Welcome to the Old 41 PD&E Study!


The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District One, is conducting a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study for proposed improvements to Old 41 (County Road 887) from US 41 in Collier County to Bonita Beach Road in Lee County, for a distance of approximately 2.73 miles. If you are receiving this newsletter, it is because FDOT has identified you as someone with property or interests within or near the study area.

The purpose of this PD&E study is to evaluate and document potential engineering and environmental effects of any proposed improvements needed to relieve existing

congestion and accommodate future travel demand from projected population and employment growth in the area. Improvements may include the potential widening of the roadway up to four lanes, as well as safety considerations for bicyclists and pedestrians, such as marked bicycle lanes, sidewalks, and/or a shared-use path. FDOT is conducting this PD&E study in accordance with the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and other applicable federal and state laws and regulations.

You are encouraged to participate in the Old 41 PD&E study and we invite your questions and comments! During the study, we will host an alternatives public information meeting and a formal public hearing to provide project information and receive your comments. We are also available to meet with your community or neighborhood association. If you have questions, or would like to schedule a meeting, please contact FDOT project manager Steven A. Andrews. His contact information is shown in the upper left.

The project website (also in the upper left) will include all study-related documents and announcements. You can submit comments or questions *at any time* during the study through the 'Email Updates' page on the project website.
