





- 20 MPH Speed Limit

- Open to two-way traffic



LEAST TERN NESTING









CURRENT WORK ACTIVITIES


- Installing buried island sheet pile
- Removing Traffic Railing
- Delivery and Prep of Materials
- Begin Temporary Road Construction
- Currently Awaiting Permit for in-water work



Anticipate roadway work to be completed by end of 2023


ON ISLAND SHEET PILE INSTALLATION





WHAT'S NEXT - ON ISLANDS


- Continue installing sheet pile along roadway
- Raise roadway approximately 2'
- Protect sides with "mattresses" (buried baskets filled with rock)
- Bury toe protection for upland walls
- Install new roadway drainage system
- Rebuild drainage ponds
- Rebuild approach slabs will require lane closures and traffic shifts.

WHAT'S NEXT - IN WATER


- Continue deep steel sheet pile walls
- Raise seawall elevation to 8'
- Reinforce toe of seawall
- Install additional rip rap protection
- Install larger and heavier protection at exposed areas between seawall and bridge abutments
- Replace MSE Wall with deep foundation wall
- Backfill Stone
- Form and Pour Seawall Caps

BEYOND ROADWAY

- Grey vs. Green Infrastructure
- Install native/resilient planting for natural hardening (mangroves, etc.)
- Coordinate Causeway Park Facilities



FUNDING

Total project cost is estimated at \$285 Million*

paid by the State of Florida

- FHWA anticipated to pay 80% of cost of permanent repairs
- Leaves 20% for State of Florida or Lee County to pay

+ \$5.6 Million*
by Lee County
for
Recreational
Amenities

FHWA scheduled to reimburse approximately \$239 Million* (reimbursement can take up to 4 years)

\$46.1 Million* by Lee County
