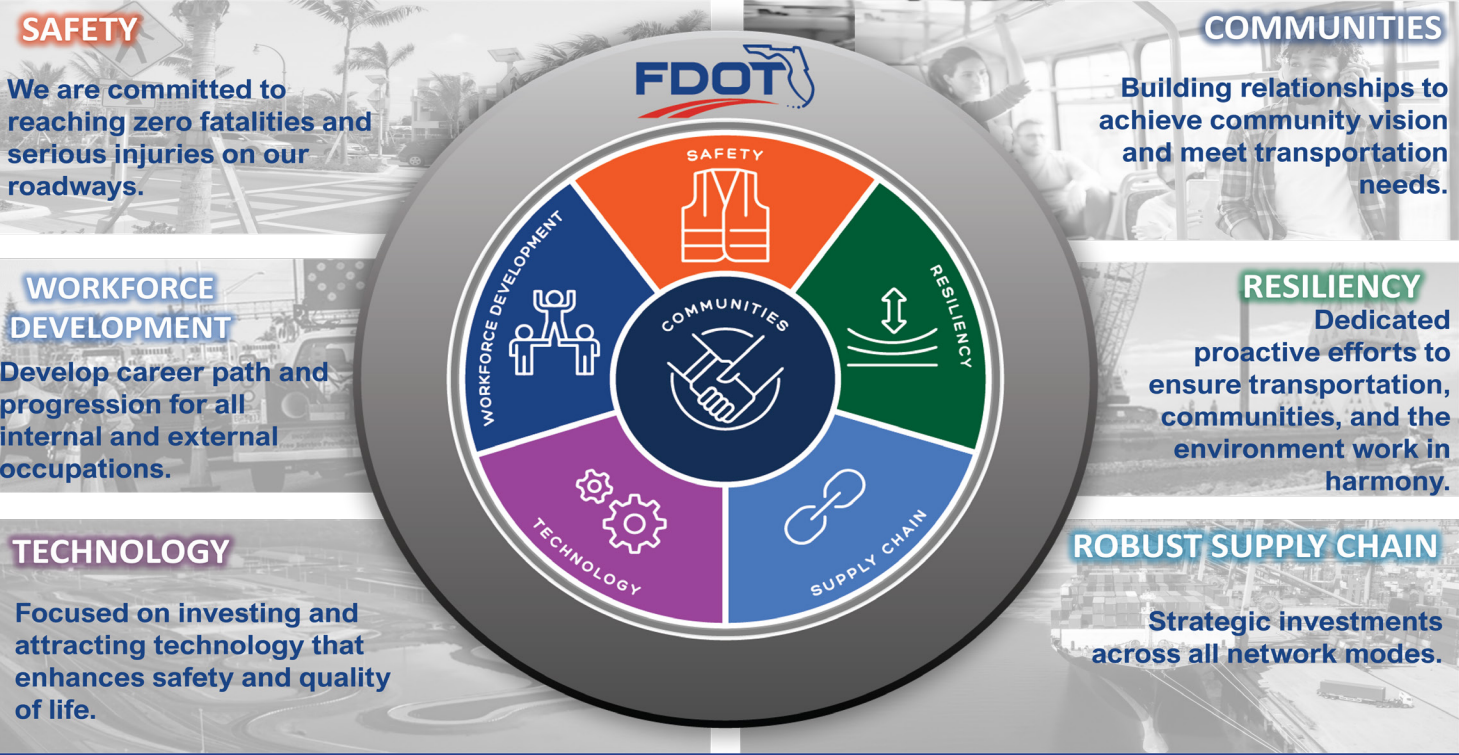

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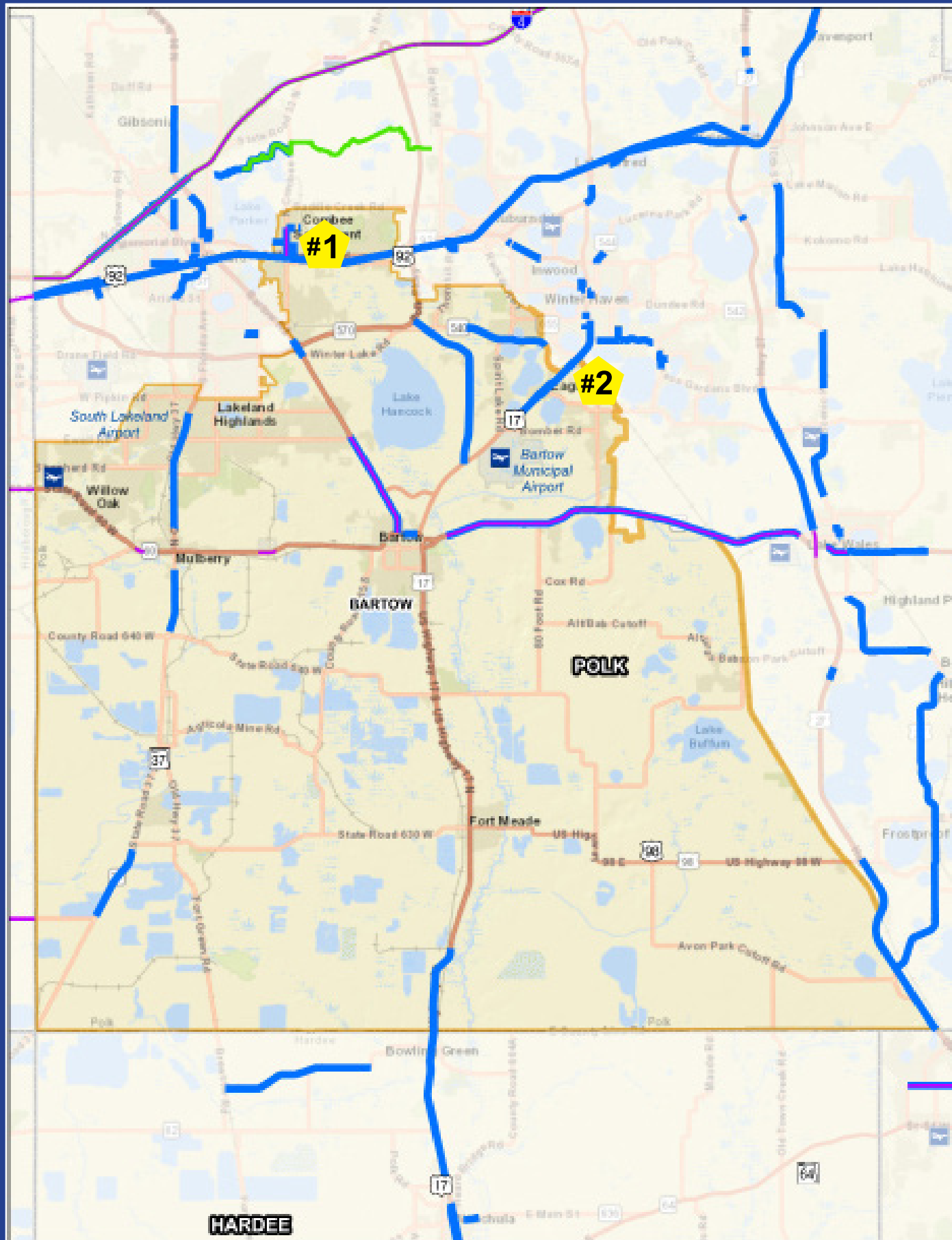
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DISTRICT ONE PROJECTS OF INTEREST

PD&E STUDIES, DESIGN, and CONSTRUCTION

- Benefit and transform our communities by providing essential safety improvements for motorists, pedestrians, and cyclists to achieve Vision Zero
- Add capacity and traffic flow strategies to mitigate congestion for our travelers
- Design innovative intersections and roadways to modernize our roads; and, enhancing safety, mobility, and connectivity with new trails, bike lanes, and sidewalks.

#1: MAINE AVE SIDEWALK FROM COMBEE RD TO PARK ST & IOWA RD TO WANDA WAY

- FPID: 446294-1
- Construction - This safety project consists of constructing a concrete sidewalk along the South side of Maine Avenue (Eaton Park) from Combee Road to Park Street & from Iowa Road to Wanda Way.
- FY 2025
- Total Cost: \$ 1,173,996

RESURFACING PROJECTS

- Preserve, maintain, and enhance our system by extending the roadways' lifetime
- Provide a smooth ride to reduce wear and tear on our vehicles
- Install safety measures which may include wider bike lanes, pedestrian crossing devices, and modified medians to protect our fellow roadway users
- Upgrade traffic signals with modern, smart equipment.

#2: SR 35 (US 17) FROM 9TH ST NW TO N OF OAK HAMMOCK LOOP

- Construction - Milling and Resurfacing SR 35.
