1.0 INTRODUCTION




Figure 1: Project Location Map




Figure 2: Project Study Area

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) conducted a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for US 41 at Bonita Beach Road (County Road (CR) 865) in Lee County, Florida. The project location map, shown in **Figure 1**, illustrates the location and **Figure 2**, illustrates limits of the study.

The purpose of the PD&E Study is to provide documented environmental and engineering analyses to assist FDOT's Office of Environmental Management (OEM), the lead federal agency, in reaching a decision on the type, location and conceptual design of the necessary improvements, in order to accommodate future traffic demand in a safe and efficient manner. The PD&E Study also satisfies the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and other related state and federal environmental laws and regulations and qualifies the project for federal-aid funding of future development phases of the project.

The purpose of this report is to document the public and agency participation accomplished throughout the study process. In compliance with State and Federal rules, a Public Involvement Plan was developed and implemented as an integral part of this project. FDOT recognizes that the success of any transportation improvement is dependent upon a comprehensive public outreach effort. The program focused on soliciting community participation regarding local issues and concerns throughout the project development process. The balance of this report describes the following components of the program: Advance Notification, public communications (emails, newsletters, website, media coverage, etc.), agency presentations and meetings, public meetings, and the public hearing. The final project schedule showing these milestones is shown in **Figure 1.**

1.1 Project Description

1.1.1 Project Area

The US 41 at Bonita Beach Road PD&E Study evaluated capacity, safety, and multi-modal improvements at the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection, in the City of Bonita Springs, Florida. The study area limits extend along US 41 from Foley Road to just south of the Imperial River bridge, a distance of approximately 0.9 miles. Additionally, the study area extends along Bonita Beach Road from Windsor Road to Spanish Wells Boulevard, a distance of approximately 0.8 miles.

US 41 is a north-south principal arterial roadway running parallel to Interstate 75 (I-75) and facilitates the movement of regional and local traffic (including truck traffic) along Florida's west coast. Bonita Beach Road is an east-west minor arterial roadway providing a connection to I-75 and is one of two east-west connections between the Lee County mainland and coastal communities and barrier island tourist destinations and beaches to the west. US 41 is a state roadway maintained by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District 1, while Bonita Beach Road is maintained by Lee County. Both US 41 and Bonita Beach Road are designated as emergency evacuation routes.

US 41 within the project limits is a six-lane divided roadway with 5' on-street bicycle lanes and 5' sidewalks on both sides of the roadway. Bonita Beach Road is a four-lane divided roadway with 5' sidewalks on both sides but no on-street bicycle facilities.

The US 41 at Bonita Beach Road intersection is currently a signalized intersection with two exclusive left turn lanes and exclusive right turn lane in each approach. Aside from the main intersection, there is currently one other signalized intersection along US 41 at the Center of Bonita Springs (Tuffy Auto/Advanced Auto Parts).

There are three additional signalized intersections along Bonita Beach Road at the Center of Bonita Springs, Arroyal Road, and Spanish Wells Boulevard.

The existing US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection has two high-volume left turn movements, those being eastbound to northbound and southbound to eastbound. To partially address these heavy movements, the City of Bonita Springs conducted the "Network Enhancement Alignment Study – Quadrant Plan" in May 2017. From this, the City will be designing and building a two-lane quadrant roadway connecting Bonita Beach Road at Windsor Road to US 41 at the Center of Bonita Springs. This Northwest Quadrant Roadway is currently in design by the City and anticipated to be constructed ahead of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection improvements.

The proposed improvements will modify the signalized configuration of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection to be a partial displaced left turn (PDLT), with the northbound and southbound left turn movements to crossover and be located outside of the opposing traffic flow. This configuration will allow the northbound and southbound left turning movements to operate in the same signal phase or simultaneously as the northbound and southbound through movements. To accommodate the partial displaced left turn configuration and facilitate the relocation of northbound and outbound turning vehicles, two new signalized "crossover" intersections will be added along US 41 approximately 675' south and 460' north of Bonita Beach Road.l The southbound and eastbound left turn movements are proposed to have three lanes each, and the eastbound and westbound right turn movements are proposed to have two lanes each.

As noted above, the Northwest Quadrant Roadway is being designed/constructed by the City of Bonita Springs. As part of the PD&E study's proposed improvements, the US 41 and the Center of Bonita Springs intersection is proposed to be changed from a standard signalized intersection to a "thru-cut" intersection. A thru-cut intersection restricts through movements from the minor street typically due to operations and/or geometric conditions. In this case, the west lef is being widened from two lanes to five lanes (four eastbound approach lanes and one westbound receiving lane) and the east leg is being widened from two lanes to four lanes (two westbound approach lanes and two eastbound receiving lanes). This creates skew issues for any east/west through movements and creates operational constraints that are alleviated by the thru-cut intersection configuration. Tying into the new east leg is a Northeast Quadrant Roadway proposed between US 41 and Arroyal Road, northeast of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection. This will be a new three-lane roadway with two lanes eastbound and one lane westbound.

Along US 41 in the northbound direction, a 6' sidewalk is proposed from Foley Road to Springs Plaza and a 12' shared-use path is proposed from Springs Plaza to just north of the Imperial River Boat Ramp to Bonita Funeral Home and a 6' sidewalk is proposed from Bonita Funeral Home to Foley Road. Along both sides of Bonita Beach Road, the sidewalks will be widended to 12' shared-use paths from

the Center of Bonita Springs to Arroyal Road. Signalized marked crosswalks will be maintained on every leg of the PDLT, including the channelized right turn lanes. Signalized marked crosswalks will also be provided on every leg of each signalized intersection along the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road within the study area.

1.1.2 Purpose & Need

The purpose of this project is to address the deficient operational capacity of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection to relieve existing congestion and accommodate projected future traffic demand. The project's secondary goals are to 1) Enhance regional and local mobility; 2) Enhance safety conditions; and 3) Improve multi-modal access. The need for these improvements is described in this section.

1.1.2.1 Transportation Demand/Capacity

The US 41 at Bonita Beach Road intersection experiences chronic congestion. As population and employment growth are expected to continue within this area of Lee County, the intersection's congestion is anticipated to increase. Based on 2019 traffic counts taken, the existing Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) ranges from 39,000 to 53,000 along US 41 and was 30,000 along Bonita Beach Road. New traffic counts were taken at the study intersections in 2022 to inform the opening and design year turning movement counts. Based on future growth projects to a 2050 design year, the AADT's are forecast to range from 60,000 to 78,000 along US 41. The future 2050 AADT forecast along Bonita Beach Road is 39,000.

The US 41 at Bonita Beach Road intersection's existing (2019) mid-day traffic analysis shows that six of the 12 movements operate at Level of Service (LOS) of F, with one of those being overcapacity (volume-to-capacity > 1.0). The intersections existing (2019) PM traffic analysis shows that seven of the 12 movements operate at Level of Service (LOS) of F, with an overall average vehicle delay just shy of 90 seconds. While there are a similar number of LOS F movements between the existing and future no-build, latent demand is expected to increase by nearly 30 percent. The future no-build intersection is serving approximately the same amount of traffic volume as the existing condition but with the increased volumes, there are more vehicles in the overall network not being served.

1.1.2.2 Safety

Crash records were obtained for both US 41 and Bonita Beach Road within the study area, as described below:

• US 41 from Foley Road (MP 0.540) to the Imperial River bridge (MP 1.482);

- Bonita Beach Road from 400' west of Windsor Road to 450' east of Spanish Wells Boulevard; and
- Bonita Beach Road at Vanderbilt Drive.

Crash data was obtained for the most recent five-year period on record (2018-2022). The crash data was obtained from the University of Florida's Signal Four (S4) Analytics crash database for US 41 and Bonita Beach Road. The safety analysis was performed for the most recent five years of crash data (January 1, 2018 – December 31, 2022). Supplemental crash data from previous years (2014-2017) and January 1, 2023 to Jun 30, 2023 were also analyzed to verify crash trends and patterns.




Figure 4: Crashes by Year (Entire Study Area)

Figure 4 displays a summary of crash frequency by year along with the respective severities from 2014 to 2022. There was an increase in crashes between 2014 and 2017, but there has been a decrease in crashes between 2017 and 2019 before an approximate 30 percent drop in crashes due to the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. The number of crashes have stayed relatively constant in 2021 and 2022. There were 166 crashes per year on average between 2014 and 2017. However, there were 146 crashes per year on average in the study area between 2018 and 2022, not including 2020 (a 12 percent decrease). The fatal crash in 2019 involved a vehicle striking a pedestrian on US 41 just south of Bonita Beach Road, and the fatal crash in 2021 involved an angle crash at the intersection of US 41 at Foley Road/Shanna Lane.




Figure 5: Crashes per Year (US 41 and Bonita Beach Road Intersection)

Forty one percent of the total study area crashes were located within the intersection influence area of US 41 and Bonita Beach Road. **Figure 5** displays a summary of crash frequency by year along with the respective severities from 2018 to 2022. There was a total of 298 reported crashes during this period, 65 injury crashes (22 percent), and one fatal crash (in 2019). As displayed in **Figure 5**, there were an average of 60 crashes per year at the intersection.




Figure 6: Crashes by Type and Severity (US 41 and Bonita Beach Road Intersection: 2018 to 2022)

Figure 6 displays the crashes at the intersection by type and severity for the five-year study period. The highest crash type observed was rear end, comprising 59 percent of the total crashes. Sideswipe crashes (13 percent) and left turn (8 percent) wer the second and third highest crash types. These trends are consistent with the overall study area. The fatal crash in 2019 occurred when a vehicle struck a pedestrian crossing US 41.

A crash rate analysis was performed for the US 41 at Bonita Beach Road intersection. Note that as 2020-2022 average crash rates are not yet available, crash rate analyses were limited to 2018 and 2019 data. Based on the analysis, the study intersection experienced higher than average crash rates in both 2018 and 2019 when compared to both Statewide and Districtwide average crash rates.

US 41 and Bonita Beach Road are designated emergency evacuation routes for both the Florida Division of Emergency Management and Lee County. Providing parallel service to I-75, US 41 plays an important role in facilitating north-south traffic during incidences and emergency evacuation periods (particularly within southwest Florida). Bonita Beach Road also serves a critical role during emergency evacuation periods as it connects US 41 and I-75 (facilities of the state evacuation route network) and provides one of two connections for residents and tourists between the barrier islands/tourist destinations to the west and the mainland of Lee County.

1.1.2.3 – Modal Interrelationships

While sidewalks are present on both sides of US 41 and Bonita Beach Road, the only bicuycle facilities present in the study area are 5' marked bicycle lanes along both sides of US 41. Two LeeTran bus routes (Routes 150 and 600) operate along US 41 and Bonita Beach Road. In addition to the two bus routes, LeeTran has partnered with Uber to provide ULTRA On-Demand Transit service in the Bonita Springs area. With LeeTran's ULTRA On-Demand Transit service is a deluxe mini-bus available seven days a week from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. ULTRA On-Demand Transit allows riders to request a ride as needed, with curb to curb service.

Due to the presence of these facilities/services and the surrounding urban environment, heavy pedestrian and bicycle traffic exists in the area (as observed during field reviews conducted for the project).

The Office of Greenways and Trails (OGT) and the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) have identified trail opportunities in the vicinity of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road study intersection. The Coastal Loop Trail is a spur loop from the Southwest Coastal Regional Trail, which is part of the larger FDOT Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail Program. This is a planned loop trail that begins at the Southwest Coastal Regional Trail in Bonita Springs, travels along Bonita Beach Road to the barrier islands, then travels through Fort Myers Beach and southern Fort Myers before connecting back to the Southwest Coastal Regional Trail east of US 41 in Fort Myers. Through discussions with Lee County MPO, no future funding has been dedicated for Coastal Loop Trail improvements in the vicinity of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection as per the date of this report.

1.1.2.4 – **System Linkage**

US 41 serves as a critical arterial in facilitating the north-south movement of regional and local traffic (including truck traffic) as it runs parallel to I-75 along Florida's west coat. Similarly, Bonita Beach Road serves as a major east-west local roadway within Lee County, linking US 41 and I-75 and providing access (as one of two connections) between the mainland of

Lee County and coastal communities/tourist destinations to the west (i.e., barrier islands and beaches).

The City of Bonita Springs performed the Network Enhancement Alignment Study, also known as the "Quadrant Plan", in May 2017. The purpose of the Quadrant Plan is to develop an expanded roadway network between Bonita Beach Road with US 41 that improves the area's mobility, maintains a high-quality environment for the community, and minimizes impacts to the natural environment. The City is moving forward with design and construction for a northwest quadrant roadway.

1.1.2.5 – Planning consistency

The design phase was created under 444321-2, with \$2.8 M SU funds and \$700 K local funds. The project's design funding is shown as tentatively programmed for FY26. Once the design funding is adopted in the next work program cycle, then the TIP/STIP can be updated. The LRTP will not need updating at this time unless the project information changes.

1.1.3 Preferred Alternative

The project's purpose is to address the deficient operational capacity of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection to relieve existing congestion and accommodate projected future traffic demand. The project's secondary goals are to 1) Enhance regional and local mobility; 2) Enhance safety conditions; and 3) Improve multi-modal access.

Alternatives A (Enhanced Traffic Signal) and B (PDLT) were presented at the Alternatives Public Workshop conducted virtually on Monday, April 3 and in-person on Tuesday, April 4, 2023. Following the workshop, feedback was gathered from members of the public for both alternatives. The majority of public comments received expressed support for Alternative B, PDLT. Alternative B was favored as it does not add through lanes along US 41, was viewed as being more operationally efficient, and provided better pedestrian and bicyclist safety. These alternatives were also presented to the Lee County MPO on June 16, 2023, and the public support for the PDLT alternative was documented with the MPO Board.

Discussions were held with FDOT District 1 after the Alternatives Public Workshop and it was determined Alternative B – PDLT best aligns with the project's purpose and need and was selected as the preferred alternative. The following bullets summarize how the PDLT recommendation meets the primary and secondary purpose and need goals noted above:

- Transportation Demand/Capacity
 - In the 2050 future build condition, the average network delay for vehicles traveling through the PDLT would be approximately 50 percent less than the No-Build Alternative.

- The estimated number of vehicles served by the PDLT in 2050 would be approximately 20 percent higher than the No-Build Alternative.
- The PDLT is anticipated to improve average vehicle delay by over 45 seconds in both the 2050 mid-day and PM peak hours when compared to the No-Build Alternative at the main US 41 at Bonita Beach Road intersection only.

Safety

- Using the predictive safety analysis methods provided in the FDOT Safety Performance for Intersection Control Evaluation (SPICE) Tool, the PDLT intersection is predicted to decrease total and fatal/injury crashes by over 10 percent vs the No-Build Alternative over the 20-year life cycle from 2030 to 2050.
- o Increase the volume of residents and tourists from coastal communities that can be evacuated during an emergency event by improving operations at the intersection of two major evacuation routes.
- o Enhance access to facilities of the state evacuation route network.
- o Improve response times (due to enhanced access) to emergency events and incidences.

Modal Interrelationships

- O Sidewalks in the study area are proposed to be widened to 12' shared-use paths along both sides of US 41 and Bonita Beach Road.
- These shared-use paths will improve pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation by modifying/limiting opportunities for conflicts between automobiles and pedestrians/bicyclists.
- The 12' shared-use path improvements proposed as part of the PDLT would help further enhance the future vision of the Coastal Loop Trail in the study area.
- Additional median and concrete traffic separators are included in the PDLT concept to provide pedestrian refuge areas and better facilitate non-motorist crossings.
- The PDLT will also enhance the performance and reliability of transit service operating along US 41 and Bonita Beach Road by reducing delays at the intersection.

System Linkage

- o Improve the viability of US 41 as a regional alternative facility to I-75 by reducing travel delay.
- Enhance east-west access between two primary north-south transportation corridors (US 41 and I-75) as well as between the mainland of Lee County and coastal communities/tourist destinations to the west.
- Enhance freight mobility and access within the area as US 41 is designated as regional freight mobility corridor (Tier 1 Regional Freight Corridor) in the Lee County 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan.

The proposed PDLT improvements will support local system linkage planning efforts by providing a Northeast Quadrant Roadway connecting US 41 to Arroyal Road. It will also widen the US 41 and Northeast Quadrant Roadway intersection's west approach to meet the intersection's future traffic demands.

The following highlights the key improvement elements within the US 41 at Bonita Beach Road intersection area for Alternative B:

US 41

The proposed roadway/intersection improvements discussed in Section 1.4.1 and 1.4.3.2 were brought forward as part of the preferred alternative design. Outside of the main US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection and "crossover" location, additional intersection improvements are included as part of the preferred alternative:

- Signalization and turn lane improvements at the intersection of US 41 and Foley Road (Sta. 222+75).




Figure 7: US 41/Center of Bonita Springs "Thru-Cut" Intersection

- Modified "thru-cut" signalized intersection at US 41 and Center of Bonita Springs (Sta. 260+00) as shown in Figure 7:
- A thru-cut intersection restricts through movements from the minor street typically due to operational and/or geometric conditions. In this case, the west leg is being widened from two lanes to five lanes (four eastbound approach lanes and one westbound receiving lane) and the east leg is being widened from two lanes to four lanes (two westbound approach lanes and two eastbound receiving lanes).
- Dual southbound left turn lanes are also proposed in the new thru-cut configuration.

Bonita Beach Road

The following roadway improvements are proposed along Bonita Beach Road as part of the preferred alternative:

- Three 11' travel lanes in each direction from the Center of Bonita Springs (Sta. 266+50) to Arroyal Road (Sta. 286+25). The third eastbound through lane drops at the Spanish Wells Boulevard signal.
- Widening the sidewalk to be a 12' shared-use path on both sides from the Center of Bonita Springs (Sta. 266+50) to Arroyal Road (Sta. 286+25).

At intersections along Bonita Beach Road, the following features are included are part of the preferred alternative:

o Bonita Beach Road at Center of Bonita Springs (Sta. 226+50):

- o Develop a third 11' eastbound travel lane departing intersection.
- o Bonita Beach Road at Arroyal Road (Sta. 286+25):
 - One additional 11' eastbound through lane (will be a shared through/right configuration).
 - o Develop a third 11' westbound travel lane departing intersection.
 - The southbound approach will be modified to include two southbound left turn lanes and one southbound shared through/right turn lane.

Quadrant Roadway System




Figure 8: Northwest Quadrant Roadway - Proposed City Alignment

A new Northwest Quadrant Roadway from Bonita Beach Road at Windsor Road (Bonita Beach Road Sta. 260+00) to US 41 at the Center of Bonita Springs (US 41 Sta. 260+00) will be constructed by the City of Bonita Springs before the preferred alternative is planned to be constructed at the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection. The following features describe the Northwest Quadrant Roadway improvements as shown in **Figure 8**:

- Intersection of Bonita Beach Road and Windsor Road (Bonita Beach Road Sta. 260+00):
 - An eastbound displaced left turn to the Northwest Quadrant Roadway with a new crossover intersection just west of Windsor Road.
 - The southbound approach from Windsor Road will be widened to two lanes.
 - o An exclusive westbound right turn lane will be added.
- o Along Windsor Road:
 - o Two southbound lanes and one northbound lane
 - o 6' sidewalk on the west side and 12' shared-use path on the east side of the roadway.
- Along New Roadway between Windsor Road and the Northwest Corner of the Center of Bonita Springs Shopping Plaza:
 - One 11' travel lane in each direction.
 - o 4' paved shoulders in each direction.
 - o 6' sidewalk on the west side and 12' shared-use path on the east side of the roadway.




Figure 9: Northwest Quadrant Roadway - West Leg at US 41

The City's Northwest Quadrant Roadway design concept ties in at the existing US 41/Center of Bonita Springs intersection and is not making any improvements to this intersection. In the future condition, this intersection will not have enough capacity to accommodate the forecasted traffic drmand, necessitating additional turn lane improvements on the intersection's west leg. As part of the preferred alternative, the Northwest Quadrant Roadway is being modified from the northwest corner of the Center of Bonita Springs Shopping Plaza to US 41. These changes are described below and shown in **Figure 9**:

- o Northwest Corner of the Center of Bonita Springs Shopping Plaza to US 41:
 - o Roadway is widened to develop a center median with varying width.
 - One 11' travel lane in each direction.
 - o 6' sidewalk on the north side of the roadway.
 - o 12' shared-use path on the south side of the roadway.
 - New 11' westbound left turn lane into Center of Bonita Springs behind the Old Time Pottery building.
- West leg at US 41 intersection:

- o One 11' eastbound right turn lane.
- o Three 11' eastbound left turn lanes.
- One 11' westbound receiving lane.




Figure 10: Northeast Quadrant Roadway - East Leg at US 41

Tying into the US 41 intersection's east leg is the Northeast Quadrant Roadway proposed between US 41 and Arroyal Road, intersecting at Arroyal Road and Carolina Street. This will be a new three-lane roadway with two lanes eastbound and one lane westbound, as shown in **Figure 10**. The lane configuration at the US 41 intersection is discussed below:

- One 11' westbound left turn lane.
- One 11' westbound right turn lane.
- Two 11' eastbound receiving lanes.

2.0 PROJECT KICKOFF

2.1 **Efficient Transportation Decision Making (ETDM)**

Consistent with FDOT's Efficient Transportation Decision Making (ETDM) process, this project was evaluated through the ETDM programming screen as ETDM Project Number 6291. Through ETDM, early agency and public comments were obtained to provide project information on potentially environmentally sensitive areas and identification of project issues. The initial results were published in the Preliminary Programming Screen Summary Report on January 18, 2020, with comments provided by the Environmental Technical Advisory Team (ETAT). The ETAT evaluated the proposed project's effects on various natural, physical, and social resources. The Class of Action was determined to be a Type 2 CE. The ETDM Programming Screen Summary Report January 18, 2020, is available on the ETDM public web site (https://etdmpub.fla-etat.org/est/).

2.2 **Advanced Notification**

An Advance Notification (AN) package was completed for this project and mailed to the Florida State Clearinghouse and local and federal agencies on March 27, 2013, in accordance with Governor's Executive Order 95-359 - Florida State Clearing House and President's Executive Order 12372 – Intergovernmental Review of Federal Programs. When the project resumed in 2019, the AN package was updated and resubmitted on September 27, 2019. Any comments received are addressed in the final environmental document. The US 41 and Bonita Beach Road PD&E Study was initiated in March 2014. The study was shown in the Lee County MPO's Five Year Work Program as the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road Interchange Study. The City of Bonita Springs stated they did not want the study to consider interchange alternatives and then took City Council action to support this position. FDOT stated the project's name in the adopted Five-Year Work Program was the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road Interchange Study and the study needed to evaluate both at-grade intersection and interchange alternatives. The City of Bonita Springs then proposed to the Lee County MPO to remove the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road Interchange study from the project priority list and stop the study. This proposed action was approved by the MPO Board, and FDOT canceled the study in July 2015. The Advance Notification packages are included in **Appendix A**.

2.3 **Public Involvement Plan**

A Public Involvement Plan (PIP) prepared under separate cover (approved February 17, 2020) was created for this project outlining community outreach efforts. It presents the approach used to involve the public, public officials, the media, and government agencies throughout the project. A property owner mailing list was developed for mailing of newsletters and public meeting invitations. A public officials mailing list was also developed to keep representatives in the project area informed with newsletters, and meeting and hearing invitations. The plan is in compliance with FDOT's PD&E Manual, Part 1, Chapter 11. All outreach is in compliance with Section 339.155, Florida Statute

(F.S.), Section 335.199 F.S., Section 120.525 F.S., Section 286.011 F.S., Federal Highway Act of 1968, as amended, National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, as amended, Title 23, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 450 & 771, Title 40, Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 1500-1508, 23 United States Code, Section 109(h), Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and other Nondiscrimination Laws, Executive Order 12898, Environmental Justice, Executive Order 13166, Limited English Proficiency, Executive Order 07-01, Section 2, Plain Language Initiative, Section 286.29, FS, Climate-Friendly Public Business (Green Lodging), and other requirements as applicable.

2.4 **Project Kickoff Notifications**

Project kickoff emails were sent to elected officials by the FDOT, District One, District Planning and Environmental Administrator, and to Appointed Officials/Agencies by the FDOT, District One, Communications Specialist on April 23, 2020. These emails provided an overview of the project and public involvement program. They also included the first project newsletter.

The Project Kickoff newsletter, published in English, was mailed on April 30, 2020, informing the public of the start of the project and included a discussion of the study process and schedule. The newsletter also encouraged the need for public input and provided information on points of contact within the Department regarding citizen comments and concerns.

This newsletter was mailed to the property owner mailing list which was developed from information in the Lee County Property Appraiser's website. It was also distributed to interested parties who had contacted the Department and requested to be added to the project mailing list. The elected/appointed officials email notifications, email distribution list, project kickoff newsletter (newsletter #1) and the full mailing list updated in February 2024 are provided in **Appendix**.

3.0 **PUBLIC MEETING**

3.1 **Alternatives Public Information Meeting** Online- April 3, 2023 and In-Person - April 4, 2023

The Alternatives Public Information Meeting for this project was provided in a hybrid format consisting of both a virtual component hosted online via GoToWebinar at 6:00 PM on Monday, April 3, 2023, as well as an in-person component located at the Bonita Springs Recreation Center (26740 Pine Ave., Bonita Springs, FL 34135) from 5:00 PM to 7:00 PM on Tuesday, April 4, 2023. This process followed and was consistent with the most current FDOT guidelines for Hybrid Public Meetings. The online component consisted of a live introduction by the FDOT Project Manager followed by a narrated presentation and a live question and answer period with the project team. The in-person meeting consisted of an open house format to provide an opportunity for the public to review the proposed project,

speak one-on-one with project team members, and voice their comments or concerns. Project documents, including comment forms, were available for public review on the project website: https://www.swflroads.com/project/444321-1 beginning on March 27, 2023. Additionally, there is a link on the project website that allows citizens to submit comments without the use of the comment form. Phone and email were also available for providing input.

Notification of the meeting and official comment period (April 3, 2023, to April 14, 2023) included an email to appointed and elected officials and agency representatives; a newsletter mailing to property owners; a display advertisement in the News-Press, and Florida Administrative Register; advertisement on the project website and FDOT public notices webpage; and a press release. As attendees entered the in-person meeting, they were asked to sign in and were offered a project handout and comment form. Comment forms were available throughout the meeting to be filled out and submitted onsite or mailed/emailed to FDOT District 1. Members of the project team were available to respond to individual questions. The following exhibits were displayed during the meeting:

All workshop attendees were given the opportunity to provide verbal or written comments at the meeting or to provide hand-written or electronic comments within the comment period.


Summary of Public Concerns (In-Person and Virtual)

A total of 18 responses (emailed comments, in-person, virtual, and website) were received during the comment period between April 3 and April 14, 2023. Of these, 11 in-person submissions, 5 virtual submissions, 2 emailed comments, and 1 website comment were received. The following list provides a high-level overview of the concerns:

- 6 traffic concerns expressed concern for congestion surrounding the intersection, and traffic displacement to surrounding areas
- 5 signal location concerns requests to clarify locations of new/moving traffic signals, suggesting proposed signal locations,

- 3 plaza access concerns expressed concerns regarding the location of access to Springs Plaza and Center of Bonita Springs,
- 9 Partial DLT Alternative supporters expressed support for the Partial Displaced Left Turn
- 3 pedestrian and bicycle concerns expressed concern for time crossing the intersection and availability of pedestrian and bicycle accommodations
- 3 speed concerns expressed concerns regarding the current and proposed speed limits
- 10 specific concerns these comments were lengthy and requested specific items that cannot be grouped into any of the previous categories, such as noise, stormwater runoff, impact to nature, flyover alternative, public transportation, using AI for changing signals, Angler's Paradise access and specific property concerns.

The following graphic provides a visualization of the comment categories.



Conclusion

Based on analysis of the comments, it appears that the Partial Displaced Left Turn is the option most preferred by the public. The primary public concerns are traffic flow/displacement, and surrounding signal locations. Specifically, major items of concern include intersection turn lanes, signal locations added or relocated, and maintaining/providing access to plazas surrounding the intersection. There did not appear to be a large volume of citizens that were not in favor of the Partial Displaced Left Turn alternative.

The public workshop notifications, including emails, advertisements, screenshots of the website showing the public workshop materials, newsletter invite, and mailing list, are provided in **Appendix C**.

4.0 PUBLIC HEARING

4.1 Public Hearing – March 26, 2024

FDOT conducted a hybrid public hearing to provide interested persons with information on the preferred alternative selected by FDOT, and to allow the public the opportunity to comment. The hearing was held on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, at the Bonita Springs Recreation Center, and the formal hearing portion was live-streamed online through GoToWebinar. The in-person venue was chosen because of its proximity to the project limits, the availability of a larger space, the location of the previous public meeting, and its familiarity with the locals. Meeting materials were posted to the project webpage (https://www.swflroads.com/project/444321-1) on March 19, 2024.

The Public Hearing was advertised in the following manner:

As attendees entered the hearing, they were provided with a handout and the project team explained the comment process. At the in-person event, an open house was held from 5 – 6 p.m. Members of the study team were available to answer questions and discuss the project during this time. A separate table for noise, right-of-way, draft project documents, and transportation development process information was available to the public.

The following project-related information was on display:

At 6 p.m. the formal portion of the hearing began for both the in-person and online attendees. A project presentation was played, and the public had the opportunity to provide verbal comments. Two attendees provided verbal testimony at the in-person event, one attendee provided verbal comment through the online event, and one attendee provided a comment that was read aloud by the moderator through the online event.

In addition to the verbal comments, other comments were submitted either by email, website, or by mail. In-person hearing attendees were also able to leave written comments. Three comment forms were received at the in-person hearing and six were received during the 10-day comment period following the meeting, ending April 5, 2024.

The public hearing notifications, including emails, advertisements, newsletter invite, and mailing list, are provided in **Appendix E.** The sign-in sheets, all hearing materials, comment sheets from the meeting, as well as those received in the 10 days following, can be found in **Appendix F**. A transcript package was also prepared under separate cover.

5.0 AGENCY AND STAKEHOLDER COORDINATION

5.1 Project Advisory Group Meetings

At the beginning of the study, numerous stakeholders were identified that would have an interest in the SR 45 (US 41) at Bonita Beach Road (CR 865) PD&E study. FDOT created a Business Working Group (BWG) of businesses in the immediate US 41 and Bonita Beach Road area. The BWG's purpose was to meet virtually to obtain input about the transportation needs of the area, answer questions, and keep business owners informed regarding the study.

Letters were sent to eight business owners in May 2021. These were followed up with emails to each business owner on June 21, 2021, and one response was received. On June 29, 2021, a second email was sent to the business who had not responded. These emails included a Doodle poll to select a potential date for a virtual meeting. There were two responses showing interest in a virtual meeting. A different approach was taken. On July 21, 2021, FDOT District 1 and consultant team representatives traveled to Bonita Springs and conducted impromptu meetings with six of the eight businesses with a series of prepared questions we asked the person in-charge of the business at that time. The businesses were generally very cooperative, provided answers to our questions, and supported improving the intersection. Following these meetings, no further BWG activities have occurred.

Stakeholder Meeting notifications, materials, meeting summary, comments received, as well as the stakeholder mailing list which includes relevant government agencies, public interest groups, and others with an interest or knowledge of the project are located in **Appendix G.**

5.2 Agency Presentations

FDOT updated local municipalities and agencies throughout the project. These municipalities and agencies were identified as having an interest in the US 41 at Bonita Beach Road (CR 865) PD&E study. Presentations were provided to the City of Bonita Springs, Lee County, and Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization.

On January 29, 2020, FDOT and project staff met in-person in Bartow, FL with the City of Bonita Springs Assistant City Manager and City Council member to discuss project coordination.

On February 24, 2021, FDOT and project staff met virtually via Microsoft Teams with the City of Bonita Springs to discuss the project purpose and need, traffic analysis, and initial intersection alternatives.

On March 5, 2021, FDOT and project staff met virtually via GoToMeeting with Lee County to discuss the project purpose and need, traffic analysis, and initial intersection alternatives.

On April 12 and 13, 2021, FDOT met individually online with each council member of the Bonita Springs City Council. City staff were also present. FDOT presented project information and provided an update since the original study in 2014. Proposed alternatives were presented and a discussion including advantages and disadvantages followed. Council members provided individual feedback as noted in the meeting minutes included in **Appendix H**.

On August 30, 2021, FDOT and project staff met virtually via Microsoft Teams with the City of Bonita Springs to discuss project updates.

On January 24, 2022, FDOT and project staff met virtually with the City of Bonita Springs. FDOT provided information regarding traffic analysis methods and participants discussed the northwest and northeast quadrant roadway base conditions, and signal installation at Bonita Beach Road and Windsor Road. The City brought up access management concerns regarding property around City Hall and provided a site plan for the northwest development. FDOT shared the County's concerns and the need to build consensus on the project.

On January 5, 2023, FDOT and project staff met in-person at the City of Bonita Springs office with the City of Bonita Springs to discuss project updates.

On January 5, 2023, FDOT and project staff met in-person at the County office with the Lee County Department of Transportation to discuss project updates.

On January 5, 2023, FDOT and project staff met in-person at the Cape Coral Public Works Building with Lee County MPO to discuss project updates, proposed alternatives and evaluation data, and the upcoming Alternatives Public Information Meeting. Additional discussion items included traffic analysis, the proposed Coastal Loop Trail, shared use paths, and the City's proposed southern quadrant roadways.

On June 1, 2023, FDOT presented in-person at the Lee County MPO Technical Advisory Committee meeting. The presentation to the Committee included updates on the study, an overview of the preferred intersection alternative, and a summary of the Alternatives Public Information Meeting. The committee discussed concerns regarding new traffic movements, project costs and funding, maintenance, existing conditions in several project areas, design criteria, right-of-way limitations, bicycle and pedestrian traffic, counts, and bike lanes, and examples of other local projects. The meeting minutes are included in **Appendix H.**

On June 1, 2023, FDOT presented in-person at the Lee County MPO Citizen Advisory Committee meeting. The presentation to the Committee included updates on the study, an overview of the preferred intersection alternative, and a summary of the Alternatives Public Information Meeting. The committee discussed future traffic volumes, walkovers, project costs, ADA requirements, comments from the TAC, accommodation of added lanes and design, project costs, right-of-way acquisition, design estimates, safety, speed, and movement of traffic.

On June 16, 2023, FDOT and project staff presented in-person at the Lee County MPO Governing Board Meeting. The presentation to the Board included updates on the study, an overview of the preferred intersection alternative, and a summary of the Alternatives Public Information Meeting.

One June 27, 2023, FDOT and project staff presented in-person at the Lee County MPO Bicycle Pedestrian Coordinating Committee meeting. The presentation to the Committee included updates on the study and specifics regarding shared use paths in this project. FDOT answered questions about costs benefits, transition area ramps for bike lanes and pavement colors. Detailed questions and answers during this meeting as noted in the meeting minutes are included in **Appendix H**.

On July 14, 2023, FDOT and project staff met virtually with the City of Bonita Springs Assistant City Manager and Deputy Mayor, and Lee County MPO representative. This meeting was held jointly with Old 41 PD&E Study to update the City of Bonita Springs on these projects' status.

On August 3, 2023, FDOT and project staff met virtually with RK&K, the City of Bonita Springs' design consultant for the NW quadrant roadway connection Windsor Road at Bonita Beach Road to US 41 to discuss the design status of the roadway and proposed stormwater management.

On September 21, 2023, FDOT and project staff met virtually with LeeTran.

On December 8, 2023, FDOT and project staff met virtually with the City of Bonita Springs and their consultant RK&K to discuss the design of the Northwest Quadrant Roadway. The City provided additional input regarding the alternatives and potential business impacts to Angler's Paradise.

Information from these meetings is included in **Appendix H**.

6.0 OTHER PUBLIC OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

6.1 Project Website

The original project website was available with the mailing of Newsletter Vol 1 in 2014 at https://www.US41atBonitaBeachRd.com. The website was updated regularly to keep the public apprised of the project's status. The website featured a project location map, "Project Details" and "About" sections which included project funding and schedule information; contact information for the Project Manager including a direct link to submit comments; a "Public Involvement" section which was updated to include upcoming public meeting information; as well as draft project reports, public meeting and hearing documents; and project videos and images of the project area. 



a. Purpose and Need

The purpose of this project is to improve overall traffic operations at the existing at-grade intersection of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) to meet future travel demand. Without the proposed improvement, the intersection will experience high levels of delay and operate below acceptable level of service (LOS) standards by year 2035. The intersection enhancement is also intended to:

- Improve the viability of US 41 as a regional travel alternative to I-75 and east-west access [via CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road)] between north-south transportation corridors of the area and the mainland of Lee County and coastal communities/tourist destinations:
- Enhance freight mobility and access;
- Enhance safety conditions by increasing the number of residents and tourists from coastal communities that can be evacuated and improving access for emergency responders; and
- Improve pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation, as well as transit service operations.

The need for the project is based on the following primary and secondary criteria:

PRIMARY CRITERIA

CAPACITY/TRANSPORTATION DEMAND: Improve Operational Capacity and Level of Service

The need for additional operational capacity at the existing at-grade intersection of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) is based upon increased congestion expected from population and employment growth within Lee County and future regional travel demand to be served by US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road).

According to 2010 U.S. Census Bureau data and projections developed for Lee County as part of the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP):

- Population is projected to grow from 618,754 in 2010 to 1,034,400 in 2035 (2.7% annual growth rate).
- Employment is projected to grow from 257,289 in 2010 to 440,334 in 2035 (2.8% annual growth rate).

The existing and future traffic conditions for the US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) at-grade intersection are as follows:

By year 2035, traffic volumes are expected to increase around 18.1% on US 41 (specifically south of the intersection) and between 44.7% and 64.9% on CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road). These increased volumes will deteriorate traffic conditions at the intersection. Without the proposed intersection improvement, the volume-to-capacity ratio will range between 1.25 and 2.0 for the segment of US 41 directly north of CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) and the segment of CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) directly east of US 41. It is important to note that a roadway is deemed deficient if the volume-to-capacity ratio exceeds 0.9 as it has surpassed its designated service volume and LOS standard. In addition, without the proposed intersection enhancement, delay per vehicle is expected to increase to 87.3 seconds by year 2035 resulting in LOS F conditions at the intersection.

SECONDARY CRITERIA

AREA WIDE NETWORK/SYSTEM LINKAGE: Improve Traffic Mobility and Transportation Network Access

US 41 serves as a critical arterial in facilitating the north-south movement of local and regional traffic (including truck traffic) as it connects Lee County, Collier County (to the south), and Charlotte County (to the north), including the cities of Bonita Springs, Fort Myers, Naples, and Port Charlotte. This corridor also provides parallel service to I-75 throughout the State of Florida. Similarly, CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) serves as a major local connector in supporting east-west travel within Lee County, particularly in linking US 41 and I-75 as well as providing one of two connections to the coastal communities/tourist destinations of Fort Myers Beach.

The intersection enhancement is anticipated to:

- Improve the viability of US 41 as a regional alternative to I-75 by reducing travel delay;
- Enhance east-west access between two primary north-south transportation corridors (US 41 and I-75) and the mainland of Lee County and coastal communities/tourist destinations;
- Enhance freight mobility and access as US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are designated as regional freight facilities in the Lee County MPO's 2035 LRTP.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION: Enhance Emergency Evacuation and Response Times

US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are designated as emergency evacuation routes by both the Florida Division of Emergency Management and Lee County. Providing parallel service to I-75, US 41 plays an important role in facilitating north-south traffic during emergency evacuation periods (particularly within southwest Florida). CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) additionally serves a critical role during emergency evacuation periods as it links US 41 and I-75 (facilities of the state evacuation route network) and provides one of two connections for residents and tourists of Fort Myers Beach to the mainland of Lee County.

The intersection improvement is anticipated to:

- Increase the number of residents and tourists from coastal communities that can be evacuated during an emergency event by eliminating a point of delay at the intersection of two major evacuation routes; and
- Improve access for emergency responders; and
- Enhance access to facilities of the state evacuation route network.

MODAL INTERRELATIONSHIPS: Enhance Mobility Options and Multi-Modal Access

While sidewalks are present (both sides) along US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road), marked bicycle lanes (both sides) only exist on US 41. Two LeeTran Bus Routes (150 and LinC 600) additionally operate along US 41 and CR 865

(Bonita Beach Road). Due to the presence of these facilities/services and the surrounding urban environment, heavy pedestrian and bicycle traffic was observed in the field.

The intersection enhancement is anticipated to:

- Improve pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation by modifying/limiting opportunities for conflicts between automobiles and pedestrians/bicyclists; and
- Enhance the performance and reliability of transit service operating along US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) by reducing delays at the intersection.

b. Project Description

This project entails enhancing the operation and safety of the existing US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) at-grade intersection in the City of Bonita Springs, Lee County. US 41 is classified as a six-lane 'Urban Principal Arterial' which extends north through Charlotte County and south through Collier County. Bonita Beach Road (CR 865) operates as a four-lane 'Urban Minor Arterial' in the far southern section of Lee County near the Collier County line.

A range of alternatives (including "no-build", at-grade enhancements, a roundabout, and a new overpass) will be developed and considered as part of the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for this intersection improvement. The limits of the project extend along US 41 approximately a quarter-mile north and south of Bonita Beach Road and along Bonita Beach Road approximately a quarter-mile east and west of US 41.

TRANSPORTATION PLAN CONSISTENCY

The intersection improvement is identified as a cost feasible project in the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) with funding allocated for the PD&E Study and Preliminary Engineering. The improvement is also identified in the Lee County MPO's FY 2012/13FY 2016/17 Transportation Improvement Program and is reflected on 'Map 3A: Lee County 2030 Financially Feasible Highway Plan' in the Transportation Element of the Lee County Comprehensive Plan. The project is additionally identified in the FY 2012/13-FY 2016/17 FDOT Work Program with \$1,100,000 programmed for the PD&E Study. The improvement is not currently identified in the State Transportation Improvement Program.

	The project is located within the City of Bonita Springs. Commercial uses, backed by residential neighborhoods/subdivisions, primarily front both corridors. The City of Bonita Springs City Hall and Public Works buildings are located along the south side CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road), east of US 41. In addition, five Planned Unit Developments are reported within the 200-foot project buffer, and one Development of Regional Impact (Diamond Ridge - containing 453 residential dwelling units and 235,000 gross square feet of retail) exists along US 41 southwest of the intersection. Based on the City of Bonita Springs Future Land Use Map- 2012, the project area is intended to remain unchanged as it will continue to support commercial and residential uses. The proposed improvement is also identified in the Lee County Comprehensive Plan and the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization's Long Range Transportation Plan and Transportation Improvement Program. While adjacent businesses could be affected depending on the type of improvement proposed, overall impacts on

	minority populations; however, the buffer area is less diverse in race and ethnicity than the overall County population. The buffer area also has a higher percentage of individuals under age 18, a lower percentage of
Alternative #1	individuals above age 65, and a lower percentage of housing units with no vehicle available compared to Lee

County. In addition, the median family income within the buffer area ranges from approximately \$29,968 to \$67,404 compared to the median family income for Lee County (\$58,950). Further, 13.8% or 1,150 persons within the census tracts containing the project "speak English less than very well"; Limited English Proficiency (LEP) accommodations will be necessary during public outreach since the data indicates that 5.0% or 1,000 persons or more in the project area speak a language other than English (per Part 1, Chapter 11, Section 11-1.2.4 of the FDOT PD&E Manual). Depending on the type of improvement proposed, the project could affect community cohesion and the area's visual character/aesthetic quality. However, due to the heavy commercial character of each corridor and the fact that the intersection improvement is anticipated to enhance pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation (by reducing conflicts between automobiles and pedestrians/bicyclists), impacts on the social environment are anticipated to be minimal.

Potential relocation impacts are anticipated to be moderate as access to some businesses and residences located along the corridors could be affected during project construction. However, actual displacements are not known at this time as they will depend on the type of improvement proposed. As more detailed project information becomes available, further assessment of relocation effects will be conducted.

In addition, according to the City of Bonita Springs Future Land Use Map- 2012, the project area is intended to remain unchanged as it will continue to support commercial and residential uses. Further, the project is located entirely within the Bonita Springs-Naples Urbanized Area. For these reasons, no impacts to farmlands are anticipated.

For these reasons and due to the small percentage of wetlands reported within the 200-foot buffer, minimal involvement with wetland resources is anticipated.

In addition, suitable wood stork habitat is present within a wet drainage ditch located adjacent to the east side of US 41. For these reasons, the project could result in moderate involvement with wildlife and habitat resources.

While businesses on CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are located closer to the right-of-way line, open swale drainage areas and surface parking lots buffer most businesses along US 41. For this reason and due to the heavy commercial character of each corridor as well as the limited number of sensitive receptors within close proximity to the project, noise related impacts are anticipated to be minimal.





a. Purpose and Need

The purpose of this project is to address the deficient operational capacity of the US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) intersection to relieve existing congestion and accommodate projected area travel demand. Other goals of the project are to 1) enhance regional and local mobility, 2) enhance safety conditions, and 3) improve multi-modal access. The need for the project is based on the following criteria:

CAPACITY/TRANSPORTATION DEMAND: Improve Operational Conditions

According to Appendix G: Congestion Management Process of the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) [Lee County 2040 Transportation Plan], the intersection of US 41 at CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) experiences chronic congestion. As population and employment growth are expected to continue within this area of Lee County, congestion at the intersection is anticipated to increase.

Based on the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District One Regional Planning Model, the population within the traffic analysis zones (TAZs) encompassing the intersection is expected to increase by 77% between 2010 and 2040; employment is expected to grow by 40% during the same time period. Per the Lee County 2040 Transportation Plan, comparable growth is expected countywide with a 69% increase in residents and a 72% increase in jobs. In addition, the intersection of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) is identified within the Lee County 2040 Transportation Plan as a "Redevelopment Corridor Intensification Area".

As depicted through Figure 34: 2030 Volume to Capacity Ratio of the Lee County 2040 Transportation Plan, both US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are expected to be severely congested as each will have a volume to capacity (V/C) ratio of over 1.20. Specific 2040 V/C ratios for each roadway, as reported in the Lee County 2040 Transportation Plan, are as follows: US 41 south of Bonita Beach Road = 1.50, US 41 north of Bonita Beach Road = 1.70, CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) west of US 41 = 1.29, and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) east of US 41 = 1.52. Based on Federal Highway Administration guidance, a V/C ratio less than 0.85 generally indicates that adequate roadway capacity is available and vehicles are not expected to experience significant queues and delays. As the V/C ratio approaches 1.0, traffic flow may become unstable, and delay and queuing conditions may occur. Once the demand exceeds the capacity [a V/C ratio greater than 1.0], traffic flow is unstable and excessive delay and queuing is expected; the roadway is deemed deficient as it has surpassed its designated service volume and Level of Service (LOS) standard.

The existing intersection is operationally deficient and is not able to accommodate the multiple transportation modes [vehicles (including trucks), bicyclists, and pedestrians] that presently use the two corridors composing the intersection. The segment of CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) east of US 41 currently operates at LOS E. Conditions along both roadways are anticipated to be exacerbated if no improvements occur as the intersection lacks the operational capacity to accommodate future travel demand; both roadways are projected to operate at LOS E by year 2040. An analysis conducted specifically for the intersection further indicated that under the 2040 No-Build condition, the intersection will operate at LOS F as vehicles will experience a 169.8-second delay [a delay of over 80 seconds is considered LOS F].

This project is intended to improve traffic operations at the intersection of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) by increasing the operational capacity to address existing congestion and projected travel demand.

AREA WIDE NETWORK/SYSTEM LINKAGE: Improve Traffic Mobility and Transportation Network Access

US 41 serves as a critical arterial in facilitating the north-south movement of regional and local traffic [including truck traffic] as it runs parallel to I-75 along the west coast of the State of Florida. Similarly, CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) serves as a major east-west local roadway within Lee County, linking US 41 and I-75 and providing access [as one of two connections] between the mainland of Lee County and coastal communities/tourist destinations to the west [i.e., barrier islands and beaches]. The intersection enhancement is anticipated to:

- -Improve the viability of US 41 as a regional alternative facility to I-75 by reducing travel delay,
- -Enhance east-west access between two primary north-south transportation corridors [US 41 and I-75] as well as between the mainland of Lee County and coastal communities/tourist destinations to the west, and
- -Enhance freight mobility and access within the area as both US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are designated as regional freight facilities [Tier 1 Regional Freight Corridor and Tier 2 Regional Freight Connector, respectively] in the Lee County 2040 Transportation Plan.

SAFETY CONDITIONS: Enhance Emergency Evacuation and Response Times

US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are designated emergency evacuation routes of both the Florida Division of Emergency Management and Lee County. Providing parallel service to I-75, US 41 plays an important role in facilitating north-south traffic during incidences and emergency evacuation periods [particularly within southwest Florida]. CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) also serves a critical role during emergency evacuation periods as it connects US 41 and I-75 [facilities of the state evacuation route network] and provides one of two connections for residents and tourists between the barrier islands/tourist destinations to the west and mainland of Lee County. The intersection improvement is anticipated to:

- -Increase the volume of residents and tourists from coastal communities that can be evacuated during an emergency event by eliminating a point of delay at the intersection of two major evacuation routes;
- -Enhance access to facilities of the state evacuation route network, and
- -Improve response times [due to enhanced access] to emergency events and incidences.

MODAL INTERRELATIONSHIPS: Enhance Mobility Options and Multi-Modal Access

While sidewalks are present on both sides of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road), marked bicycle lanes only exist on US 41 [both sides]. Two LeeTran bus routes [Routes 150 and 600] additionally operate along US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road). Due to the presence of these facilities/services and the surrounding urban environment, heavy pedestrian and bicycle traffic exists in the area [as observed during three separate field reviews conducted for the project]. Multimodal facilities are to be considered as part of the project as the need for and performance of these facilities/travel options at the intersection are critical with growth in the area creating a latent demand for continued, increased bicycle and pedestrian activity. The intersection enhancement is anticipated to:

- -Improve pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation by modifying/limiting opportunities for conflicts between automobiles and pedestrians/bicyclists and
- -Enhance the performance and reliability of transit service operating along US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) by reducing delays at the intersection.

PROJECT STATUS

The project is identified in FDOT's FY 2020 - FY 2024 Five-Year Work Program and Lee County MPO's FY 2019/2020 - FY 2023/2024 Transportation Improvement Program with \$1,183,060 and \$1,110,000 programmed for the PD&E Study, respectively. Additionally, the Lee County Comprehensive Plan's Appendix illustrates the project on Map 3A: 2030 Financially Feasible Highway Plan; Map 3A also notes that there is partial funding for an interchange at the intersection. The intersection improvement is not identified in the State transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) or the Lee County 2040 Transportation Plan.

b. Project Description

This project entails improving the operations of the at-grade intersection of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) in the City of Bonita Springs, Lee County to address existing congestion and projected travel demand. US 41 extends the length of Lee County and is classified as a six-lane 'Urban Principal Arterial'. CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) operates as an east-west, four-lane 'Urban Minor Arterial' in the southern section of Lee County, near the Collier County Line, connecting coastal communities/tourist attractions [i.e., barrier islands and beaches] to the mainland of Lee County. Sidewalks are present on both sides of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road); however, marked bicycle lanes only exist on US 41 [both sides]. Two LeeTran bus routes [Routes 150 and 600] additionally operate along US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road).

A range of alternatives [including "No-Build", at-grade enhancements, a roundabout, and new overpass] will be evaluated for the intersection improvement as part of the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study. Bicycle and pedestrian facilities/facility enhancements will also be considered. As such, specific right-of-way requirements will be determined during the PD&E Study; additional right-of-way may be required depending on the selected alternative.

The project is located in the City of Bonita Springs, a U.S. Census Designated Place within Lee County. The project area primarily consists of commercial/retail/office and residential uses. One Planned Unit Development [Crown Lake Shoppes CPD] is present within the 500-foot project buffer; eight additional Planned Unit Developments are present within the 1,320-foot project buffer. Community features reported within the 500-foot project buffer include: four homeowner and condominium associations [Waterford I, II, and III and Wedgewood I] and one Office of Greenways and Trails (OGT) multi-use trail opportunity/hiking trail priority [Estero - Bonita Corridor]. Community features within the 1,320-foot project buffer include: one community center/religious center, healthcare facilities, and one laser facility; additional community facilities [such as city hall, a post office, a fire station, and recreational features are within the 5,280-foot project buffer. Compared to the demographic characteristics for Lee County, the 500-foot project buffer contains significantly higher percentages of individuals who identify themselves as White and who are age 65 and older, a comparable Other Race population percentage, a lower percentage of housing units with no vehicle available, and a slightly higher median family income [\$889 more]. Limited English Proficiency (LEP) accommodations will likely be required during public involvement efforts of the Project Development phase as 11.37% or 623 persons within the census block groups containing the intersection "speak English less than very well". In the long term, the proposed project is anticipated to have positive effects on the social environment and cohesion of surrounding communities by enhancing multi-modal access to residences, job opportunities, essential services and tourist destinations; improving transit reliability; and enhancing safety conditions. Depending on the type of improvement proposed [i.e., whether or not an elevated structure is recommended], the project could affect community cohesion and the area's visual character/aesthetic quality. However, due to the heavy commercial character of each corridor composing the intersection and the fact that the intersection improvement is anticipated to enhance pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation [by reducing opportunities for conflicts between automobiles and pedestrians/bicyclists] and the performance and reliability of transit service operating in the area [by reducing delays at the intersection], impacts on the social environment are anticipated to be minimal. Positive and negative impacts to sociocultural resources will be assessed further as part of the Project Development phase; however, a standalone Sociocultural Effects Evaluation Technical Memorandum will not be prepared as part of the Project Development and Environment Study. A Public Involvement Plan

will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

3. Relocation Potential

The project area primarily consists of commercial/retail/office and residential uses. The noted commercial/retail/office uses line both US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road); the residential uses sit behind the commercial/retail/office activities along the two roadways. Vegetated swales and surface parking lots buffer the majority of businesses on each corridor; however, some structures on CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are located closer to the roadway. Right-of-way surrounding the intersection ranges from 120 feet to 145 feet along CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) and 190 feet to 215 feet along US 41. Depending on the type of improvement proposed [i.e., whether or not an elevated structure is recommended], additional right of way may be required. Access to proximate businesses and residences may also temporarily be affected and/or modified as a result of the project. Encroachment into surrounding parcels (if necessary) will be coordinated with the appropriate property owners. Further, the proposed project improvements will be designed to minimize right-of-way acquisition. Specific right-of-way requirements will be determined during the Project Development and Environment Study. Based on the foregoing, moderate involvement regarding relocation potential is anticipated. Positive and negative impacts to sociocultural resources will be assessed further as part of the Project Development phase; however, a standalone Sociocultural Effects Evaluation Technical Memorandum will not be prepared as part of the Project Development and Environment Study. A Conceptual Stage Relocation Plan will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

4. Farmlands

The 500-foot project buffer consists of 15.81 acres (87.69%) of soils classified as Farmland of Unique Importance. Based on recent aerial imagery and field observations, land containing these soils has been developed. Also, no agricultural land is present within the 500-foot project buffer. According to the City of Bonita Springs Future Land Use Map, the area is expected to continue to support commercial/retail/office and residential uses. In addition, the intersection is located entirely within the Bonita Springs Urbanized Area. For these reasons, no impacts to farmlands are anticipated as a result of the project. In addition, no further coordination with NRCS is needed as the project does not meet the definition of farmland as defined in 7 CFR 658 and the provisions of the Farmland Protection Policy Act of 1981.

5. Aesthetic Effects

The project is located in the City of Bonita Springs, a U.S. Census Designated Place within Lee County. Commercial/retail/office uses line both US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road); residential uses sit behind the commercial/retail/office activities along the two roadways. According to the City of Bonita Springs Future Land Use Map, the area surrounding the intersection will continue to support these identified uses. It is important to note that while the project will consider bicycle and pedestrian facilities/facility enhancements in order to improve safety conditions and multi-modal access/mobility, views from/of the surrounding area could be affected depending on the type of improvement proposed [i.e., whether or not an elevated structure is recommended]. However, given the heavy commercial character of each corridor and the fact that the project appears to be consistent with the future land use vision and aesthetic character of the intersection, minimal involvement regarding aesthetic effects is anticipated. Positive and negative impacts to sociocultural resources will be assessed further as part of the Project Development phase; however, a standalone

Sociocultural Effects Evaluation Technical Memorandum will not be prepared as part of the Project Development and Environment Study.

6. Economic

Commercial/retail/office uses line both US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road); residential uses sit behind the commercial/retail/office activities along the two roadways. Two strip shopping centers are respectively located in the northwest and southeast quadrants of the intersection; large tenants of these strip-centers include Publix, Winn-Dixie, and Crunch Fitness. Numerous banking, clothing, and retail establishments surround the intersection such as Bank of America, Wells Fargo, Goodwill, and Walgreens. It is important to note that the two roadways composing the intersection are important in facilitating regional and local traffic [including truck traffic] in the area, particularly with their access to other major transportation corridors and coastal communities/tourist destinations [i.e., Fort Meyers Beach and Little Hickory Island] to the west of the Lee County mainland. In the long term, the proposed project is expected to enhance economic conditions of the area by 1) addressing the deficient capacity of the intersection in the existing and future condition in order to serve the mobility demands of the area, thereby supporting increased growth, 2) better facilitating the movement of local and regional freight, and 3) accommodating multimodal activity through bicycle and pedestrian facilities/facility enhancements and reliable transit. However, depending on the type of improvement proposed [i.e., whether or not an elevated structure is recommended], minimal economic impacts are anticipated due to the fact that access to the noted businesses may be modified or temporarily affected during project construction as a result of the project. Positive and negative impacts to sociocultural resources will be assessed further as part of the Project Development phase; however, a standalone Sociocultural Effects Evaluation Technical Memorandum will not be prepared as part of the Project Development and Environment Study.

7. Mobility

The US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) intersection is at-grade with double left turn lanes at all approaches to the intersection. US 41 is classified as a six-lane 'Urban Principal Arterial' with a raised median and right turn lanes that run the length of the project limits. CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) is classified as a four-lane 'Urban Minor Arterial' with a raised median and turn and merge lanes at various points. US 41 facilitates the north-south movement of regional and local traffic (including truck traffic) as it runs parallel to I-75 along the east coast of the State of Florida; it additionally connects employment and population centers throughout the west coast of Florida. CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) provides east-west access between major north-south transportation corridors of the area [US 41 and I-75] as well as serves as one of two connections between the coastal communities/tourist destinations to the west and the mainland of Lee County. US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) are designated emergency evacuation routes of both the Florida Division of Emergency Management and Lee County as well as designated regional freight facilities [US 41 - Tier 1 Regional Freight Corridor and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) - Tier 2 Regional Freight Connector] according to the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO's) 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). It should be noted that sidewalks are present on both sides of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road); however, marked bicycle lanes only occur along US 41. Two LeeTran bus routes [Routes 150 and 600], one transportation disadvantaged service provider area [Good Wheels Inc.], and a future trail exists within the 500-foot project buffer. This project is intended to improve traffic operations at the intersection of US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) by increasing the operational capacity to address existing congestion and projected travel demand. In turn, through reduced delays at the intersection, the improvement is anticipated to enhance overall mobility in the area by 1) improving the viability of US 41 as a regional alternative facility to I-75; 2) enhancing east-west access between two primary north-south transportation corridors [US 41 and I-75] as well as between the mainland of Lee County and coastal communities/tourist destinations to the west; 3) enhancing freight mobility and access within the area; 4) increasing the volume of residents and tourists from coastal communities that can be evacuated, enhancing access to facilities of the state evacuation route network, and improving response times to emergency events and incidences; 5) enhancing the performance and reliability of transit service in the area; and 6) improving pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation by modifying/limiting opportunities for conflicts between automobiles and pedestrians/bicyclists. Positive and negative impacts to sociocultural resources will be assessed further as part of the Project

Development phase; however, a standalone Sociocultural Effects Evaluation Technical Memorandum will not be prepared as part of the Project Development and Environment Study.

ii. Cultural

1. Section 4(f) Potential

One potential Section 4(f) resource, an Office of Greenways and Trails (OGT) multi-use trail opportunity/hiking trail priority [Estero-Bonita Corridor], exists within the 500-foot project buffer. While no comprehensive Cultural Resource Assessment Survey has been conducted for either US 41 or CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road), no previously recorded resources exist within 500 feet of the intersection; in addition, there is low potential for unrecorded historic resources to exist given the developed nature of the project area. For these reasons, minimal involvement regarding Section 4(f) potential is anticipated. A Section 4(f) Determination of Applicability Form [Form No. 650-050-45] will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

2. Historic and Archaeological Sites

A review of the data indicates that the portion of the project along US 41 is within the boundaries of a previous Cultural Resource Assessment Survey (CRAS) conducted in 1997: the Cultural Resource Assessment Survey of US 41 from North of CR 887 to San Carlos Boulevard [Collier and Lee Counties, Florida]. No comprehensive survey has been conducted along CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road). No previously recorded cultural resources are located within 500 feet of the project corridors. Property appraiser data also identified no parcels with potential unrecorded historic resources. Although considered historic in other parts of the state, US 41 within the project area no longer retains any historic fabric or integrity. Based on the previous survey of US 41, the lack of previously recorded resources within 500 feet of the intersection, the absence of any potential unrecorded historic resources, and the developed nature of the project area, minimal involvement regarding cultural resources is anticipated. A Cultural Resource Assessment Survey will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

3. Recreation Areas

Due to the limited number of recreational features within the project vicinity, minimal involvement regarding recreation areas is anticipated as a result of the project.

iii. Natural

1. Wetlands and Surface Waters

While no wetlands were reported within the 500-foot project buffer based on the SFWMD Wetlands 2008-2015 database, the National Wetlands Inventory database identified 1.36 acres [7.55%] of palustrine wetlands within the same buffer. These wetlands are primarily associated with the stormwater ponds within proximity to the intersection and the wide canal that flows along the east side of US 41 and crosses underneath CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road). It should be noted that estuarine wetlands associated with the Imperial River are located approximately 2,000 feet north of the project. Avoidance and minimization measures will be incorporated into the project's design, best management practices will be utilized during project activities, and compensatory mitigation will be provided for any adverse wetland impacts resulting from the proposed project improvements. Further, the proposed stormwater management system for the project will be developed to meet the design and performance criteria established in the SFWMD Environmental Resource Permit Applicant's Handbook Volumes I and II for the treatment and attenuation of discharges to nearby waterbodies. As such, stormwater runoff from the proposed project will be treated to prevent water quality impacts to nearby wetlands. Additional right-of-way acquisition may be necessary to accommodate improved stormwater management facilities. Due to the presence of the noted features, minimal involvement regarding wetland resources is anticipated. A Natural Resources Evaluation will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

2. Water Quality and Quantity

Alternative #1

Stormwater runoff within the project area is currently collected via curb and gutter and a network of vegetated swales adjacent to and on both sides of each roadway. Stormwater ponds are located within proximity to the intersection, and a wide canal flows along the east side of US 41 crossing underneath CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road). The 500-foot project buffer occurs within the watershed of one impaired waterbody [Imperial River - Marine Segment (WBID 3258EB)] - which is impaired for fecal coliform, iron, nutrients, and dissolved oxygen. Other features located within the 500-foot project buffer include: the Surficial Aquifer System [a principal aquifer of the State of Florida], a recharge area of the Floridian Aquifer, and one NPDES stormwater permit. The Imperial River, a tributary of Estero Bay [a designated Aquatic Preserve], is additionally located approximately 2,000 feet north of the project; the Estero Bay tributaries are designated Outstanding Florida Waters (OFWs). The proposed stormwater management system will be developed to meet the design and performance criteria established in the SFWMD Environmental Resource Permit Applicant's Handbook Volumes I and II for the treatment and attenuation of discharges to impaired waters and OFWs; the design will make every effort to maximize the treatment of stormwater runoff from the proposed intersection improvements. A Storm Water Pollution Prevention Program (SWPPP) will also be implemented [as required by the NPDES permit] to control the effects of stormwater runoff during construction. For these reasons, minimal involvement regarding water quality and quantity resources is anticipated. A Water Quality Impact Evaluation, and potentially a Pond Siting Report, will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

3. Floodplains

According to the DFIRM (SFHA) 100 Year Flood Zone data, 2.92 acres [16.21%] of the project's 500-foot buffer occurs within the 100-year floodplain [Flood Zone AE]. The 100-year floodplain is concentrated in the southwest quadrant of the intersection. Floodplain compensation associated with project impacts will be addressed through necessary agency coordination. For these reasons, minimal involvement regarding floodplains is anticipated. A Location Hydraulic Report will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

The 500-foot project buffer occurs within the Southwest Coast Ecosystem Management Area; FWS Consultation Areas for the American crocodile, Florida bonneted bat, Florida scrub jay, and Southwest plants; Abundant Range for the Florida black bear; and Core Foraging Area of an active nesting wood stork colony. Least terns and wood storks have been observed within the project area; the canal present on the east side of US 41 serves as suitable habitat for wood storks. Based on the Florida Natural Areas Inventory (FNAI) database, two other endangered or rare species [Eastern indigo snake and scrub stylisma] have the potential to occur within the 500-foot project buffer; additional protected species and habitat are further reported within one mile of the project. Avoidance and minimization measures will be implemented to the greatest extent practicable, and agency coordination will take place to address potential project impacts to the noted listed species. For these reasons and due to the surrounding urban environment, minimal involvement regarding wildlife and habitat resources is anticipated. A Natural Resources Evaluation will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

6. Coastal and Marine

No coastal or marine resources are reported within the 500-foot project buffer; however, estuarine wetlands associated with the Imperial River are located approximately 2,000 feet north of the project. For this reason, minimal involvement regarding coastal and marine resources is anticipated.

iv. Physical

While commercial uses abut the project intersection, residential subdivisions are present behind the commercial activities. Specific community features within the 500-foot project buffer that may be sensitive to noise and vibration effects include: four homeowner and condominium associations [Waterford I, II, and III and Wedgewood I], a dentist office, and one Office of Greenways and Trails (OGT) multi-use trail opportunity/hiking trail priority [Estero-Bonita Corridor]. An additional dentist office, one religious center, healthcare facilities, one laser facility, and additional recreational facilities are reported within the 1320-foot project buffer. Increased noise levels during construction and presumable noise level increases from higher traffic volumes as a result of improved operational conditions at the US 41 and CR 865 (Bonita Beach Road) intersection could have impacts on nearby residences and other identified

sensitive receptors. However, given that the proposed improvements are anticipated to be constructed primarily within the existing right-of-way and abatement criteria will be considered to offset any potential unavoidable adverse effects, overall noise and vibration related impacts as a result of the project are anticipated to be minimal. A Noise Study Report will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

2. Air Quality

The project is not located within a USEPA-designated Air Quality Maintenance Area or Non-Attainment Area for any of the six pollutants [ozone, carbon monoxide, sulfur dioxide, nitrogen dioxide, lead, and small particulate matter] specified by the USEPA in National Ambient Air Quality Standards; therefore, the Clean Air Act conformity requirements do not currently apply to this project. Minimal, localized impacts to air quality could occur as a result of fugitive dust and exhaust emissions generated from equipment during project construction; no permanent effects to air quality are anticipated. An Air Quality Technical Memorandum will be included in the Project Development and Environmental Study scoping recommendations.

3. Contamination

Proper mitigation will take place if medium to high risk sites are identified. For these reasons and given the relatively low presence of sites within proximity to the project intersection, minimal involvement regarding contamination is anticipated. A Contamination Screening Evaluation Report will be included in the Project Development and Environment Study scoping recommendations.

4. Infrastructure

THE PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has recently started a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study in your community. This study involves the intersection of US 41 at Bonita Beach Road (County Road (C.R.) 865) within Bonita Springs, Florida in southern Lee County. The study area is comprised of the intersection itself as well as the surrounding area including 1,750 feet to the west (to Windsor Road), 1,000 feet to the east (to Arroyal Road), 1,500 feet to the south, and 1,750 feet to the north.

A project location map depicts the study area. The purpose of the study is to address congestion and projected travel demand. Other goals of the project are to enhance mobility, improve safety conditions, and provide for multi-modal features in Lee County, Florida. This newsletter is one of the first steps to introduce the study, describe the study process, provide contact information, and establish communication with members of the public, agency staff, elected officials, and other interested stakeholders.

STUDY OVERVIEW

The Florida Department of Transportation is conducting this PD&E study to evaluate the need for capacity-related improvements, as well as ways to improve safety conditions and provide for multi-modal features. The PD&E Study has the following project objectives:

- Improve the operations and level of service of the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road (C.R. 865) intersection
- Enhance east-west access between two primary north-south transportation corridors (US 41 and I-75) as well as between the mainland and coastal communities/tourist destinations
- Enhance freight mobility and access within the area
- Increase the throughput of residents and tourists from coastal communities that can be evacuated during an emergency event
- Improve safety and circulation for all users
- Enhance access to facilities of the state evacuation route network
- Improve emergency response times
- Improve pedestrian/bicycle access and circulation
- Enhance the performance and reliability of transit service

The study is just beginning, and current activities include engineering and environmental data collection and traffic analysis. The project activities are shown in the project schedule. The study process adheres to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) to develop transportation improvements and involves community and agency input, consideration of the natural, social, cultural and physical environment while meeting the purpose of and need for the project.

RELATED PROJECT

This PD&E project is listed in the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) 5-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Fiscal Year 2019/20 – 2023/24. The next phase in the project development process, final design, is not yet funded. This project is also being closely coordinated with the on-going PD&E for Old US 41 from Collier County Line to Bonita Beach Road.





Senate votes to keep 2001 war-on-terror authority

WASHINGTON - The Senate voted WASHINGTON - The Senate voted overwhelmingly Wednesday to con-tinue congressional authorization for the use of military force in the global fight against terror, turning back an ef-fort by Kentucky Sen. Rand Paul to repeal the 2001 measure

Senators rejected the amendment 86-9 as they are debating a separate re-peal of two authorizations of military force in Iraq. There is broad bipartisan support to withdraw that congressional approval granted in 1991 and 2002 for

an approval granted in 1991 and 2002 for military strikes against Saddam Hus-sein's regime. While those two authorizations are rarely used and are focused on just one country, Iraq, the 2001 measure gave President George W, Bush broad au-thority for the invasion of Afghanistan code to 6 the substitute regime anneals. and the fight against terrorism, approv-ing force "against those nations, or-ganizations, or persons" that planned or aided the Sept. IJ, 2001, attacks on the United States.

the United States.

Passed in September 2001, it is still used to this day to justify U.S., military action against terror groups that are deemed a threat against America.

The 2002 measure that launched the invasion of frag 20 years ago this week has been used much less frequently, and supporters of repealing it say it is vulnerable to abuse. President Joe Biden has said he supports that repeal.

Senators in both parties said they

Senators in both parties said they might be open to eventually replacing the 2001 authorization for the war on terror and narrowing its authority, but they argued that it should not be fully repealed. "We have not yet had that substantive discussion," said Senate Foreign Relations Committee Chairman Bob Menendez, D-N.J., ahead of the amendment vote.

Paul said that by repealing only the Iraq authorizations, Congress is "miss-Senators in both parties said they

Iraq authorizations, Congress is "miss-ing the point" since Saddam's regime no longer exists. By leaving the 2001 measure in place, Congress is keeping the authorization that approves "war everywhere, all the time," he said.

The Senate is expected to vote next

week to repeal the two fraq measures.

It's unclear whether leaders in the Republican-controlled House will bring the bill up for a vote, even if it passes the Senate. Forty-nine House Republicans supported the legislation repealing the Irea supporties when then man cans supported the legislation repeai-ing the Iraq authorities when then-ma-jority Democrats held a vote two years ago, but current House Speaker Kevin McCarthy, R-Calif., opposed it then. McCarthy signaled this week that he


McCarriy signated this week that the is open to supporting the measure, but it's unclear whether House Republicans will move the Senate bill without any changes. House Foreign Affairs Committee Chairman Michael McCaul, R-Texas, said he is interested in replacing the two Iraq authorizations instead

ing the two Iraq authorizations instead of just repealing them.

McCaul met with Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, D-NY, on Wednesday on the authorizations of military force and other issues.

Virginia Sen. Tim Kaine, the lead periocratic author of the senate only to repeal the Iraq authorizations, said he believes bipartisan support in the House could move votes. Kaine and Sen. Todd Young, the In-

diana Republican who is also leading the push, have argued that repeal will help the United States' strategic part-nership with Iraq.

INTRODUCTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District One, welcomes you to the Public Workshop for the US 41 at the Intersection of Bonita Beach Road (CR 865) Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study. The study limits are within the City of Bonita Springs, in southern Lee County.

WHAT IS A PD&E STUDY?

A PD&E Study is a process developed by the FDOT to determine social, economic, natural, and physical environmental effects associated with a proposed transportation improvement project. The PD&E Study adheres to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and associated federal and state regulations. The PD&E Study process involves a combination of engineering evaluations, environmental analysis, and public involvement. An important component of the process is public and agency coordination. The basic activities of a PD&E Study include data collection, alternatives development and analysis, a Public Information Workshop, a Public Hearing, and final acceptance.

STUDY PURPOSE

The purpose of this PD&E Study is to evaluate the need for capacity-related improvements, as well as ways to improve safety conditions and provide for multi-modal features within this area and to address congestion and projected travel demand.

ALTERNATIVES

The proposed intersection improvement includes two build alternatives focused on improving intersection traffic operations and safety and a no-build alternative. The first alternative, the **Enhanced Traffic Signal**, would widen US 41 to eight lanes from Foley Road to the southern end of the Imperial River bridge and provide improvements to the existing signalized intersection. 




a 12 foot shared use path on both sides of the roadway. At the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection, the eastbound to northbound and the southbound to eastbound left turn movements are proposed to be three lanes each. The westbound to northbound right turn movement would be two lanes and would remain under signal control.

The second alternative would reconfigure US 41 at Bonita Beach Road into a **Partial Displaced Left Turn**. The US 41 and Bonita Beach Road partial displaced left turn would have "crossover" left turn movements on US 41. The "crossover" intersection for the south approach is a two phased signalized intersection approximately 650-feet south of Bonita Beach Road. This is for the development of a two lane northbound left turn movement and also accommodates the eastbound to southbound right turn movement. The northern "crossover" signalized intersection is approximately 400-feet north of Bonita Beach Road to develop a three lane left turn movement. These "crossover" left turn movements would have the green light when the Bonita Beach Road east and west through movements have the green light to maximize signal efficiency. US 41 south of the "crossover" intersection will be a six lane divided roadway having the 12 foot shared use path on both sides. The US 41 intersection with Foley Road is proposed to be signalized. US 41 north of the "crossover" intersection widens to four lanes northbound and has a short four lane section through the signalized intersection with the quadrant roadways, terminating at the Imperial River Bridge.

For both the traffic signal and partial displaced left turn alternatives, Bonita Beach Road would be widened to six lanes between the Center of Bonita Springs to Arroyal Drive. Concepts for both alternatives are available on the project website at https://www.swflroads.com/project/444321-1.







PROJECT SCHEDULE

The PD&E Study began in late 2019. Project staff has been performing data collection and developing and evaluating the proposed alternatives. Following today's public workshop, project staff will continue developing and evaluating the proposed alternatives and drafting study documents. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for early 2024. The study is anticipated to conclude in late 2024. Future phases of design, right-of-way, and construction are not currently funded. 

Not sure if we met at the open meeting on April 4th, but if we did, I'm the guy that said I was probably the only person in favor of a flyover!

I've looked at the Colonial/US 41 flyover and believe something similar would be the best answer for this intersection too.

I suggest 4 lanes north and south with the two center lanes being the overpass of BBR. You should still have enough room to have two left turn lanes (under the overpass) with one right turn lane and one straight lane. The problem is the city council cannot see anyway that this won't hurt the businesses on that corner. The fact that an overpass will improve traffic flow (and perhaps aid in evacuation) is not their primary concern.

You would have to make a case that a flyover/overpass can be built that would not hurt existing businesses. It doesn't seem to have hurt the Colonial intersection.

I am a full time resident and property owner whose residence is located on the north side of Tamara Ct. in Bonita Springs, Florida. Some of the neighboring property owners and I have discussed the above referenced project as it impacts the north side of our residential street. The comments and concerns expressed herein reference the 'Carolina St. Extension' as proposed in the study.

1. Traffic / Noise Nuisance Impacts

As proposed, the Carolina St. extension will bring significant and undesirable traffic combined with associated noise to all residential properties on the north side of Tamara Ct. The project proposes to bring a nuisance to residents and property owners rather than solve any traffic reduction issue or serve any discernable purpose. Further, the project will greatly impair if not destroy the ability to either rent or peaceably enjoy these residential properties both inside and out.

2. Flood Plain / Drainage Impacts

With the latest post-Hurricane Ian FEMA flood plan map redraw effective November 17, 2022, all residential properties on the north side of Tamara Court went from being in an 'AE' (100 year / 1%) flood plain to an 'X500' (500 year / 0.2%) non-flood plain. Our concerns are that with a significant 'taking' of existing stormwater drainage land and replacing it with several hundred yards of impervious concrete will significantly impact these residential properties in a negative and damaging manner. Further, such a taking would run afoul of agreements made before the Arroyal stormwater pond was created.

At the outset, we wonder how much Arroyal Pond stormwater capacity would be reduced; that is, by how many millions of gallons would stormwater runoff be eliminated, and where would the resultant stormwater / storm surge runoff go?

3. Destruction of Residential Property Values

As currently proposed per the 'Partial Displaced Left Turn' and '8 Lane Traffic Signal Alternative' drawings, constructing the 'Carolina St. Extension' as a three-plus lane, 40-foot-wide roadway would have the capacity to potentially transport a low number of off-season and higher number of part-time resident / tourist season vehicles daily 10 to 30 feet behind six residential homes on the north side of Tamara Ct. Such a roadway would undoubtedly have the effect of significantly reducing if not destroying the property value of these homes.

I fail to see how anyone would want to either own, rent or live in a residence on the north side of Tamara Ct. if the 'Carolina St. Extension' is built as proposed in the current design study. Accordingly, each property owner and resident on the north side of Tamara Ct. will be provided with a copy of this letter. Each property owner referenced herein, whether individually or collectively, may decide to pursue just legal remedies including but not limited to injunctive relief and recovery of compensatory damages should such a plan be approved or funded for construction.

4. Environmental / Wetlands / Indigenous Species Impacts

While the majority of the Arroyal stormwater pond shoreline has been periodically cleared with an aquatic herbicide, the southwest and western edges of the pond have been left uncleared, becoming marshland extending anywhere from 30 to 100+ feet from the shoreline outward. As a result, numerous species of seasonal and full-time resident shorebirds and other species have taken up residency in the pond's shoreline waters, including, but not limited to rabbits, ducks and alligators.

While the proposed 'Evaluation Matrix' states that .55 - .79 acres of wetlands would be affected by the entire project, I find the 'Potential Environmental Effects' cited to be significantly understated because the 'Carolina Extension' alone would negatively impact much more than this minimal acreage estimate. Such downplayed estimates cause me to wonder if anyone from Florida DOT or Inwood Consulting Engineers have actually had 'boots on the ground' to measure or examine the environmental damage this project has the potential to cause.

5. Traffic Improvement / Travel Delay Impacts

First, southbound Arroyal Road traffic already has access to northbound US 41 via Crown Lake Blvd. without having to travel to or impact vehicle traffic on westbound Bonita Beach Road. Second, the proposed 'Carolina Extension' would thus serve the limited purpose of providing (1) left turn access to southbound US 41 via traffic signal at Boston Road & US 41 plus (2) eastbound access to Arroyal Road via the 'Extension'. Third, any vehicle travelling northbound on US 41 intending to access northbound Arroyal Road already has the option of bypassing Bonita Beach Road by continuing to travel north on US 41 to turn right at Crown Lake Blvd.

I would be interested in examining the results of any future study evidencing (1) the number of vehicles per day using Arroyal Road in total; (2) the subset number of vehicles using Arroyal Road for the purpose of travelling westbound on Bonita Beach Road to US 41 (or northbound,

southbound on US 41) and (3) the number of vehicles that would actually benefit from having the proposed 'Extension' built along with any resultant 'time savings' estimates.

After attending the virtual meeting on April 3rd and spending a considerable amount of time evaluating the project materials, my overall assessment of the 'Carolina Street Extension' (now in its' third design iteration in the past 12 years) is that it will provide minimal if any purpose solving traffic or safety issues relating to the Bonita Beach Road / US 41 project area being studied. Conversely, the amount of taxpayer funds wasted, properties impacted, and environmental damage incurred will be significant.

In summary, I have been a Tamara Ct. resident since 2011 and have experienced two major hurricanes here. No storm surge or storm runoff has come within two vertical feet of my residence during these 12 years in large part due to the amount of stormwater drainage and runoff capacity as it currently exists. To my knowledge, no home on the north side of Tamara Ct. has been inundated or suffered inside damage from storm surge or stormwater runoff since these six properties were built over the course of the last 45 years. We as residents and properties owners would strongly prefer to keep things that way.

Your consideration is sincerely appreciated.

Thank you to everyone working on this important improvement to this critical put poorly functioning intersection.

I have frequently traveled this intersection over the more than 30 years this area has been my home. The intersection has only gotten worse and more dangerous. To actually make it much better, we need to consider state of the art alternatives.

Having carefully reviewed the plans, it is appropriate to share the following conclusions:

The 8 Lane Traffic Signal Alternative appears both less efficient and less safe.

The Partial DLT Alternative appears the best, by far. It has many advantages, including:

- 1) the left-hand turn (the most dangerous turn cars can make) is safely displaced away from the main intersection.
- 2) the displaced left clearly handles more traffic as it DOUBLE LOADS the left hand turn lanes.
- 3) The plan shorten distances for pedestrian crossers. Making the intersections safer for pedestrians AND more efficient for traffic throughput.






INTRODUCTION

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District One, welcomes you to a public hearing for the US 41 at Bonita Beach Road (CR 865) Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study. The study limits are within the City of Bonita Springs, in southern Lee County.

This study evaluates potential capacity and safety improvements, as well as multi-modal features to address congestion and meet future demand. Addtional components under consideration include crosswalks with a pedestrian hybrid beacon, a new transit stop, and 12-foot wide shared-use paths at all intersection approaches. This hearing gives interested persons the opportunity to express their views about the proposed improvements at the intersection of US 41 and Bonita Beach Road (CR 865).

On display this evening are maps, display boards, and project related information. The project team is available to discuss the study and answer questions.

Spoken statements during the public testimony and written statements submitted at the hearing, emailed, submitted on the project website, or postmarked by April 5, 2024, will become part of the official hearing record.



ABOUT THE PROJECT

Both US 41 and Bonita Beach Road serve as critical corridors in facilitating regional and local traffic within Lee County, as well as designated emergency evacuation routes. The PD&E Study began in 2019, and throughout the study process, FDOT has looked at many different concepts. After environmental and engineering analyses, public and agency comments, and following the Alternatives Public Workshop held on April 4, 2023, the Partial Displaced Left Turn Alternative was selected as the preferred alternative. Following this public hearing, the location and design concept of the preferred alternative will be submitted to the FDOT Office of Environmental Management for review. At this time, FDOT's Adopted Five-Year Work Program does not yet include funding for future phases, such as final design. The Department anticipates completion of this PD&E Study by the fall of 2024.



PREFERRED ALTERNATIVE


The preferred alternative for the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection is a Partial Displaced Left Turn with the northeast quadrant roadway and enhancing the northwest quadrant roadway. The primary feature of a partial displaced left turn intersection is moving left turn movements on an approach to the other side of opposing traffic flow, known as a "crossover" movement. Crossover movements stop at Bonita Beach Road awaiting the green signal. There is no separate US 41 left turn signal phase.



PROPOSED TYPICAL SECTIONS - US 41


US 41 between crossover intersections includes: a 6-lane divided roadway, 11-foot wide travel lanes, separated left turn movements between opposing through and right turn movements, and 12-foot shared-use paths on both sides of the roadway.

Overview of Discussions

On July 21, 2021, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Project Manager, Patrick Bateman, P. E. and Kittelson and Associates Project Consultants Jack Freeman, P.E., PTOE, RSP1 and Sigal Carmenate met with business owners/managers in-person to discuss traffic and safety issues at the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection. An agenda and questions were developed to facilitate these discussions and business cards with contact information and the project website were shared with the business owners/managers.

The project team first met with the Papa John's restaurant manager on the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection's northwest corner. The project team continued to meet with nearby properties in the following order:

- 7-Eleven;
- Wendy's;
- Walgreens;
- Iguana Mia;
- Jiffy Lube;
- Hampton Inn; and
- Dr. Bohn of Bohn Chiropractic Clinic.

The project team shared the project timeline with the Walgreens manager, but was not able to get answers to the questions prepared for the Business Working Group. The project team attempted to speak with someone at the Aspen Dental in the study intersection's southwest corner, but the staff were having a meeting and were unable to speak with us. We were asked to call back at another time.

The following sections summarize key takeaways from the in-person discussions. The agenda and questions for the Business Working Group are included at the summary report's end.

Discussion Key Takeaways

Papa John's Restaurant

- The manager explained that the traffic is usually at it's worse during the winter/spring peak season, but that this year the traffic has remained at peak season levels.
- There is a lot of bicyclist and pedestrian activity around the business.
- There is particularly a lot of foot traffic at the business, and there are customers using bicycles and mopeds rented from the beach.
- An existing access issue is the quick right-turn into the Papa John's driveway so close to the US
 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection that could cause unexpected braking and congestion.
- One observation is the long wait time for pedestrians to cross the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection.
- Not a lot of transit activity is observed at the stop outside of the business on Bonita Beach Road.

7-Eleven

- During the peak season, it can be difficult to get out of the parking lot area.
- The bottleneck approaching Barefoot Beach (westbound on Bonita Beach Road) access sometimes backs up traffic to US 41.
- Sometimes there is an eastbound queue from I-75 to the 7-Eleven access.
- More crashes are observed during the peak season.
- Especially during the peak season, multiple panhandlers are observed in the street at the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection.
- Very few customers are arriving by biking or walking; most customers drive and park.

Wendy's

- No access issues observed other than a recurring pothole at the entrance driveway.
- Some workers and customers are arriving by foot and crossing the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection.
- Freight deliveries use the back road (Beaumont Road) to Wendy's and experience some difficulty parking.
- There is a lot of transit activity on the stop outside of Wendy's on US 41.

Iguana Mia

- The Iguana Mia Restaurant is located in the Springs Plaza shopping plaza on the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection's southeast corner. It can be difficult to navigate to the restaurant from the current access points.
- The manager has observed crashes at the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection.
- Congestion sometimes backs up on Bonita Beach Road to Arroyal Road.
- There are not a lot of workers or customers using transit.
- Some employees bike to work and have issues seeing at nighttime.
- The Aldi store in the shopping plaza is being renovated.


Jiffy Lube

- Traffic is very heavy during the peak season and has remained heavy during the off-peak season this year.
- US 41 is typically busy because of all the businesses along it.
- Many people have moved from outside the state to the Bonita Springs area during the pandemic.
- There was a recent crash involving four cars at the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection.

Hampton Inn

- Traffic still seems like peak season traffic and hotel occupancy is higher than usual for this time of year (at about 70% compared the usual 50%). The hotel manager also noted most weekends in July 2021 to be sold-out.
- The Hampton Inn is not on US 41 nor Bonita Beach Road frontage. Some drivers are not turning at the signed unsignalized Crown Lake Blvd intersection to get into the hotel property and can

feel dangerous making a U-turn at US 41 and Bonita Beach Road to get to the hotel.





- The closed Perkins restaurant may become a Mexican restaurant.
- The hotel manager, Bryant Olson, is also President of the Arroyal Mall Property Owners Association. We offered to make a project presentation at an upcoming association meeting.
- The neighboring chiropractor, Dr. Bohn, is the Vice President of Arroyal Mall Property Owners Association.

Dr. Bohn of Bohn Chiropractic Clinic

We spoke to Dr. Bohn separate of the Bonita Springs July 21st visit by phone on August 19th. This is a summary of the discussion.

- Dr. Bohn had heard about other traffic improvement options in the past like a flyover and other traffic diversions. He described the flyover option as "may be a bit much".
- The new connection of Imperial River to Arroyal Road was discussed, as was the east-west connection from Livingston Road to US 41 that is intended to divert traffic from Bonita Beach Road.
- Dr. Bohn noted that the level of congestion and traffic volume on Bonita Beach Road turning into the clinic is high during season.
- Does not believe the area is set up well for pedestrian and bicycle travel.
- As the Vice President of the Arroyal Mall Property Owners Association, Dr. Bohn thinks that
 property owners would be interested to hear more about the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road
 PD&E Study.

Agenda Item #3 - Public Comments on Items on the Agenda

There were no public comments on items on the agenda.

Agenda Item #4 - *Approval of May 23, 2023 Meeting Minutes

Ms. Teresa Lewis made the motion to approve the May 23, 2023 Meeting Minutes. Mr. Lee Waller seconded the motion. There were no objections, and the motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #5 - Presentation on the US 41 at Bonita Beach Road PD&E Study

Mr. Patrick Bateman with FDOT presented this agenda item on the US 41 at Bonita Beach Road PD&E Study. He provided a Power Point presentation that can be viewed at the following link: US 41 at Bonita Beach Road Study Mr. Bateman pointed out that Bonita Beach Road is along the SUN Trail Network and therefore the study is recommending shared used paths on both sides of this roadway within the project limits. He also reported that this was consistent with FDOT's recent policy for substitution of bike lanes with shared used paths in urban situations where posted speed limits are 40 or 45 mph. He reported that the study was going to be completed early next year and that design, right of way, and construction were not yet funded. To a question from Mr. Carl Karakos on cost benefit comparison for the two options, Mr. Bateman replied that an Intersection Control Evaluation was conducted that compared safety, operational cost over the life of the intersection, and capital costs for both options. The cost to build the Displaced Left Turn was higher than building an expanded traffic signal but there were far greater safety benefits associated with the Displaced Left Turn that in the long term the economic benefits resulting from reduction of traffic crashes from the Displaced Left Turn trumped the economic benefits of the Expanded Traffic Signal Option. And it is the same argument why a roundabout would always be a winner vs a traffic signal. To a question from Chair Burden, Mr. Bateman replied that ramps in the transition area would direct cyclists from bike lanes to the shared used paths and that traffic signals around the intersection would determine the locations of those transition points and ramps. To another question he replied that the MUTCD does not allow green colored pavement in crosswalks and that it is only allowed on bike lanes to his knowledge, but he would look into it.

Agenda Item #6 - Presentation on the SR 31 and SR 78/Bayshore Road Projects

Mr. Bateman presented slides of the improvements proposed for the SR 31 PD&E and SR 78/Bayshore Road Capacity Study. His presentation can be found at the following link: SR 31 and SR 78/Bayshore Road Projects. To a question from Chair Burden, he replied that all proposed developments along SR 31 within Lee County were taken into account during the PD&E Study for both SR 31 segments including the 71 acre Mike Greenwell property which was recently rezoned as commercial. He stated that both SR 31 and SR 78 within the project limits were along the SUN Trail Network and therefore the study recommends shared use paths on both roadways.

Agenda Item #7 - Midtown Streetscaping Master Planning Update

Mr. Carl Karakos introduced Mr. Steve Neff with AIM Engineering, the City's consultant on the project. Mr. Neff provided an update using the map, typical sections, and street plans attached to this item in the agenda packet as reference. These attachments are posted to the MPO website. Mr. Neff explained each typical section. A context sensitive approach was used to design the streetscape with a target speed of 25 mph or lower for all streets. The consultant in concert with staff had decided to allocate more space to pedestrians and provide street parking on one side following the feedback from the March BPCC meeting. Ms. Teresa Lewis commented that a Fort Myers Council member objected to on-street parking on Jackson Street at a Fort Myers Council workshop, and she advocated for protected bike lanes instead. Mr. Neff expressed caution as that may work against slowing vehicular speed in that corridor. To a comment by Ms. Lewis that there were some questions raised regarding on street parking in the same workshop, Mr. Neff replied that the City Manager made a commitment at the end of that workshop to continue to look at on street parking in the midtown streets.

Agenda Item #8 - LeeTran Presentation on Mobility on Demand

Ms. Clarissa Marino Diaz with LeeTran presented this agenda item on LeeTran's Mobility on Demand services. She provided a Power Point presentation that can be viewed at the following link: <u>LeeTran Mobility-on-Demand</u>. To a question from one of the committee members, Ms. Dawn Huff replied that

the Transit Development Plan also recommends Mobility on Demand for North Fort Myers and the City of Cape Coral.

Mr. Gogoi presented the Lee MPO updates. He reported that he modified the SUN Trail Priority Table by adding the ped overpass to the scope of the JYLP Enhancement project. LCDOT would maintain the bridge if it is built but would not be responsible for funding the bridge construction. He also reported on a project to install lidar sensors at the Wilson Pigott bridge. On January 5, 2023, those listed above conducted a US 41 and Bonita Beach Road PD&E Study project update meeting at the Cape Coral Public Works Building. We also had roll plots of the two build alternatives containing the initial comparative evaluation matrix provided in the presentation. In addition to providing an overall project update, we also discussed the plan to conduct the Alternatives Public Workshop on April 4th at the Bonita Springs Recreation Center Gymnasium.

These meeting notes are to record the discussions from this meeting.

DISCUSSIONS/ACTION ITEMS

- We discussed we would be updating the traffic analysis for more current data. They asked if the traffic volumes had changed due to the impacts of Hurricane Ian. We noted there are several permanent count stations in this intersection where we can easily check this.
- We discussed the updated traffic analysis would consider the southern quadrant roadway system the City previously studied. Mr. Scott said the City has more favorably considered the northern quadrant roadway system over the southern. We noted that if the southern quadrant roadways are built, this would be the City's responsibility.
- In discussing the design alternatives, we said we are including 12-ft share use paths on both roadway sides. We are evaluating reducing the shared use path widths on Bonita Beach Road to 10-ft to reduce R/W impacts. Mr. Gogoi asked about plans for these shared use paths once out of the intersection's area and we said they would need to be picked up in future projects.
- We discussed the proposed Coastal Loop Trail and it is still in the conceptual stages and is not funded. Lee County's focus is on the Sun Trail.
- For the 8 Lane Alternative, it was discussed this extends from the Beaumont Road/US 41 intersection to the Imperial River bridge.

The City of Bonita Springs coordination meeting was conducted via Microsoft Teams on August 30, 2021. The meeting attendees are listed above, and the discussions are summarized below.

DISCUSSIONS

Jack Freeman opened the meeting by providing an overview of the July 21st FDOT/KAI visit to Bonita Springs. He noted we visited with six businesses in the intersection's immediate area and received supportive comments that improvement to the intersection is needed. We generally met with either the owner or manager and did not get into discussion of potential improvement alternatives. We also said we conducted a follow-up discussion with Dr. Bohn on August 19th and we were still trying to contact Aspen Dental.

Mr. Feeney restated the City's position of no flyover. He said we may want to reach out to Springs Plaza shopping center in the intersection's southeast corner and noted the shopping center has a new owner. He also noted for the Center of Bonita Springs we should contact Matt Ryan and for Beach Storage we should contact Jim Magnus. Mr. Feeney said he would provide contact information for all these (received on August 31st). We noted to him we have had several discussions with Jim Magnus and his brother.

Quadrant Roadway

We discussed the quadrant roadway and the City's plan regarding this roadway network. Mr. Feeney said the City's Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) has contained \$9M to \$10M for the Quadrant Roadway Plan for about the past 4 years. They have spent some of these funds to conduct this PD&E study and to purchase a parcel for the NE quadrant roadway just north of Advance Auto. Mr. Feeney also said the City Council will consider purchasing property in the NW quadrant roadway just north of the Center

of Bonita Springs during a September City Council meeting. He also said City Council will consider rolling the unspent CIP funds into the next fiscal year during their September 2021 budget meetings.

Other Discussions

Mr. Oujevolk said FDOT has had some project related discussions with Lee County. He said the Lee County executive management has said they will support the study results. He also noted there has been a change in the Lee County project manager for this project and FDOT will be getting with this person to discuss the project.

We discussed to need to focus on final design funding as it is important for Planning Consistency and advancing the project.

FDOT said we would share the concepts and traffic analysis with the City prior to the Alternatives Public Meeting.

Daniel and Travis,

I just completed the meeting with FDOT, City of Bonita Springs and RK&K. There are a couple of things to note from this discussion.

- 1. The 2 lane LT option is off the table. The City did not care for a potential 1000-ft+ queue in the 2050 design year and the potential impact this could have to the BBR LT movement. The PER and PTAR need to be prepared based on the 3 lane LT option.
- 2. As noted below, RK&K will be sending us an updated CADD file for the NW Quadrant Roadway. Joe Baan noted in the discussion they have shifted the driveway to shopping center's NW corner further to the east and felt if we matched this our exiting truck traffic would be better. The City and RK&K also said they would talk to the Center of Bonita Springs about directing the semi-trucks out of the shopping center to the Windsor Road exit. They also said the shopping center folks said they want the truck design to be based on a WB-67. Joe also suggested we have a truck apron in the median or even a painted separator to accommodate exiting truck traffic if the shopping center folks insist on big trucks need to access from this driveway. They were generally negative on having trucks track over the curb and shared use path.
- 3. Now to the main point of the meeting, the potential business impacts to Angler's Paradise. What I have thought to be a road in the site plan is an earth berm. The City did not see an issue with impacting the berm. It was suggested that along the retention pond we have a toe wall to maintain the ponds slope at the back of sidewalk. This should not be an issue.

FDOT went over the project and its purpose and need, establishing the need for capacity improvements, safety, and multimodal accommodations. FDOT also discussed updated procedures since the original study in 2014, that includes establishment of FDOT's Planning Studio, and working with locals to establish visions for corridors and incorporate local government plans. This segued into the next agenda

item, where FDOT discussed with city staff and councilmembers the plans and studies that have also been produced for this corridor.

Analysis was established to be based on future in-season traffic. Ideas for intersection layouts that the project team will be evaluating were shared with each councilmember. These included both an at-grade and a grade-separated configuration. The at-grade intersection discussed was a continuous flow intersection (CFI), also known as a displaced left turn intersection (DLT). Example diagrams were shown, as well as real world examples, and clips from educational videos. The project team noted FDOT recently completed a CFI at the intersection of SR 82 and Daniels Parkway/Gunnery Road in Lee County. The grade-separated configuration shown was a single point urban interchange (SPUI). FDOT noted that several exist in Lee and Collier County, and showed an example of one at Golden Gate Parkway and Airport Pulling Road in Collier County. Advantages and disadvantages of each were discussed, with focus on signal phasing, access, and pedestrian accommodations. FDOT noted the CFI would need at least the NW portion of the city's quadrant plan to function well.

Prior government coordination was discussed with each councilmember, establishing that the Department had recently met with City of Bonita Springs staff and Lee County staff separately. Bonita Springs staff had indicated in this prior meeting a desire to have these one-on-one councilmember meetings. Lee County staff was not ready for these meetings with their Board of County Commissioners, and wanted to wait until the team had alternatives laid at for the specific study intersection. FDOT will provide a project status update to the Board at the next Lee County MPO Board meeting, scheduled for May 14th. The project team went over next steps for the study. After the update to the Board, the team will for a Business Working Group, made up of a sampling of businesses around the intersection, to establish their needs and wants from the project. FDOT anticipates this meeting to occur in June. The alternatives public workshop was discussed as not to occur until December at the earliest. The one-on-one meetings with Lee County Commissioners would occur sometime prior to the workshop.

After introductions, the Department started by going of a brief description of the base conditions, noting the City's northwest quadrant roadway would be built and considered an existing condition, while the northeast would be evaluated by the project team. The Department went over the use of Synchro and Vissim for traffic analysis.

The City talked about their northwest roadway and stated they secured property. They would be working on the design shortly. They stated the placement of the realigned roadway shown in the Department concepts is too far north and would impact proposed development. The City said not to shift so far north or connect farther east, as indicated by the red circle on the concept, which indicates a buffer around an eagle's nest.

The Department asked if a signal would be installed at Bonita Beach Road and Windsor as part of the quadrant roadway project. The City does not know yet. The City also indicated the placement of the City's new road would be in the general location of the purple linework shown on the concepts.

The Department went over concerns raised by the County about details of the concepts, including turns/driveways within right turn bypass lanes, sideroad connections at the crossover signals, channelizing left turns to prevent attempted through movements from sideroads, and signal location south of Bonita Beach Road.

There was discussion about extending the third eastbound lane farther east to drop somewhere in the vicinity of City Hall. The City brought up access management concerns regarding the post office adjacent

to City Hall. The Department will avoid any direct impacts to post office property to avoid elevating the class of action for the project.

There were further discussions about the County's thoughts. The Department stated the County expressed concerns with both build concepts due to significant impacts. The City expressed concerns with the realignment of the northwest road and placement of the northeast road, with emphasis on bridge sightlines and potential impacts to development in the northeast. The City reiterated their desire for there to be no grade separation. The Department reiterated the need to build consensus on the project.

After the meeting, the City provided a site plan for the northwest development that would be impacted by the Department's realignment of the City's quadrant road.

Jack Freeman provided a brief project overview discussing the project's purpose and need is based upon the existing intersection's ability to meet traffic demand especially during the winter peak season. Safety for all users is also a part of the project's purpose and need.

2. Overlapping Planning Studies

The group discussed the quadrant roadway plan and visioning study, both prepared by the City. The City noted the vision plan has been adopted into the City's Comprehensive Plan. One of the plan's elements is to provide access to businesses. The City also said they have a settlement agreement with the property owner of the northwest quadrant where quadrant roadway would cross and are working on an alignment. The group discussed biking in Bonita Springs. The City noted they have both recreational riders and those biking to work or a bus stop. There are bike social groups in various developments (Bonita Bay and Pelican Landing bike clubs were noted) who are daily riders. While some groups can be 50 to 100 riders typically these are about 20 riders. The City is trying to expand the bicycle infrastructure throughout the City. They noted the intersection is an important location as Bonita Beach Road provides access to the beach. FDOT requested the City provide a list of communities with bicycle or pedestrian/walking groups and any pedestrian and bicycle counts they have which are near the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection.

The group also discussed there is one transit route provided by LeeTran along US 41 extending into Collier County. The City is not aware of any LeeTran plans to expand bus service in Bonita Springs. The City also noted the trolley service at the City of Ft. Myers Beach

3. Traffic analysis discussion

a. Existing conditions - peak season impacts

The project team discussed traffic counts were conducted in April 2019 and used for this study. These show growth since conducting counts for the previous 2014 PD&E study. It was noted the pre-COVID annual average daily traffic on US 41 north of Bonita Beach Road is 53,000 and south of Bonita Beach Road is 39,000. The Bonita Beach Road volumes are about 30,000 vehicles per day both east and west of US 41. It was noted the eastbound to northbound and southbound to eastbound left turn movements are the intersection's critical movements. The US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection is currently operating at LOS F. Also, the February/March peak season volumes can average as much as 20% higher than the annual average volumes noted above.

b. Future traffic volumes and no-build operations

Future traffic projections have been developed and are showing growth on all intersection legs. The 2045 projected average daily traffic on US 41 north of Bonita Beach Road is 78,000 and south of Bonita Beach Road is 60,000. The Bonita Beach Road projected 2045 volumes are about 39,000 vehicles per day both east and west of US 41. The estimated 2045 turning movement volumes have been developed and preliminary analysis conducted to determine volume to capacity (v/c) ratios. When these ratios are >1.0 they are indicating the intersection is over capacity. In 2045, the US 41 and Bonita Beach Road existing intersection is anticipated to have a v/c ratio of 1.6.

c. Discussion of improving existing intersection by simple widening.

The project team has considered the intersection's operation with making the eastbound to northbound and southbound to eastbound left turn movements as three lanes. In doing this the v/c ratio improves to 1.5 but still well over capacity.

4. Open discussion of existing issues and potential ways accommodating future traffic volumes.

The City was clear they do not support grade separation of this intersection and prefer an atgrade solution.

5. Initial alternatives analysis

a. Displaced Left Turn with quadrant roadway

The project team explained the displaced left turn (DLT) intersection would have the US 41 left turns cross over the opposing through movements in advance of the Bonita Beach Road intersection. This allows the northbound and southbound through and left turn movements to

occur simultaneously under one signal phase. The crossover locations would be signalized. The eastbound to northbound left turn from Bonita Beach Road would be considered to be 3 lanes to accommodate the approximate 1000 vehicles per hour design year left turn volume. The City's proposed quadrant roadways in the northeast and northeast quadrants will supplement and enhance the DLTs operation during the peak season by accommodating some of the left turning traffic.

b. Grade Separation

The project team also explained a single point urban diamond interchange is the second alternative being evaluated for this intersection location.

We noted both alternatives have v/c ratios about 1.0 in the 2045 design year. As the alternatives analysis progresses, more detailed operations analysis will be conducted and these alternatives will be refined.

FDOT said the PD&E study is following the federal NEPA process and all viable alternatives are initially considered for analysis, including both grade-separated and at-grade alternatives, and how pre-determination, or pre-selection of the preferred alternative, must be avoided. FDOT also noted that when evaluating both alternatives, a holistic analysis of a variety of criteria, including but not limited to vehicular operations, pedestrian and bicycle needs, safety for all users, access, transit and community vision would be considered.

The City noted that they see this intersection and Bonita Beach Road being a "gateway to the gulf". The City has funded two studies toward becoming more multimodal. As properties are being redeveloped, they are looking for better connectivity especially from a multimodal perspective. FDOT said we will keep the communication open to accommodate the City's future vision.

6. Proposed Business Working Group

The project team discussed forming a Business Working Group to meet with a small group of business owners in the intersection's immediate vicinity. The City is supportive of this concept. They noted Publix and the Magnus brothers as potential members. We said the project team just met with the Magnus brothers. The Business Working Group meeting(s) will be scheduled after the project team meets individually with the City Council members and the Lee County Commissioners.

7. Input for upcoming Bonita Springs City Council Members' meetings

The project team requested to meet with each City Council member individually and requested feedback from the County staff on items that may be of interest to their elected officials. The City suggested having a generic sketch of how a DLT works would be helpful. The City also offered to assist with scheduling these meetings.

Other discussion topics

The City said their residents want the City's roadways landscaped similar to those in Collier County. They are working toward this and are currently putting power underground in some locations.

The project team discussed the public meeting and hearing scheduling and, given the new hybrid meeting format that FDOT is using, asked if these meetings still needed to be scheduled within peak season or if there was some flexibility. The City noted they have many older residents who have difficulty with virtual meetings. However, they have been doing virtual meetings themselves. They said if we are looking at the fall for a meeting, do early November. We discussed the possibility of doing the public meeting in November but conduct the public hearing during peak season. The project team also discussed meeting with City staff prior to the public meeting/workshop to preview the presentation.

FDOT asked about considering a pedestrian/bicycle overpass bridge for SunTrail over US 41. The City said the overpasses are difficult to provide room to getting up and down and they were generally negative on the suggestion. The project team also asked about the use of digital message signs to provide traveler information along either US 41 or Bonita Beach Road. The City was not interested in these signs.

FDOT asked if the City has a vision for US 41. The City said are trying to change their code to have less auto centric development in general. They are also working on their architectural standards so that new developments, especially big box stores, better blend with the existing nearby residential development.

DISCUSSIONS

The following agenda items were discussed.

1. Project overview and purpose and need

Jack Freeman provided a brief project overview discussing the project's purpose and need is based upon the existing intersection's ability to meet traffic demand especially during the winter peak season. Safety for all users is also a part of the project's purpose and need.

The County staff noted that they preferred grade separation for the intersection improvement. The County said emergency evacuation is an issue for evacuating beachside, as this is a primary route to I-75.

2. Overlapping Planning Studies

The project team discussed the City conducted quadrant roadway plan and the City's Visioning Study. We also discussed the plan for the SunTrail shared use path to extend along Bonita Beach Road thru the intersection. We also noted the project team has the CAD files from the Bonita Beach Road 6 lane widening final design and are using this information in our concept design. The County did not know of other studies we should consider.

The project team discussed there is one transit route provided by LeeTran along US 41 extending into Collier County. The County is not aware of any LeeTran plans to expand bus service in Bonita Springs. They said transit usually does not have any impact on intersection operations in this area.

The County did not see landscaping as an issue or special focus for this location.

3. Traffic analysis discussion

a. Existing conditions - peak season impacts

These show growth since conducting counts for the previous 2014 PD&E study. It was noted the pre-COVID annual average daily traffic on US 41 north of Bonita Beach Road is 53,000. It was discussed the eastbound to northbound and southbound to eastbound left turn movements are the intersection's critical movements. The US 41 and Bonita Beach Road intersection is currently operating at LOS F. Also, the February/March peak season volumes can average as much as 20% higher than the annual average volumes noted above. The County said they receive lots of complaints regarding delay at the intersection and it is not any particular direction or movement. They said, "traffic in all directions is complaining." FDOT asked is adjacent intersections were an issue with the congestion and the County said they were not. The County noted US 41 is a commuter road and Bonita Beach Road is access to the beach.

b. Future traffic volumes and no-build operations

Future traffic projections have been developed and are showing growth on all intersection legs. The 2045 projected average daily traffic on US 41 north of Bonita Beach Road is 78,000. The estimated 2045 turning movement volumes have been developed and preliminary analysis has been conducted showing the intersection will be well over capacity in the 2045 design year.

c. Discussion of improving existing intersection by simple widening.

The project team has considered the intersection's operation with making the eastbound to northbound and southbound to eastbound left turn movements as three lanes. In doing this, the intersection is still well over capacity in the 2045 design year.

4. Open discussion of existing issues and potential ways accommodating future traffic volumes.

The County noted the pedestrian and bicycle volume thru the intersection to be significant. They said when pedestrian countdown signals are activated for either pedestrians or bicycles, it "kills" signal timing as it kicks the signal out of coordination. The future volumes with continued pedestrian and bicycle traffic growth will be an issue. The County said the intersection's signal video detection may be able to provide pedestrian and bicycle volume counts. (NOTE: This comment has been checked with the Lee County DOT Traffic Engineering Staff and they said the intersection does not have this capability.) The group discussed the potential of taking the pedestrian and bicycle traffic out of the intersection and crossing US 41 with a pedestrian hybrid beacon at an alternate location. The County said they want the intersection option which operates the best.

5. Initial alternatives analysis

a. Displaced Left Turn with quadrant roadway

The project team explained the displaced left turn (DLT) intersection would have the US 41 left turns cross over the opposing through movements in advance of the Bonita Beach Road

intersection. This allows the northbound and southbound through and left turn movements to occur simultaneously under one signal phase. The crossover locations would be signalized. This is similar to the recently installed DLT at Daniels Parkway and Immokalee Road. The eastbound to northbound left turn from Bonita Beach Road would be considered to be 3 lanes to accommodate the high design year left turn volume. The proposed quadrant roadways in the northeast and northeast quadrants will supplement and enhance the DLTs operation during the peak season by accommodating some of the left turning traffic. The County expressed concern about the DLT relying too heavily on the quadrant roadway system for proper operation.

b. Grade Separation

The project team also explained a single point urban diamond interchange is the second alternative being evaluated for this intersection location.

The project team noted the preliminary operations analysis shows both alternatives to operate near capacity in the 2045 design year. As the alternatives analysis progresses, more detailed traffic operations analysis will be conducted and these alternatives will be refined.

FDOT noted an interchange does not handle pedestrians and bicyclists as well as an at-grade alternative. The County acknowledged the potential for a high volume of pedestrians and bicyclists on Bonita Beach Road. FDOT noted the need to include a variety of data in the alternative's analysis, including pedestrians and bicyclists, safety, and access in addition to vehicle operations prior to taking the alternatives to a public meeting. FDOT noted the project team will be preparing an alternatives matrix showing construction and right-of-way costs, which will be on display at the alternatives public meeting. The project team will also show pedestrians and bicyclists in the matrix.

6. Proposed Business Working Group

The project team said we are planning to form a Business Working Group to meet with a small group of business owners in the intersection's immediate vicinity. The Business Working Group meeting(s) will be scheduled after we meet with the Bonita Springs City Council members and the Lee County Commissioners. The County did not have any comments regarding these meetings.

7. Input for upcoming Lee County Commissioners' meetings

We said the project team is planning to meet with each Lee County Commissioner individually. We asked if there is something, the project team needs to be aware of in preparation for these meetings. The County said FDOT may want to defer these individual meetings until there are more study details available. The County requested any preliminary concept plans to show the County Commissioners, when available. FDOT said these concepts would be ready in early fall. They also suggested a brief project discussion during a commission meeting or MPO meeting.

A coordination meeting with RK&K (the City of Bonita Springs' design consultant for the NW quadrant roadway connection Windsor Road at Bonita Beach Road to US 41) was held to discuss the design status of the roadway and the proposed stormwater management. In attendance were: Patrick Bateman (FDOT), Jack Freeman (Kittelson), Travis Hills (Kittelson), Joseph Baan (RK&K), and Renato Chuw (Inwood). A summary of the meeting discussion is below:

- The meeting started with introducing the project team and a brief overview of the project. Inwood
 indicated FDOT District One is conducting a PD&E study for the intersection of US 41 and Bonita Beach
 Road to evaluate intersection improvement alternatives. Kittelson is the prime consultant for the PD&E
 study, and Inwood is assisting in the drainage evaluation.
- This meeting aimed to inquire about the status of the City's quadrant roadway design project connecting Bonita Beach Road to US 41 via Windsor Road and behind the Center of Bonita Springs Plaza.
- RK&K mentioned that the design is moving towards 60% completion, with plans submitted to the City in October 2023. A pre application meeting with SFWMD will be held during the week of August 7 11 to discuss the City's project and permit requirements.
- Kittelson indicated that 30% design CADD files by RK&K were provided on March 10, 2023. Kittelson
 requested if updated design files for the roadway alignment can be provided to the PD&E study team. A
 request will be sent to RK&K.
- RK&K indicated that a CSI (Continuous Flow intersection) is proposed at Bonita Beach Road and Windsor Road intersection. This was shown in 30% plans of May 2023. RK&K mentioned that the design CADD files provided to Kittelson early in the year were likely 15% design-level files.
- Kittelson asked if the horizontal alignment of the roadway behind the Publix stayed the same as what was
 provided to the team earlier of has it moved. RK&K indicated that the alignment has not significantly
 changed at that location.
- The roadway design by the Windsor Road and Bonita Beach Road intersection was updated to minimize impacts to the existing Windsor Road swale. The goal is to maintain the swale's drainage pattern. Compensatory treatment is proposed, with minor improvements at the intersection being untreated to the existing swale. Instead, the remnant parcel will collect and treat the existing Windsor Road pavement in the proposed pond. Inwood indicated some information was obtained for the existing swale during the permit research and will share that with RK&K.

- The City is designing the pond in the remnant parcel to treat and attenuate the runoff for the NW quadrant roadway from the Bonita Beach Road intersection to just west of Tuffy Auto Center at the US 41 and NW quadrant roadway's NW corner.
- RK&K indicated that they will maximize the pond usage in the remnant parcel due to having to meet several drainage criteria and constraints, such as OFW (Imperial River), pre vs. post attenuation, and nutrient loading. The design intent is for the pond to be a dry pond to meet the nutrient loading requirements. Underdrains underneath the pond bottom are proposed to draw down the water table and maximize the storage capacity in the pond. RK&K indicated the design of the pond is still ongoing and that more design information will be available in October when plans are submitted. It was suggested to reconvene in the future to get an update on the design of the roadway and the pond.
- The PD&E study proposes to add more impervious to the quadrant roadway as it ties to US 41 and beginning at the curve alignment. RK&K indicated that it does not think the pond will have extra capacity for the additional improvements to the roadway per the study. However, RK&K indicated that if the FDOT was able to convince SFWMD that attenuation was not required when direct discharging to the tidal Imperial River, some additional capacity might be available. A possible alternative discussed for the study is to evaluate if the Tuffy Auto Center parcel at US 41's NW corner and the NW quadrant roadway would be a viable pond site location for the FDOT project since the roadway improvements will impact the parcel. Inwood indicated that would be a possibility and could be investigated further.
- RK&K indicated that a segment of the proposed roadway is a rural-type typical section to provide cost savings to the City by implementing a roadside swale for drainage conveyance instead of a close drainage system. Kittelson mentioned the PD&E study initial concept shows the roadway with curb and gutter, noting that more room will be available to expand the pond.
- RK&K mentioned their current design shows two accesses to the Center of Bonita Springs Plaza (Old Time Pottery), and that access from the new roadway to the plaza should be preserved with the PD&E concept.
 The proposed accesses have not yet been discussed with the shopping center.

Action Items

- 1. RK&K to provide latest design CADD files for the quadrant roadway
- 2. Inwood to share permit information for the existing Windsor Swale and Bonita Beach Road

The City of Bonita Springs coordination meeting was conducted at the FDOT District One office on January 29, 2020. The meeting attendees are listed above, and the discussions are summarized below.

DISCUSSIONS

City of Bonita Springs Information

- Councilman Forbes will serve as the City's liaison between City Council and FDOT.
- Currently there are only five City Council members of the seven-member City Council with two seats available. Election is scheduled on March 16, 2020 and there should be a full City Council by the end of March 2020.
- Mr. Feeney said the City's Comprehensive Plan has been amended to include the Quadrant Roadway plan. There was a lawsuit regarding the northwest quadrant roadway. This has been settled and the Comprehensive Plan is in full effect.
- Due to the high left turn volumes at the west and north approaches, the quadrant plan focuses on the northern quadrant roadway system. The City purchased land in the northeast quadrant to facilitate the quadrant roadway, as settled by the lawsuit.

PD&E Study Discussion

- Mr. Feeney questioned whether this PD&E Study would be "laser focused" on doing an interchange improvement at US 41 and Bonita Beach Road.
- Ms. Marshall said the PD&E Study will be following the NEPA process and as such all alternatives
 need to be considered. The study will initially do a high-level interchange evaluation with other atgrade alternatives. She noted the City to be a major partner and FDOT intends to communicate

with City Staff and City Council. Mr. Feeney noted Lee County may feel an interchange is the best solution, but the City Council wants an at-grade solution.

- Ms. Marshall said FDOT will consider the City's Visionary Study during the PD&E Study and methods to integrate the intersection improvement into the community.
- FDOT cautioned when conducting NEPA documentation any "predetermination" of the
 preferred alternative should be avoided. It was noted that if the FDOT Office of Environmental
 Management concludes that "predetermination" has occured, it may result in reimbursement
 of federal funds.
- FDOT will conduct both an Alternatives Public Meeting and a Public Hearing during the project. The meetings will be conducted during peak season. Mr. Feeney suggested FDOT provide City Council a presentation before the Alternatives Public Meeting and Public Hearing to invite the City Council and public to attend. FDOT noted that no graphics except a meeting announcement would be provided at the City Council presentations prior to the Alternatives Public Meeting and Public Hearing, so as not to open public comment prior to the prescribed meeting/hearing timeframes.
- Councilman Forbes and Mr. Feeney suggested potential public meeting/hearing locations to be Fire Station #4 or the Presbyterian Church. The church can accommodate up to 1600 people and is located on Bonita Beach Road.
- FDOT asked about future City of Bonita Springs financial support for the intersection improvement. Mr. Feeney noted the City's previous plan was to budget \$9M for the quadrant roadway plan. They have spent about \$1M for the PD&E Study and \$1M for the parcel in the northeast quadrant. The City plans to revisit future available project funding.
- We discussed communication with Lee County. It was decided to start with separate coordination meetings and to have joint meetings, when appropriate.

Meeting Notes:

Old 41 PD&E Study:

- Discussion on Cordova at Spanish Wells
 - At the meeting with Spanish Wells, FDOT explained the need/reasoning for a bulb out, but also let them know that there wouldn't be one at their entrance. They also went through the alternatives, including suggestions from the community. Ended on a positive note with the community
 - The current potential locations for the bulb out (Constitution Plaza and Bonita Commerce Center) were discussed. Property owner coordination is ongoing.
- FDOT provided an update on the access for Bonita Beach Road
 - o We are using the City of Bonita Springs' (COBS) Master Plan to guide our design
 - New signals at Mediterra and Cordova entrances are proposed
 - Quadrant roadway to alleviate pressure on BBR at Old 41 (gives access back to Industrial Road across Old 41)
 - Recommending left turn late into Bonita Plaza, but not a full median opening due to safety issues with full median opening 600' from Bonita Beach Rd and within the northbound queues
 - Left turn out of Bonita Plaza is allowed today.
 - In the proposed condition traffic wishing to make a left turn out of Bonita Plaza would have to make a right turn onto southbound Old 41 and travel 600' to the proposed signal at the quadrant roadway where they could make a U-turn to head northbound.
- Design and Construction funding was discussed
 - FDOT noted that Old 41 and the new quadrant roadway are off the state system so design and construction would most likely be managed the by local roadway owner, not the state. The COBS was surprised to hear this – FDOT and the COBS will discuss the funding plan further.
 - Design is in the current FDOT work program for FY27 and it is coded as being done by the local roadway owner, not FDOT.
 - o Completing the PD&E study allows future phases to be eligible for Federal funds.
 - FDOT did the PD&E Study to look at the corridor regionally and because it crossed the county line
- The COBS asked if the planned Old 41 improvements meet the need of the project without the quadrant roadway
 - No, the quadrant is part of the PD&E study recommended improvements. It was looked at in conjunction with everything else and not as a separate project.

Meeting with City of Bonita Springs Deputy Mayor Forbes 7/14/2023; 2:00pm

- The COBS wants the project to reflect what's in the comprehensive plans (MPO/Counties/City)
 - Concerned that communities south of COBS are being prioritized; what is in their comprehensive plan is at odds with the other agencies
 - COBS isn't interested in Old 41 improvements without the quadrant roadway (the road is included in the COBS comprehensive plan)

US 41 and Bonita Beach Road PD&E Study:

- FDOT provided an update on recent US 41 and Bonita Beach Road PD&E project activities.
 - o The Alternatives Public Meeting was conducted April 3rd and 4th.
 - o In public comments received, there were nine Partial DLT supporters, one interchange supporter and no 8-lane traffic signal supporters.
 - FDOT is moving forward with recommending the Partial DLT as the preferred alternative.
 - The project needs final design funding to move to the public hearing. FDOT has estimated the final design costs to be \$3.5 M.
- Design funding was discussed.
 - Lee County MPO's Don Scott said the MPO has \$2.8 M for design in FY 2026. The City of Bonita Springs said they have funds from the Bonita Beach Road Visioning which can be used for the \$700K to fully fund design. They will take this to City Council at an upcoming meeting.
 - o Mr. Scott said the MPO is working to do a STIP amendment in October 2023.



A new street less than a mile long could help alleviate congestion at U.S. 41 and Bonita Beach Road — if city officials make a deal with a landowner, according to city documents.

Traffic backups are common at the busy intersection, especially during the winter, and Bonita Springs officials have worked for years to solve the problem.

Prior city councils settled on using a "quadrant plan" to ease traffic jams. The plan calls for four roads skirting the intersection to give drivers options to bypass the signal.

"The quadrant plan for Bonita Beach Road and U.S. 41 is the most important transportation and infrastructure project that we have on the books," Councilor Jesse Purdon said.

City officials are finalizing deals with landowners around the shopping complex at the northwest corner of the intersection, home to a Publix, Bealls and other stores.

"We've been working to get this going for years," said Matt Feeney, assistant city manager.

If a deal is struck, the city would have permission to build an extension from Windsor Road that would wrap around the back of the buildings and connect to U.S. 41 at the north end of the mall, city documents state.

The city has nearly \$9.7 million set aside to fund the quadrant plan. That money would be used to buy the right-of-way land, design the road and ultimately build the new connection, Feeney said.

The road would let drivers that want to go to and from Bonita Beach from the north avoid the busy intersection. No recent studies have shown how these relief roads would affect current traffic.

One major step towards completing the quadrant plan was in 2017 when the city purchased land that could connect U.S. 41 to Arroyal Road to the northeast of the busy intersection, Feeney said.

Building relief roads was not the first attempt to fix traffic problems at Bonita Beach Road and U.S. 41. In 2014, councilors voted to reject a controversial Florida Department of Transportation study to build a flyover to ease traffic. A flyover is a bridge over ground level, similar to one at Summerlin Road at College Parkway.

Residents at the time said the structure would hurt businesses built around the intersection and take away from the charm of Bonita Springs.

"Years ago, I fought a flyover at the intersection and would stand ready to do that again," Purdon said.

A 2045 transportation plan from the Lee County Metropolitan Planning Organization — one of the most comprehensive traffic documents in the county — states that intersection improvements would be constructed from 2031 to 2035.

These improvements would be made to the intersection itself and led by the Florida Department of Transportation, Feeney said. The 2045 plan lists the FDOT intersection project as the 15 most important road improvement in Lee County.

The plan expects total improvements to cost \$22 million, although construction costs could climb in coming years. The plan does not call for a flyover, Purdon said.

"From my initial meetings with FDOT, the flyover is not the direction they are leaning in," he said. "A continuous intersection makes way more sense and is significantly more efficient as far as moving people and doing it safely."

The widening of Bonita Beach Road from U.S. 41 to Old 41 Road from four to six lanes — a 1.7 mile stretch of roadway — is also listed on the plan and is expected to cost \$27 million in 2020 construction funds.

The Florida Department of Transportation is looking for ways to address congestion issues and the projected increase in traffic at the intersection of U.S. 41 and Bonita Beach Road in Bonita Springs. The proposals, estimated to cost about \$40 million, are in the project development and environment study phase.


According to FDOT's existing levels of service, the majority of the intersection has a grade "F" during midday and evening peak periods, with some intersection queues reaching more than 1,100 feet. If the intersection remains as is, the queues of the intersection will be significantly longer by 2050 with the southern part of the intersection anticipated to reach a more than 2,400-foot queue during peak traffic.



There are two build alternatives being considered for this intersection—an enhanced traffic signal and a partial displaced left turn. Both alternatives will require Bonita Beach Road to be widened to six lanes. The first alternative, the enhanced traffic signal, involves widening U.S. 41 from six lanes to eight lanes from Foley Road to the southern end of the Imperial River bridge. At the intersection, the eastbound to northbound and the southbound to eastbound left-turn lanes will increase from two lanes to three lanes each. The westbound to northbound right turn would be increased from one lane to two. These improvements are estimated to reduce vehicle delay by 90 seconds, keeping the 2050 level of service mostly at an "F" grade.

The other alternative, creating a partially displaced left turn, would be similar to the Daniels Parkway and State Road 82 intersection. Left-turn movements onto Bonita Beach Road will be relocated to the other side of the opposing flow of traffic, creating a crossover movement. Approaching Bonita Beach Road will be concrete traffic separators to guide drivers through the crossover intersection. This improvement is projected to create a less than 90-second vehicle delay at the intersection and decrease the number of vehicle crashes.





The displaced left-turn alternative is the better solution, especially for pedestrians, said Jack Freeman, senior principal of traffic consultant company Kittleson & Associates.

"Both alternatives will have the 12-foot shared-use pass through the intersection on U.S. 41 and Bonita Beach Road, so they're equal in that regard," Freeman said. "It's the number of crossing lanes and the length of the crossing that's unprotected that the eight-lane signal has, whereas you have islands breaking up each of the movements and concrete traffic separates that will allow for that pedestrian refuge. It reduces the amount of conflict that a pedestrian would have when crossing 41."

FDOT anticipates the study, which was funded in 2020, to be completed by late 2024. The next steps—design, right of way acquisition and construction—are not funded yet. However, if funding is made available, completion could be finished in five years.





"It gets real busy," FDOT considers changes to Bonita Beach Road and 41

BONITA SPRINGS, Fla. — The Florida Department of Transportation says it's working to make the intersection of 41 and Bonita Beach Road safer.

Fox 4 spent time at the busy intersection and found cyclists, pedestrians and drivers who say the area needs changes - especially with fatal crashes that happened at the site in the past.

Luis Vasquez was one driver who pulled over to speak with us on his way home from First Call Pest Control where he works, but says the real pest is the traffic.

"It gets real busy. Just on this [Bonita Beach] road it's like 40 minutes of traffic just to go a few miles," he said.

FDOT says the changes to the road if passed could include a cross walk, a transit stop, and bike lanes.

"There are 12-ft shared use paths suggested as part of the PD&E preferred alternative; however, funding for Design (\$3.5M) is scheduled for fiscal year 2026. As of now, the Right-of-Way and Construction phases for the US 41 at Bonita Beach Road (CR 865) Project are unfunded. The preferred alternative is expected to ease congestion and enhance intersection safety for all road users," FDOT said in a statement to FOX4.

Skyler Vanorden is another who commutes through the Bonita Beach Road and 41 intersection before and after work.

[&]quot;Traffic is annoying," he said.

He says he would like to see the suggested bike lanes for cyclists and says their safety should be prioritized.

FDOT is looking for public <u>feedback</u> on what should be changed in this area.


