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



Transportation Demand

Regional Traffic Patterns

- 31% Pass through (commuters)
- 15% Begin AND end in study area (internal)
- 56% Begin or end in study area (regional)
- 22% of North/South trips use DeSoto Bridge
- 99,500 Total daily bridge trips
- 22,000 Daily DeSoto commuter trips
- 75% of traffic exiting I-275 uses DeSoto Bridge

Design: Engineering plans are developed that detail exactly what will be built and determine if right-of way is needed.

Feedback is weighted equally:

- Community, environmental, engineering, cost, socio-cultural, and other study elements.
- Comments received at prior meetings, presentations, calls, and emails is being considered as part of this study.



What is an Alternative Manatee Corridor Evaluation (ACE) Study?



Planning Process

- Identify traffic demand and need.
- Analyze the location of potential improvements.
- Recommend alternatives for further analysis.

What is a PD&E Study?

Project Development and Environment (PD&E)

- After an initial planning study, this study is more detailed to further evaluate a potential transportation improvement project.
- Environmental and engineering process.
- Determines social, economic, natural, and physical environmental effects associated with a proposed transportation project.
- Follows prescriptive Federal process National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). This process ensures that no single constraint or element will be disproportionally affected.





History

6 Original Corridors were identified

2020

Community and Agency input identified the need for additional corridors to be studied

Evaluating 10 corridors to provide additional lanes over the Manatee River

* Not all corridors will be built or advanced for further evaluation.

- * The study is looking at where, and not how the project would be built.
 - * Flyovers are not evaluated during this study phase.







The decision is already made. How come you don't build a flyover? Are you building a flyover? Does my apinian even matter? We don't want another road. why should I care?

What we heard

• The decision is already made.

Government agencies will make the decision regardless of the community.

What we know

 No decisions on the corridors have been made. A strenuous process must be followed. Considering community impacts, social, cultural, physical, and environmental.

All corridors are analyzed, and the elimination of corridors is documented so there is transparency during the decision-making process.

• While agencies' input is considered, it is not the single deciding factor.

Other elements such as environmental, engineering, community input, cost, and other study factors contribute equally to decisions.

Study elements are weighted equally.

Tell it like it is...

What we heard

 Does community feedback really make any difference?

 Growth in Manatee County is to the east.
 Why does the historic Black community have to take the burden of growth not occurring in our community?

Why don't you build a flyover?

What we know

- Yes, community feedback and input are a valuable part of the planning and PD&E process. We conduct extensive outreach during these phases because the community plays a key role in the project's development.
- FDOT has developed ten corridors from Bradenton's west side to the east side near I-75. FDOT will evaluate, analyze, and eliminate the corridors. All corridors and public input are weighted equally.
- We are **not** at a point in the process to discuss **how and what** will be built. This will be determined during PD&E and Design.

Tell it like it is...

What we heard

We have talked about this before.
 Does my opinion even matter?


Houses will be "taken" for construction.

• If my property is needed, I will not be given appropriate compensation.

What we know

- Community input from the previous study, Central Manatee Network Alternatives Analysis (CMNAA), was incorporated into this study. Yes, your opinion matters, and it's important to be involved early in the process.
- This is a planning study, and we are not at the stage of the process to identify how much or where Right-of-Way will be needed. The selection of properties for potential purchase will occur only after the PD&E and design phases have been finished.
- FDOT follows an extensive process to ensure property owners are treated fairly and receive appropriate compensation.

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


