






# **Project Limits**



Along SR 683 / US 301 from US 41 to South of 10th Street, approximately one mile.











### The Purpose Of This Project Is:



#### Resurfacing, Restoration, and Rehabilitation (RRR)

- RRR is a type of roadwork project that extends the service life of existing roadways, improves multimodal capacity, and enhances safety.
- RRR projects are identified and prioritized based on projections of pavement condition. They are funded under FDOT's Pavement Resurfacing program.



### The Project Will:

FDOT

- Mill and resurface the existing roadway, including left and right turn lanes, median openings, and side street connections.
- Add improvements to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act.
- Upgrade pavement markings and signage.
- Upgrade pedestrian signals.
- Upgrade detectors at signalized intersections.
- And, at the request of the City of Sarasota, add a midblock crossing (pedestrian hybrid beacon) at South Payne Parkway.

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






### Roadway Design

#### Comparing the Existing Design To The Proposed



- Maintains the same number of lanes.
- Provides an ADA compliant 5' wide sidewalk.
- Signage will be upgraded to enhance driver alertness.
- New signage will also have superior reflectivity that improves nighttime visibility.



- Upgrades include a "Do Not Block" pavement message at Adams Lane to prevent drivers blocking access.
- Special emphasis markings will be provided at all signalized intersections, midblock crossings, and along the side streets to improve pedestrian safety.
- Green bicycle lanes across Ringling Boulevard to be replaced in-kind.





## Continued - Comparing the Existing Design To The Proposed



- One midblock crossing is proposed near South Payne Parkway, which will be signalized.
- The other existing midblock crossing near 6th Street will be upgraded with Rapid Flashing Beacons.
- Both types of enhancements are designed to significantly improve pedestrian safety by increasing driver awareness and encouraging vehicle yielding.
- Signalized crossings provide controlled access for pedestrians, ensuring vehicles stop when required, while rapid flashing beacons enhance visibility and alert drivers to pedestrian presence at the existing crossing.











# What To Expect During Construction



- Work will occur in phases to reduce the impact on the community.
- There will be no complete road closures and
- Temporary lane closures will occur during non-peak hours.



- Roadway paving will be performed at night to minimize inconvenience.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained throughout the duration of the project, with short-term detours.
- Access to businesses, residences, and bus stops will be maintained.
- Schedule: Construction is expected to start off-season in summer 2026.







# Long-term Benefits To The Community



- Improved pavement quality
- Increased resilience to weather events
- ADA compliant improvements
- Additional safety features

This Resurfacing, Restoration and Rehabilitation project is a valuable \$7.1 million investment in maintaining our infrastructure.
