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### **DISTRICT ONE DISTRICTWIDE ROADWATCH REPORT #24 FOR WEEK JUNE 14-20, 2026**

District One is twelve counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee, Polk, and Sarasota.

**BARTOW, Fla.** – This weekly report is prepared by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to inform the public about upcoming road work in Southwest Florida. Below are the work schedule and lane closure locations for major projects.

**Motorists are reminded to wear safety belts and drive with caution, courtesy, common sense, and patience as they travel through work zones. Remember, speeding fines are doubled in work zones.**

#### **CHARLOTTE COUNTY**

**U.S. 41 (Tamiami Trail) from William Street to Peace River Bridge: Construction Project:** The contractor is working to activate the new signals and lighting along U.S. 41 northbound.

- Expect potential lane closures for crews to work on signalization and lighting.
- Crews will be working on installing new lighting from Retta Esplanade to the Peace River Bridge.

- *Motorists should use caution and expect to see trucks moving throughout the project.*
- *The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen conditions. Expected completion in Fall 2026.*

**S.R. 776 (El Jobean Road) at Torrence Street, Tea Street, Flamingo Boulevard, Toledo Blade, Collingswood Street:** Permit Project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. through 5 a.m. beginning Sunday, March 15, through Fall 2026. Crews will be installing mast arms at each listed intersection. Motorists should use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.

**S.R. 35 (U.S. 17) from Tamiami Trail (U.S. 41) to Bermont Road:** Construction project: The contractor is continuing to place the final friction course, starting at Bermont Road towards Marlympia.

- Motorists can expect to see paving operations take place along U.S. 17/ S.R. 35.
- Crews will be performing work on I.T.S. items.
- *Motorists should use caution and expect to see trucks moving throughout the project.*
- *The following activities are subject to change due to weather or unforeseen circumstances. Expected completion is Fall 2026.*

**S.R. 31 at CR 74 (Bermont Road) Roundabout Construction:** Construction project: These improvements will include constructing a roundabout, milling and resurfacing, upgrading drainage, installing new lighting, adding landscaping, signing, and pavement marking. *Throughout construction, motorists should expect intermittent daytime and nighttime/overnight lane closures.*

- No lane closures are anticipated at this time.

*The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.*

## **COLLIER COUNTY**

**I-75 at Pine Ridge Road (exit 107) Interchange Improvements:** FDOT is reconstructing the I-75 at Pine Ridge Road interchange. The interchange improvements include reconstruction of the Pine Ridge Road Interchange converting to a Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) design, reconstruction of the interchange on and off

ramps, construction of pedestrian and bicycle accommodations through the interchange, installation of new signals at the ramps, and resurfacing of Pine Ridge Road through the project area.

*The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.*

- Motorists are advised that traffic on Pine Ridge Road has shifted to the new Diverging Diamond configuration. Please use extra caution and pay close attention to signs and pavement markings.
- Crews will be working on paving, drainage installation, roadway work, pond excavation, and underground utilities.
- Motorists should anticipate lane closures on Pine Ridge Road during the nighttime/overnight hours of 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., and ramp closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Please use extra caution when driving through this area and expect delays.
- Crews will be working on clearing and grubbing and installing erosion control throughout the project area.
- Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. The expected completion date is mid-2027. For more information please visit: <https://www.swflroads.com/project/445296-1>.

**I-75 (Alligator Alley) Resurfacing from Mile Marker 97 to Mile Marker 85:** Construction project: FDOT is resurfacing I-75 (Alligator Alley) from Mile Marker 97 (just east of the Alligator Alley West Toll Plaza) to Mile Marker 85 in Collier County. Improvements include resurfacing of the road, replacement of sections of guardrail, shoulder improvements, and new signing and pavement markings.

*The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and other unforeseen circumstances.*

- Crews will be working on striping, bridgework, and installing sod.
- Motorists should anticipate lane closures throughout the duration of construction.

**Crews are working close to the roadway. Please exercise caution in the work zone, obey the posted speed limits, and anticipate delays.** The expected completion date is spring 2026.

**I-75 at S.R. 951 (exit 101) Interchange Improvements:** FDOT is reconstructing the I-75 southbound on- and off-ramp connections and the northbound on-ramp connection

to the mainline lanes at S.R. 951 (exit 101). The northeast quadrant loop ramp will be connected to, and accessible only by, a direct flyover ramp from northbound Collier Boulevard starting south of the Davis Boulevard intersection. This single-lane flyover ramp will carry traffic over Beck Boulevard and a reconstructed I-75 southbound on-ramp. A single-lane flyover ramp extension will carry I-75 southbound traffic over Davis Boulevard to a new signalized intersection at Collier Boulevard and Business Circle North. This ramp will extend along the western side of Collier Boulevard.

*The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.*

- During the nighttime/overnight hours on Thursday, June 18 motorists should expect the southbound I-75 on ramp from northbound S.R. 951/Collier Boulevard closed for crews to pour bridge deck. Motorists will need to continue northbound on S.R.951/Collier Boulevard and do a legal U-turn at Magnolia Pond Drive/City Gate Drive to return southbound on S.R. 951/Collier Boulevard to access the southbound I-75 on ramp.
- Motorists should expect intermittent lane closures for southbound and northbound C.R. 951/Collier Boulevard during nighttime/overnight hours for crews to install temporary barrier wall, move equipment, deliver materials, and construct the overhead bridge work.
- Motorists should expect the outside right turn lane from southbound S.R. 951 to westbound S.R. 84/Davis Boulevard closed. Drivers can continue to turn right from the remaining open turn lane. This closure is needed for crews to begin work for the bridge foundation installation and will remain in place through job completion.
- Pedestrians should expect a sidewalk closure along S.R. 84 (Davis Boulevard) just west of S.R. 951 (Collier Boulevard) and along S.R. 951 (Collier Boulevard) between S.R. 84 (Davis Boulevard) and Business Circle North. Pedestrians may use S.R. 84 (Davis Boulevard) to Market Street to Business Circle South to access S.R. 951 (Collier Boulevard).
- Motorists are advised that the S.R. 84 (Davis Boulevard) eastbound direct access ramp heading south to S.R. 951 (Collier Boulevard) is permanently closed. The eastbound to southbound right turn will be available at the intersection.
- Motorists should expect reduced lane widths for southbound Collier Boulevard between Business Circle North and Business Circle South.

- Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. The expected completion date is end of 2026. For more information please visit: <https://www.swflroads.com/project/425843-2>.

**I-75 from North of Golden Gate Parkway to South of Corkscrew Road Bridges:**

Environmental Survey: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight single lane closures beginning Sunday, June 7, through Sunday, June 14, 2026, between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. These single lane closures will also have flagging operations. They will occur on the following bridge numbers in Lee County and Collier County: 030200, 030201, 030202, 030203, 030321, 030322, 030189, 030190, 120143, 120144, 120146, 120147, 120148, 120145, 120149, 120151, 120130, and 120131. The purpose of these closures is to facilitate environmental surveys on the bridge decks. Drivers should use caution when traveling through the areas.

**S.R. 90 (Tamiami Trail East) from Espinal Boulevard to Commercial Drive to Palm Drive:**

Maintenance Project: Beginning Monday, May 18, between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., 7 p.m. through 5 a.m. Monday through Friday, motorists should expect daytime and nighttime lane closures at the intersections of Espinal Boulevard, Commercial Drive, and Palm Drive. Crews will be conducting preliminary prep work on the poles and mast arms at each intersection before they are repainted. This prep work is anticipated to last about *three months*, and crews will work on one intersection at a time. Motorists should use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.

**S.R. 84 (Davis Boulevard) from Kings Lake Square Plaza to Kings Way:**

Permit Project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight westbound lane closures on State Road 84 beginning Monday, April 14, through Wednesday, September 30, 2026. Work will take place between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. Crews will be drilling the foundation for a pole installation. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and delays and use caution when traveling through the work zone.

**S.R. 84 (Davis Boulevard) from West Crown Pointe Boulevard to East Crown Pointe Boulevard:**

Permit Project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight westbound lane closures on State Road 84 beginning Monday, April 14, through Wednesday, September 30, 2026. Work will take place between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. Crews will be drilling the foundation for a pole installation. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and delays and use caution when traveling through the work zone.

**S.R. 82 from the Hendry County Line to Gator Slough Lane:**

Construction Project: Motorists should expect intermittent eastbound and westbound lane closures during the daytime and nighttime/overnight hours throughout the duration of the project. Work consists of bridge construction, adding lanes and reconstruction, milling and resurfacing, drainage, grass median, sidewalk, guardrail, shared-use path, detention ponds excavation, signalization, lighting, and signing and pavement markings.

- **Beginning Sunday night, June 14, at approximately 7 p.m., a new traffic pattern will be implemented at the east end of the project, shifting traffic onto the newly constructed roadway over the added wildlife crossing.**
- **A new traffic pattern is in place at the west end of the project, shifting the eastbound travel lane to the newly constructed pavement done in Phase 1 of the project.**
- **A new traffic pattern is in place at the east end of the project, shifting the westbound travel lane to the newly constructed pavement done in Phase 1 of the project.**
- **Crews will be performing roadway widening, drainage installation, subgrade & base construction at the west end of the project on the right side of the roadway.**
- **Crews will be performing roadway widening, including clearing & grubbing, excavations, Drainage installation, subgrade & base construction on the eastbound end of the project on the right side of the roadway.**
- **Crews will be performing earthwork activities at the west end of the project including the shared path between Collier County and Hendry County**
- **Crews will be installing production piles and rubble riprap for Bridge 030330 outside the clear zone on the right side of the roadway**
- **Motorists should anticipate lane closures with flagging operations on State Road 82.**
- **Frequent and brief flagging operations are taking place throughout the day to assist trucks in safely crossing the road within project limits.**
- *The current work schedule is subject to change due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.*
- **Motorists should use caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting the roadway throughout the duration of the project. The estimated completion date is Spring 2027.**

## **DESOTO COUNTY**

**S.R. 70 from Peace River to Southeast Baker Street:** Construction project: Crews will reconstruct approximately 3.4 miles of S.R. 70 within the City of Arcadia. The

project includes the installation of new drainage facilities, relocation and addition of sanitary and water and utilities, upgrading traffic signals, reconstructing sidewalks, and installing street lighting in various locations. During construction, lane closures will occur on S.R. 70. Temporary pedestrian pathways are in place while sidewalks are under construction. Detours will be implemented while crews work on side roads. Please follow posted signage and use caution in the area.

- Eastbound S.R. 70 traffic is currently using the right lane from the Peace River to Baldwin Avenue. Between Baldwin Avenue and Dade Avenue, traffic shifts to the left lane, then back to the right lane past Dade Avenue. No lane restrictions are in place past Baker Street.
- Westbound S.R. 70 traffic shifts onto the south side of the roadway past Baker Street to facilitate the construction of a new box culvert. Past Roger Avenue, traffic utilizes the newly constructed left lane to Hillsborough Avenue. Between Hillsborough Avenue and Manatee Avenue, westbound traffic is currently utilizing the right lane. At Manatee Avenue, traffic switches into the newly constructed left lane. No lane restrictions are in place past the Peace River.
- Nearby City of Arcadia, utility and roadway construction on adjacent side streets along the project is ongoing, requiring the closure of certain streets at S.R. 70. Motorists are urged to follow all detour signs and expect delays while this work continues.
- Motorists are urged to use caution when approaching traffic shifts and to follow all lane markings and posted signage.

Estimated completion is early to late 2027.

**S.R. 70 from Townsend to Desoto/Highlands County Line:** Utility maintenance project: Crews will be installing new utility wires and replacing existing poles.

- Utility work is expected to continue through July 2026. Utility crews and equipment will be active throughout the corridor.
- Motorists should expect intermittent daytime and nighttime lane closures with one-lane flagging operations in place.
- Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures along S.R. 70 as crews are unloading equipment and materials, replacing poles and installing new wiring. Lane closures will be controlled by flagging operations.
- Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the work zone.

## **GLADES COUNTY**

**S.R. 78 from Buckhead Road NE to Access Road:** Permit project: Crews will perform overhead pole hardening operations along the corridor.

- Work will take place daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through July 3, 2026.
- Intermittent lane closures will occur during work activities.
- Motorists should expect possible delays and use caution while traveling through the work zone.

## **HARDEE COUNTY**

**S.R. 64 from Pear Street to S Barlow Road:** Construction project: The S.R. 64 improvement project in Hardee County includes milling and resurfacing existing pavement, reconstructing worn sections of roadway, improving drainage systems, replacing and installing guardrails, updating signage and pavement markings, and enhancing driveway turnouts for safer access. Please use caution in the area and watch for workers, traffic signage, detours, and equipment throughout the project.

- Intermittent daytime single-lane closures will occur throughout the project limits as work continues.
- The posted speed limit remains reduced to 45 mph within the construction zone.
- Motorists should expect changing traffic patterns, potential delays, and should follow posted signs and consider alternate routes when possible.

Estimated project completion is summer 2026.

**U.S. 17 (S.R. 35) at S.R. 62 and from Rea Road to S.R. 62:** Construction project: Crews are installing new traffic signals and roadway lighting along U.S. 17 in Hardee County. Work includes signalization improvements at the S.R. 62 intersection and lighting installation along approximately 1.2 miles of the corridor.

- Intermittent daytime lane closures may occur throughout the project limits as construction activities continue.
- The eastbound right-turn lane on S.R. 62 at U.S. 17 will be closed from 7 a.m. Monday, June 8, 2026, until 7 a.m. Tuesday, June 9, 2026, to allow for roadway widening and resurfacing operations.

- The southbound right-turn lane on U.S. 17 at S.R. 62 will be closed from 7 a.m. Tuesday, June 9, 2026, until 7 a.m. Wednesday, June 10, 2026, to allow for roadway widening and resurfacing operations
- Motorists should expect possible delays, follow posted signs, and use caution while traveling through the work zone.
- Drivers are urged to watch for workers, equipment, and changing traffic patterns in the area.

Estimated project completion is fall 2026.

## **HENDRY COUNTY**

**Districtwide Movable Bridges (Hendry County):** Construction Project: The Florida Department of Transportation began installing Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) at S.R. 29 (Bridge Street) Caloosahatchee River Bridge (Labelle) in Hendry County. This project includes the installation of pedestrian/bicycle detection systems, conduits and electrical components, and connection to bridge tender buildings.

- Testing will begin in early February 2026.
- Motorists are advised that there will be intermittent sidewalk and lane closures throughout the duration of construction.
- Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Motorists are advised to use caution in the construction zone.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion of testing is in late May 2026, weather permitting.

**S.R. 25 (U.S. 27) from Stitt Ranch to West of Flaghole Road:** Construction project: Crews will begin milling and resurfacing work on S.R. 25 (U.S. 27) from Stitt Ranch to west of Flaghole Road in Hendry County. The project includes guardrail improvements, drainage enhancements, updated signage, and new pavement markings.

- Work is ongoing along the corridor from Stitt Ranch to west of Flaghole Road. Crews will continue with the installation of roadway signs throughout the project limits. Drainage and guardrail work continues on the north and south side of S.R. 25 along with project site clean-up, mowing, grading and sodding.

- Motorists should anticipate single-lane closures in both eastbound and westbound directions for these ongoing construction activities.
- Drivers should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone.

Estimated completion is the summer of 2026.

## **HIGHLANDS COUNTY**

**S.R. 25 (U.S. 27) from Shoreline Drive to Davis and Gaines Road and from north of Tower Street to south of Tower Street: Construction project:** Crews are reconstructing rigid pavement on S.R. 25 (U.S. 27) from north of Tower Street to south of Tower Street. Additionally, milling and resurfacing work is ongoing on U.S. 27 from Shoreline Drive to Davis and Gaines Road.

- Daily lane closures continue on northbound and southbound S.R. 25 (U.S. 27) for paving and shoulder widening activities throughout the project limits.
- Motorists should use caution at the U.S. 27 and Dal Hall Boulevard/Tower Street intersection due to construction traffic entering and leaving the work zone.
- A northbound lane shift remains in place at the U.S. 27 and Dal Hall Boulevard/Tower Street intersection. Drivers should use extra caution in this area.
- Tower Street at U.S. 27 remains closed, and the detour remains in effect for intersection and tie-in work. Eastbound and westbound Tower Street traffic is detoured via C.R. 621 and East Interlake Boulevard. Motorists should use caution and follow posted detour signage in the area.
- The driveway on northbound U.S. 27 near Dunkin' is now open.
- Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone.

Anticipated completion is late 2026.

**S.R. 17 from C.R. 17 (Kenilworth Boulevard) to East of U.S. 98/U.S. 27 and from South of Lake Verona Boulevard to South Delaney Avenue:** Construction project: Crews are beginning roadway improvements along S.R. 17 in Highlands County. The project includes milling and resurfacing, drainage improvements, sidewalk and curb upgrades, signalization and lighting enhancements, railroad crossing reconstruction, and new signage and pavement markings.

- Construction is scheduled to begin in June 2026 and continue through spring 2027.
- Daytime and nighttime lane closures may occur throughout the project. Traffic may be reduced to a single lane, and periodic road closures may be necessary during construction activities.
- Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone.

Estimated completion is in spring 2027.

**S.R. 25 (U.S. 27) South of Hammock Road:** Permit construction project: Permit-related construction activities will take place along U.S. 27 south of Hammock Road.

- Periodic lane closures may occur as trucks enter and exit the work site. Motorists should use caution, reduce speed, and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone.

The project is expected to last approximately six months.

**S.R. 70 West of U.S. 27:** Permit construction project: FP&L crews will construct a new driveway connection to a substation and perform shoulder improvements along the corridor.

- Work is expected to continue over the next two weeks.
- Periodic lane closures and temporary traffic pattern changes may occur during both daytime and nighttime hours as construction progresses.
- Motorists should use caution, follow posted signage, and watch for workers and equipment in the construction zone.

**S.R. 70 from Highlands County Line to Okeechobee:** Utility maintenance project: Crews are installing new utility wires and replacing existing poles along S.R. 70. Crews began utility work in April 2026, and operations are expected to continue through the end of the year. Utility crews and equipment will be active throughout the corridor.

- This project is part of a larger pole replacement effort extending from DeSoto County through Highlands County and into Okeechobee County.
- Motorists should expect intermittent daytime lane closures along S.R. 70 as crews replace poles and install new wiring. Lane closures will be controlled by flagging operations in place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

- Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the work zone.

Estimated completion is mid-2026.

**Sebring Special Events (Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, Lemon Avenue and Booker Avenue):** Highlands County Citizens with Voices will host a Juneteenth Celebration on Saturday, June 13, 2026, from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. Local road closures and detours will be in effect in the event area.

- Beginning at 10 a.m., Lemon Avenue will be closed from Harris Street to Virginia Street, Booker Avenue will be closed from Harris Street to Virginia Street, and Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard will be closed from Washington Avenue to E.O. Douglas Avenue.
- Detours will be in place for northbound and southbound traffic traveling on Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard. Motorists should follow posted detour signage and traffic control devices.
- All roads are expected to reopen by 7 p.m. on Saturday, June 13, 2026.
- Motorists should use caution in the area and watch for workers and equipment in the work zone.

## **LEE COUNTY**

**I-75 at Daniels Parkway (Exit 131) Interchange Improvements:** FDOT is reconstructing the I-75 at Daniels Parkway interchange. The interchange improvements include reconstruction of the Daniels Parkway Interchange (Exit 131), converting it to a Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) design, reconstruction of the I-75 ramps, construction of pedestrian and bicycle accommodations through the interchange, installation of new signals at the ramps, and resurfacing of Daniels Parkway through the project area.

*The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.*

- On Monday, June 15, starting at 8 p.m., motorists should expect **brief full closures of eastbound and westbound Daniels Parkway and the I-75 ramps** for crews to work on overhead signals. Off-duty police officers will be onsite to assist motorists. Please use extra caution and expect delays.

- Motorists should anticipate lane closures on I-75 between 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. and on Daniels Parkway between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Crews are working on installing temporary lighting, permanent light pole bases, and temporary signals.
- Crews are working on widening at the southbound I-75 off-ramp and Daniels Parkway.
- Crews are working on earthwork and underground drainage throughout the project area.
- Please note that the westbound lanes on Daniels Parkway are shifted slightly to the south, then back to the north. Traffic on the southbound I-75 off-ramp has also shifted to the east. Please pay attention to signs and pavement marking and drive with caution.
- Motorists are advised that the speed limit has been reduced in the project area. Please follow all posted signage.
- Pedestrian access has been shifted to the south side of Daniels Parkway. Please follow signs and proceed with caution in the work zone.
- Motorists should expect trucks and equipment to be moving materials throughout the project.
- Please use caution and watch for workers and construction vehicles entering and leaving the roadway. The expected completion date is summer 2028. For more information, please visit: <https://www.swflroads.com/project/446296-2>.

**I-75 From South of Bonita Beach Road to North of Alico:** Construction Project: **NIGHTTIME LANE CLOSURE OPERATIONS HAVE BEEN UPDATED TO OCCUR SUNDAY NIGHTS THROUGH FRIDAY NIGHTS** for resurfacing operations for I-75 northbound and southbound.

- **Nighttime paving operations will continue to take place Sunday through Friday nights in the northbound lanes of I-75 and the southbound lanes of the Collector Distributor Road before the exit towards Alico Road.**
- **Motorists should expect to see additional nighttime activities with lane closures and mobile operations:**
  - Shoulder rumble striping along the Collector Distributor roads northbound and southbound (south of Alico Road to the Terminal Ramp Overpass)

- On and off ramps at Alico Road
- Traffic monitoring loop installations in both northbound and southbound I-75.
- Bridge and overpass joint rehabilitation in both northbound and southbound lanes of I-75.
- Daytime activities will include:
  - Continued installation of signs.
  - Maintenance and pointing up I.T.S. items and Wrong Way Detection features
  - Shoulder treatment and sod placement at various locations from Alico Road to the Lee/Collier County line.

**I-75 from North of Golden Gate Parkway to South of Corkscrew Road Bridges:**

Environmental Survey: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight single lane closures beginning Sunday, June 7, through Sunday, June 14, 2026, between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. These single lane closures will also have flagging operations. They will occur on the following bridge numbers in Lee County and Collier County: 030200, 030201, 030202, 030203, 030321, 030322, 030189, 030190, 120143, 120144, 120146, 120147, 120148, 120145, 120149, 120151, 120130, and 120131. The purpose of these closures is to facilitate environmental surveys on the bridge decks. Drivers should use caution when traveling through the areas.

**U.S. 41 over the Caloosahatchee Bridge (#120002):** Construction Project: Beginning Thursday, May 21, through September 2026, between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m., motorists should expect intermittent nighttime/overnight northbound and southbound lane closures on the Caloosahatchee Bridge. Crews will be conducting pile jacket work. Motorists should use caution as they travel through the work zone.

**S.R. 865 (San Carlos Boulevard) at Fisherman's Wharf Road:** Maintenance Project: Motorists should expect daytime work beginning Monday, June 15, through Wednesday, July 15, 2026. Work will occur Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Crews will be conducting sidewalk repairs. While no lane closures are anticipated, pedestrians will be redirected with signage during work operations. **S.R. 865 (San Carlos Boulevard) at Summerlin Road:** Maintenance Project: Motorists should expect daytime work beginning Monday, June 15, through Wednesday, July 15, 2026. Work will occur Monday through Friday between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Crews will be conducting sidewalk repairs. While no lane closures are anticipated, pedestrians will be redirected with signage during work operations. Motorists should use caution when traveling through the area as crews work on and near the roadway.

**S.R. 865 (San Carlos Boulevard) from Buttonwood Drive to Hurricane Pass Bridge:** Permit Project: Motorists should expect nighttime/overnight lane closures beginning Sunday, June 14, through Wednesday, June 17, 2026, between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. Crews will be conducting directional bore operations. Motorists should use caution when traveling through the work zone.

**S.R. 739 from north of the Caloosahatchee River to S.R. 78 (Bayshore Road):** Construction Project: This project is intended to improve safety, enhance traffic flow, and reduce crashes by constructing a continuous raised median, with bi-directional and full median openings. Proposed improvements also consist of milling and resurfacing of the roadway, two pedestrian hybrid beacons, upgrading the traffic signal at Pondella Road, ADA upgrades, lighting, signing and pavement markings, and drainage improvements.

**S.R. 82 from Ford Street to Veronica Shoemaker Boulevard:** The improvements under this contract consist of pedestrian and safety upgrades to include milling, resurfacing, signing and pavement markings, lighting, signalization, and other incidental construction for intersection improvements along S.R. 82 from Ford Street to Veronica Shoemaker Boulevard.

- **Beginning Sunday night, May 17, motorists should expect paving operations to begin. The contractor plans to start on the eastbound side of the project near Veronica S. Shoemaker and continue westbound towards Ford Street. Paving operations are estimated to last through May, pending all weather and other unforeseen circumstances.**
- **Motorists should expect intermittent nighttime/overnight lane closures on the inside and outside, east and westbound lanes throughout the duration of the project. Closures will take place between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.**

Crews will be conducting work on a new right-turn lane west of Daniels Parkway, light pole relocation, and sidewalk work. **S.R. 82 from Naples Avenue to Bell Boulevard:** Maintenance Project: Motorists should expect daytime lane closures on S.R. 82 eastbound and westbound

beginning Wednesday, May 27, through Saturday, June 20, 2026, between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Crews will be conducting work inside the median. Motorists should use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.

**S.R. 80 (Palm Beach Boulevard) at Orange River Road:** Permit Project: Motorists should expect to see nighttime/overnight lane closures on State Road 80 eastbound beginning Sunday, June 14, through Friday, June 19. Crews will be conducting roadwork restoration. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and use caution as crews work on and near the roadway.

**S.R. 80 (Palm Beach Boulevard) from Veronica S Shoemaker Boulevard to Kingston Drive:** Construction Project: The improvements under this Contract consist of pedestrian and safety upgrades to include milling, resurfacing, signing and pavement markings, lighting, signalization, and other incidental construction for intersection improvements along S.R. 80 from Veronica Shoemaker Boulevard to Kingston Drive.

- **Motorists should expect intermittent nighttime/overnight lane closures on the inside and outside, east and westbound lanes throughout the duration of the project. Closures will take place between 7:30 p.m. and 6 a.m.**

**S.R. 45 (North Tamiami Trail) from 2927 through 2971:** Maintenance Project: Pedestrians should expect to see crews performing sidewalk work Monday through Friday, Monday, June 1, through Thursday, June 25, from 9 a.m. through 5 p.m. While motorists should not expect to encounter lane closures, pedestrians should follow all posted detour signs.

**S.R. 31 from S.R. 78 (Bayshore Road) to Lake Babcock Drive:** Construction Project: The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District One, is making improvements to S.R. 31 from S.R. 78 (Bayshore Road) to Lake Babcock Drive. These interim improvements include building a new four-lane roadway east of the existing S.R. 31 roadway that will tie-in to the existing two-lane roadway. Additional improvements to the project corridor include separated multi-use trail facilities along both sides of S.R. 31, lighting enhancements at all major intersections, and significant enhancements to stormwater facilities. Anticipated completion is Spring 2027.

  - **The contractor will temporarily close Lake Babcock Drive to construct the planned roundabout at the intersection. During this closure, drivers will need to enter and exit Babcock Ranch via detours using Cypress Parkway, Greenway Boulevard, and Saw Palmetto Parkway.**

- **This temporary closure is expected to remain in place through July.**
- Beginning the week of February 2, motorists should expect reduced speeds along Babcock Ranch Road/State Road 31 as the contractor initiates construction activities for the planned roundabout at Lake Babcock Drive. These operations will be conducted during the daytime and nighttime/overnight hours.
- As always, changing traffic patterns can cause confusion among motorists. - Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Motorists are advised to use caution in the construction zone.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion of testing is in late March 2026, weather permitting.

**State Roadways (U.S. 41, S.R. 31, S.R. 78, S.R. 80, S.R. 82, S.R. 739, S.R. 865, and S.R. 867):** Maintenance Contract Project: Motorists should expect crews working during the nighttime/overnight hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Crews are replacing thermoplastic markings on state roadways. Motorists should expect minimal slow-moving traffic and possible delays.

**State Roadways (U.S. 41, S.R. 31, S.R. 78, S.R. 80, S.R. 82, S.R. 739, S.R. 865, and S.R. 867):** Maintenance Contract Project: Motorists should expect lane closures during nighttime/overnight hours from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. Crews are sweeping curb and gutter on state roadways and bridges. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and possible delays.

**State Roadways (U.S. 41, S.R. 31, S.R. 78, S.R. 80, S.R. 82, S.R. 739, S.R. 865, and S.R. 867):** Maintenance Contract Project: Motorists should expect lane closures

during daytime hours from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm. Crews are edging along the roadside and curb and gutter on state roadways. Motorists should expect slow-moving traffic and possible delays.

SR 789 Longboat Key Pass Bridge (Longboat)**

- Testing began in early February 2026.
- Motorists are advised that there will be intermittent sidewalk and lane closures throughout the duration of construction.
- Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Motorists are advised to use caution in the construction zone.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion of testing is in late spring 2026, weather permitting.

**I-275 (S.R. 93) from I-75 to Terra Ceia River:** Construction project: Crews are milling, resurfacing, and installing pavement markings on 2.2 miles of roadway on I-275 (S.R. 93) from I-75 to Terra Ceia River. The project improvements include milling and resurfacing, shoulder and ramp work, overbuilding for cross-slope correction, guardrail and signing, and pavement markings.

- **Upcoming overnight lane closures for paving from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.** - weather and materials availability permitting.
  - June 21, Sunday night: Ramp A and D will be closed. Then alternately, Ramp C and D will be closed. Please follow the posted detours.
  - June 23 – 25, single lane closure SB I-275
  - June 23 – 25, single lane closure NB I-275
  - June 28 – July 1, single lane closure SB I-275
  - June 28 – July 1, single lane closure NB I-275

- Throughout the project limits motorists can expect intermittent lane closures as crews continue sign installation operations.
- During the active construction phase, motorists can expect uneven pavement throughout the project limits. Please use caution and follow the posted speed limits.
- Estimated completion is mid- to late-2026.

**I-75 (SR 93) at the Intersection of S.R. 64 and S.R. 70:** Construction project: This project is for the construction of Arterial Dynamic Message Signs (ADMS) on I-75 at two interchanges in Manatee County. The items of work include the construction of ADMS, fiber optic cable, conduit, pull and splice boxes, verification closed circuit television (VCCTVs) cameras, power subsystem infrastructure, and device integration.

- Motorists can expect temporary right lane closures while crews perform drill shaft operations from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. starting in late June. Schedule details will be posted as they become available.

Please use caution and watch for workers in or near the travel lanes. Expected completion is late-2026.

**U.S. 41 (S.R. 45) from 63rd Avenue to 53rd Avenue:** Construction project: Crews have begun a safety project on U.S. 41 from 63rd Avenue to 53rd Avenue. The project limits cover approximately 1.27 miles. Crews will install curb and gutter, sidewalk, signalization, lighting, pedestrian beacons at seven new mid-block crosswalks, vehicle detection systems and apply new signing and pavement markings.

- **June 17, Wednesday, motorists can expect temporary overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. as crews complete thermal application of pavement markings throughout the project work zone. Motorists may like to consider an alternate route or allow additional travel time.**
- Motorists can expect temporary south and northbound lane closures on U.S. 41 throughout the project limits as crews install light poles and complete concrete work.
- Pedestrians can expect detours throughout the project and are encouraged to follow the detour signage and use caution.
- Estimated project completion is late 2026.

**S.R. 684/Cortez Road from 75<sup>th</sup> Street West to 86<sup>th</sup> Street West:** Permit project: There will be east/westbound inside and outside lane closures on S.R. 684/Cortez Road from 75<sup>th</sup> Street West to 86<sup>th</sup> Street West through the end of June from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. The contractor will be constructing right turn lanes, median dual left turns, two intersection improvements, side street improvements, signing, pavement markings and drainage improvements.

**S.R. 684/Cortez Road from 60<sup>th</sup> Street West to 58<sup>th</sup> Street West:** Permit project: There will be an intermittent southbound outside lane closure on S.R. 684/Cortez Road from 60<sup>th</sup> Street W to 58<sup>th</sup> Street W until the end of June 2026, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. FPL will be connecting a new electrical service. Plan for additional travel time or consider an alternate route.

**S.R. 684/Cortez Road from 47<sup>th</sup> Street W to 43<sup>rd</sup> Street W:** Permit project: There will be an intermittent southbound outside lane closure on S.R. 684/Cortez Road from 47<sup>th</sup> Street W to 43<sup>rd</sup> Street W until the end of May, from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. FPL will be connecting a new electrical service. Plan for additional travel time or consider an alternate route. Please watch for workers and equipment near the travel lanes.

**S.R. 72 (Clark Road) from Rockefeller Avenue to Westwind Lane:** Permit project: There will be intermittent alternating side-street road closures with temporary detours from June 8-30, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. for utility work. Work will start at Clark Road and Nelson Avenue, and once completed work will move on to Clark Road and Rockefeller. Please watch for detour signs and be aware of workers in or near the travel lanes during the utility operation.

**S.R. 70 from Lorraine Road to Bourneside Boulevard:** Construction project: This project includes widening S.R. 70 from Lorraine Road to Bourneside Boulevard from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane or six-lane divided roadway, depending on the location, construction of roundabouts on S.R. 70 at Uihlein Road, Del Webb Boulevard, and Bourneside Boulevard, intersection improvements at the existing signalized intersection of Greenbrook Boulevard and Lorraine Road, construction of four bridges over two Braden River crossing locations, new drainage system, construction of 10-foot shared use paths, street lighting, and landscaping, and installation of new fiber optic cable connecting the two signalized intersections to Manatee County's regional Advanced Traffic Management System (ATMS).

Recently, bicyclists and pedestrians have been observed entering the work zone and using shared-use paths within the project limits. Although these areas may appear finished, construction activities are still ongoing. These areas are not open to the public and may contain open excavations, fresh asphalt, or uncured concrete, posing significant safety hazards to anyone not affiliated with the project. These roadways and shared-use paths within the work zone are clearly marked as closed with signage. Additionally, vehicles have been observed driving through closed side streets while workers are present, creating a serious risk of injury or accident.

This week's work will consist of:

- Post Boulevard and existing S.R. 70 at the intersection will have embankment placed. Drainage will be installed on SR 70 between Post Boulevard and Lorraine Road.
- Excavation of the pond on the north side of S.R. 70, west of Uihlein Road.
- Forming and pouring pile caps for the easternmost S.R. 70 westbound bridge. Constructing bridge approach slabs for the westernmost S.R. 70 westbound bridge.
- Grading base between Bourneside Boulevard and Polo Run on the north side of S.R. 70 for shared use path.
- Installing light conduit and foundations on the north side of S.R.70 between Uihlein Road and Bourneside Boulevard.
- Installing waterline pipe on the north side of SR 70 between Lorraine Road and Post Boulevard.

Post Boulevard is closed to allow for the construction of the north portion of the Post Boulevard intersection. During this closure, no traffic will be permitted on Post Boulevard between S.R. 70 and Garnet Trail in either direction. A detour route is in place for traffic to utilize Rangeland Parkway and Lorraine Road. Greenbrook Boulevard will be open during this closure. This closure is in place until late August 2026.

Please use caution and watch for trucks and construction vehicles entering or exiting the work zone throughout the construction limits. Work will take place Monday through Saturday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Be aware of workers and flaggers in the area.

The estimated completion date for construction is summer 2027.

**S.R. 70 from Bourneside Boulevard to Waterbury Road, Bradenton:** Construction project: This project includes widening S.R. 70 from Bourneside Boulevard to Waterbury Road from a two-lane undivided roadway to a four-lane divided roadway, Safety features will include roundabouts to be constructed at 197th Street East/Lindrick Lane, 213th Street East, 225th Street East/Panther Ridge Trail and County Road 675/Waterbury Road. The project will also include the installation of a new drainage system, new curb and gutter, construction of 10-foot shared-use paths and five-foot paved shoulders on both sides of the roadway, street lighting throughout the project and landscaping inside the roundabouts.

This week's work will consist of:

- Grading swale and future shared use path on the south side of S.R. 70 between Lindrick Lane and Bourneside Boulevard.
- Installing stabilization and base at C.R. 675 and S.R. 70.
- Installing light poles at C.R. 675 and S.R. 70.
- Installing new power poles on the north side of S.R. 70 between 197th Street and C.R. 675.

C.R. 675 is closed for two months to construct the north side of the C.R. 675/Meadow Dove Lane roundabout. During the closure, no traffic will be permitted to enter or exit C.R. 675 via S.R. 70. Only emergency vehicles will be permitted through the intersection. A full detour will be in place, with message boards directing traffic along the detour route by way of S.R. 64 and Verna Bethany Road. Businesses along C.R. 675 remain open and are accessible via the posted detour.

The estimated completion date for construction is summer 2027.

**S.R. 70 (53<sup>rd</sup> Avenue) between 15<sup>th</sup> Street East and U.S. 301:** Maintenance project: Motorists can expect intermittent lane closures with a flagging operation on eastbound and westbound S.R. 70 (53<sup>rd</sup> Avenue) between 15<sup>th</sup> Street East and U.S. 301. Shoulder work is scheduled from **June 15-19**, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Please watch for workers and equipment near the travel lanes.

**S.R. 64 at Lorriane Road Roundabout:** Landscaping project: Crews will begin installing landscaping in and around the roundabout over the next few weeks. The installation should last approximately 60 days or less, weather permitting. There are no planned lane closures, but please be aware of workers and landscaping equipment and materials in the roundabout area. Please use caution and follow all speed limits in the roundabout.

**S.R. 64 at Uihlein Road Roundabout:** Permit project: Developer's crews are constructing a roundabout and adding lanes at the intersection of S.R. 64 and Uihlein Road through July 2026. Plan for additional travel time or consider an alternate route. Please watch for lane shifts, detours and construction workers.

**S.R. 64 from Grand Harbour Parkway to Lena Road:** Resurfacing project: FDOT will conduct a resurfacing project on S.R. 64 from Grand Harbour Parkway to Lena Road. Crews will be milling, resurfacing and adding vehicle detection technology.

- Motorists can expect single and double-lane closures on S.R. 64 in both directions, Sunday through Thursday nights from approximately 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.

- Motorists should stay alert for traffic signs and changing traffic patterns throughout the project.
- Motorists should be aware of workers and equipment in the area and follow posted speed limits throughout the project.
- Expected completion is late summer, weather permitting.

**S.R. 55 (U.S. 19) and S.R. 684; from 23rd Avenue W to 39th Street E, from Terra Ceia Road to I-275 and at Royal Palm Drive, Manatee:** Construction project: These projects include making improvements along S.R. 55 (U.S. 19) from 23rd Avenue W to 39th Street E, S.R. 55 (U.S. 19) from Terra Ceia Road to I-275 (northbound ramp) and along S.R. 684 at Royal Palm Drive in Manatee County. Improvements will involve milling and resurfacing S.R. 55 from 23rd Avenue W to 39th Street E, implementing safety improvements, guardrail replacements, sidewalk repair, lighting updates, pedestrian signal replacements, and median modifications.

- S.R. 55 (U.S. 301/U.S. 41) from 23rd Avenue W to 39th Street E- Motorists should expect lane closures in the either the northbound or southbound outside lanes from 23rd Avenue W through Riverfront Blvd/Manatee River Bridge. Closure will be in effect for asphalt milling and paving activities from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. nightly Sunday, June 7, through Thursday night, June 11. Please use caution and watch for construction vehicles entering and exiting the work zone. Expect delays.

The estimated completion date for construction is spring 2027.

**S.R. 45 from 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue W to S.R. 684/Cortez Road:** Permit project: There will be an intermittent southbound outside lane closure on S.R. 45 from 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue W to S.R. 684/Cortez Road until the end of June 2026, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. FPL will be connecting a new electrical service. Plan for additional travel time or consider an alternate route. Please watch for workers and equipment near the travel lanes.

**15th Street E (S.R. 70 Spur) from 30th Avenue E to 26th Avenue E:** Construction project: The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is milling and resurfacing 15th Street E (S.R. 70 Spur) from 30th Avenue E to 26th Avenue E in Manatee County. This safety project's improvements also include installation of new sidewalk and existing sidewalk repairs, drainage work, lighting, signalization, signage and new pavement markings on approximately .25 miles.

- Motorists can expect intermittent daytime and nighttime lane closures throughout the project limits.
- Please be aware there may be uneven areas of pavement while work is underway.

- Pedestrians can expect detours where sidewalks are being repaired or replaced.

- Intermittent lane closures will occur as needed from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. throughout construction activities.

- Motorists should be aware of changing traffic patterns, heavy equipment, and workers present in the construction zone. Use caution when traveling through the area and obey posted signage and flagging operations.

Estimated project completion is summer 2026.

**S.R. 15 from SE 138th Avenue to SE 128th Boulevard:** Permit project: Crews will perform overhead pole hardening operations along the corridor.

- Work will take place daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through July 3, 2026.
- Intermittent lane closures will occur during work activities.
- Motorists should be aware of changing traffic patterns, heavy equipment, and workers present in the construction zone. Use caution when traveling through the area and obey posted signage and flagging operations.

**S.R. 15 from 23<sup>rd</sup> Street to Southwest 28<sup>th</sup> Street:** Permit project: Motorists can expect lane closures on southbound S.R. 15 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. starting on June 15 and continuing through June 26 so that FPL can remove stub poles. Expect delays and the presence of workers in the work area.

**S.R. 15 from SE 126<sup>th</sup> Boulevard to SE 138<sup>th</sup> Avenue:** Permit project: Motorists can expect lane closures on southbound and northbound S.R. 15 from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. starting on June 15 and continuing through June 26 so that crews can install poles and a span crossing S.R. 441. Expect delays and the presence of workers in the work area.

## **POLK COUNTY**

**I-4 at S.R. 33 (Exit 38) in Lakeland:** Construction project: Project improvements include reconstructing the existing interchange, reconstructing I-4 bridges over S.R. 33, widening and resurfacing S.R. 33, constructing wildlife crossings over I-4 and under S.R. 33, and adding noise walls along S.R. 33. This week crews will work on clearing vegetation, installing barrier walls, paving operations for on-off ramps, pavement markings, drainage operations, and utility work.

- Motorists should expect nightly road closures on S.R. 33 at the Amazon warehouse entrances to install pipe crossings from Monday, June 15, 2026 - Thursday, June 18, 2026, from 9:30 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Detours will be available through Tomkow Road and Old Polk City Road to access S.R. 33 northbound and southbound. Motorists are advised to follow all posted detour routes and identify alternative routes.

- Beginning on Tuesday, June 16, 2026, the entrance to University Boulevard from S.R. 33 will be closed for approximately 60 days. Motorists are advised to follow all posted detour routes and identify alternative routes. This closure is in place to expedite the completion of the project earlier than currently anticipated.
- At the Spanish Oaks community, Long Lake Circle, and entrance to Waterside Boulevard there will be flagging operations from Monday, June 15, 2026 - Friday, June 19, 2026.
- Motorists should expect single lane closures on I-4 during nighttime/overnight hours from 8:30 p.m. to 6:30 a.m. through the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should expect double lane closures on I-4 during nighttime/overnight hours from 10:30 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should expect lane closures and flagging operations on S.R. 33 during nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. through the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should expect lane shifts on I-4 and S.R. 33 through the duration of the construction.
- Drivers should exercise caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting I-4 through the duration of the construction.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion is summer 2029.

**I-4 at CSX Railroad Bridge Approximately 1200 Feet West of Kathleen Road (Exit 31)**

**in Lakeland:** Construction project: This project includes replacing the existing 250-foot bridge with two new 400-foot bridges to provide for CSX double tracking and will accommodate future expansion of I-4. This week crews will be working at the Kathleen Road Ramps.

- Expect westbound I-4 on-ramp closure at Kathleen Road (Exit 31) at night/overnight Sunday through Thursday night for removal of materials. Motorists wanting to enter I-4 westbound should continue northbound on Kathleen Road past the closed ramp. Turn east on Griffin Road to U.S. 98, head north on U.S. 98 and follow it to the I-4 westbound on-ramp at U.S. 98 (Exit 32)
- Expect nighttime/overnight double lane closures on I-4, Sunday night, June 7 and Monday night, June 8 for paving. Use caution, add extra time in your schedule to reach your destination and be prepared to merge.

**I-4 from Galloway Road to U.S. 98 in Lakeland:** Construction project: This project includes milling and resurfacing, concrete slab rehabilitation, guardrail and ITS.

This week the contractor will be working off the roadway with no planned lane closures. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road.

**I-4 near CR 557A in Lakeland/Polk City:** Utility project: Use caution and watch for workers close to the road as utility crews bore 6" HDPE under I-4, remove overhead facilities and install a new pole.

**U.S. 98 from S.R. 60 to C.R. 540A in Bartow/Highland City:** Construction project: This project includes removing the old asphalt, replacing it with new asphalt, repaving the side street aprons and installing new sensors at the signalized intersections. This project goes with another project to make improvements at the intersection with Lyle Parkway, which includes installing a new traffic signal, improving drainage at the intersection, widening the turn radius at the northwest and southeast corners, adding a raised concrete pedestrian pad on the northwest corner and adding intersection lighting with high visibility crosswalk striping and pedestrian signals. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures Sunday through Thursday nights for paving and drainage work. Use caution, watch for workers close to the road and be prepared to merge.

**U.S. 98 from Autumnwood Grove Boulevard to Innovation Drive:** Permit project: Watch for daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday, June 15, as crews make modifications to the median and striping. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

**U.S. 98 from South of Griffin Road to Sharon Drive in Lakeland:** Construction project: This project includes milling and resurfacing, repairing and improving drainage, improvements at Pyramid Parkway, special emphasis crosswalks, enhanced lighting, upgraded signal equipment, new northbound signs identifying the I-4 ramps, and painted bike lanes for emphasis.

- Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures throughout the project (weather permitting) both north and southbound while crews are working on punch list items. Use caution and be prepared to merge.
- Expect daytime lane closures north of I-4 while crews work on signals. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

**U.S. 98 from West Socrum Loop Road to C.R. 54 in Lakeland/Kathleen:** Construction project: The improvements under this project include widening U.S. 98 to a four-lane divided highway, creating roundabouts at the Big Cypress Boulevard and S.R. 471 intersections, relocating utilities, improving drainage, adding pedestrian crosswalks, and building shared use paths from W Socrum Loop Road / Hall Road to just north of Rock Ridge Road.

- Periodic flagging operations at various locations on US 98 between W Socrum Loop Road and CR 54 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday, June 15 through Friday, June 19. Be prepared to stop.
- Flagging operations and traffic shifts on US 98 from W Socrum Loop Road to north of Rock Ridge Road from 8 p.m. Tuesday, June 16 to 6 a.m. Wednesday, June 17, weather permitting. Northbound and southbound US 98 traffic will be separated into the right lanes of the new alignments and the roundabout at Big Cypress Boulevard will become operational. Drivers should be extra alert to the highway alignment changes and the new roundabout intersection.
- The maximum speed limit remains reduced to 45 MPH on US 98 throughout the project limits.

**U.S. 27 from Citrus Ridge to Heller Brothers in Davenport:** Permit project: Watch for nighttime/overnight southbound lane closures from 7:30 p.m. to 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday nights. The lane closures are necessary as crews place the final striping. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

**U.S. 27 from Cypress Gardens Boulevard to Hunters Glen in Waverly/Lake Wales:** Permits project: Expect daytime lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and nighttime/overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. as crews construct new turn lanes. Work with possible lane closures is expected to continue through mid-summer.

**U.S. 27 at Live Oak Drive in Lake Wales:** Permit project: Expect daily daytime southbound lane closures from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through August as crews replace poles.

**U.S. 27 at Holly Hill Road/Massee Road Intersection in Davenport:** Permit project: Expect northbound and southbound inside lane closures from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday nights, as crews place the final striping for crosswalks. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.

**U.S. 17/92 from Palmetto Street to Market Street in Davenport:** Permit project: Expect a northbound and southbound daytime lane closure from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. through mid-June as crews begin widening and building a new turn lane.

**U.S. 17/92 from Ramona Avenue in Lake Alfred to 3<sup>rd</sup> Street in Haines City:** Construction project: Improvements under this contract include milling and resurfacing U.S. 17/92 and the entrance and exit ramps at U.S. 27, installing signal sensors, and replacing curb ramps on the sidewalks. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures and be prepared to merge as paving continues Sunday through Thursday nights.

**U.S. 17 from North of Transport Road to Avenue G S.W. in Bartow/Winter Haven:**

Construction project: This project includes milling and resurfacing, sidewalk work, curb and gutter, signal sensors and pavement markings. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures Sunday through Thursday nights as crews continue milling and resurfacing and adding concrete ramp reconstruction at various side streets, weather permitting. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

**S.R. 572 from Airport Road to Pipkin Creek Road and S.R. 572 Roundabout at Waring Road in Lakeland:**

Construction project: Project improvements include resurfacing and lane widening on S.R. 572 and a new roundabout at Waring Road. This week, crews will work on installing concrete in various locations, electrical installations at Airport Road, and signage.

- Motorists should expect lane closures through the duration of the construction.
- Resurfacing project – expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.
- Roundabout – expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. and from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Motorists should expect lane shifts through the duration of the construction.
- Drivers should exercise caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting the roadway through the duration of the construction.

**S.R. 570 (Polk Parkway) Resurfacing and Roadside Resurfacing Project from West of Lakeland Highlands Road to South of U.S. 92 in Lakeland/Auburndale:**

Turnpike project: Polk Parkway/S.R. 570 is being resurfaced from west of Lakeland Highlands Road (milepost 8) to south of U.S. 92 (milepost 17) in Polk County. Work includes paving Polk Parkway, U.S. 98 ramps, Lakeland Highlands Road, and Winter Lake Road. This project also includes installing new guardrails, rumble strips, and highly reflective signs and pavement markings, and upgrading existing drainage. Construction will continue through mid-2026. Approximate cost: \$20 million. **S.R. 570B (Central Polk Parkway):** Turnpike project: Florida's Turnpike Enterprise is constructing Central Polk Parkway/S.R. 570B, a new, four-lane (two lanes in each direction) toll roadway. This new stretch of roadway will begin at Polk Parkway/S.R. 570 and Winter Lake Road/S.R. 540 and extend approximately 6.5 miles to U.S. 17/S.R. 35. Construction will continue through 2029. Approximate cost: \$257

- S.R. 563 (Harden Boulevard) from Beacon Road to Magnolia Road in Lakeland:** Permit project: Expect nighttime/overnight southbound lane closures from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. as crews work on curb, sidewalk and temporary driveway. Use caution and be prepared to merge.
- S.R. 559 (Lake Ariana Boulevard) from Old Lake Alfred Road to Century Boulevard in Auburndale:** Utility project: Expect lane closures at night/overnight from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. while crews install and replace utility poles. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop.
- S.R. 544 (Lucerne Park Road) at Old Lucerne Park Road in Winter Haven:** Construction project: This project includes installing a new traffic signal at the intersection. Use caution, watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures and be prepared to merge or stop.
- S.R. 544 (Lucerne Park Road) from East Conine Drive to Winter Ridge Boulevard in Winter Haven:** Utility project: Crews are installing three mid-span poles and performing miscellaneous overhead work. Use caution, watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures from 10:30 p.m. to 4 a.m., and be prepared to merge or stop.
- S.R. 60 from SW 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue to MLK Boulevard in Mulberry:** Maintenance contracts project: Crews are repairing concrete, inlet tops, mitered ends and sidewalks. Anticipate lane closures at night/overnight from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. through early July.
- S.R. 60 Fort Fraser Trail Bridge between Wilson Avenue and U.S. 17 in Bartow:** Construction project: This project includes building a multi-use trail bridge over S.R. 60 to connect the north and south sections of the Fort Fraser Trail. Use caution and watch for workers close to the road as the contractor continues clearing and grubbing operations and erosion control. The trail is now closed at the north trial head just north of SR 60 through the end of the trail on the south side of SR 60. The north end of the trail remains open.
- S.R. 37 from Edgewood Drive to Lake Miriam Boulevard in Lakeland:** Maintenance contracts project: Crews are repairing concrete, inlet tops, mitered ends and sidewalks. Anticipate lane closures at night/overnight from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. through early July.
- S.R. 37 (North Florida Avenue) South of east Pine Street in Lakeland:** Maintenance: Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures with flaggers directing traffic at the railroad crossing as crews refresh safety striping. Use caution and be prepared to merge or stop at night/overnight from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. through Sunday, June 21.

**S.R. 37 (N Church Avenue/S Florida Avenue) from North of Virginia Street to South of Schoolhouse Road in Mulberry/Lakeland:** Construction project: This project includes milling and resurfacing the top layer of asphalt. This week crews will continue placing thermoplastic paint at night/overnight, weather permitting. Expect nighttime/overnight lane closures. Use caution and be prepared to merge.

**S.R. 33 (Lakeland Hills Boulevard) from Parkview Place to Griffin Road in Lakeland:** Construction project: Project improvements include roadway reconstruction, milling and resurfacing, placing curb and gutter, installing a new drainage system, widening sidewalk, upgrading signals and lighting, and upgrading water and sewer lines for the City of Lakeland.

This week, crews will continue grading and pouring concrete driveways and sidewalk, installing light pole bases and conduit for pedestrian signal poles along the east side of Lakeland Hills Boulevard. City of Lakeland crews will continue tying in new water lines and removing old lines throughout the project.

- Traffic impacts: One lane in each direction will remain open for most of the project duration. Drivers should use caution, be prepared to merge or stop, and allow extra travel time.
- Speed limit: Reduced to 35 MPH within the construction zone.

**S.R. 33 at Mount Olive Road in Polk City:** Construction project: This project includes installing a new traffic signal at the intersection. This week the crews continue underground and concrete work with no planned lane closures. Watch for shoulder closures and workers close to the road.

**S.R. 17 at Kokomo Road in Lake Hamilton:** Construction project: This project includes installing a new traffic signal at the intersection. This week the contractor will be installing span wire across the intersection. Use caution and watch for nighttime/overnight lane closures with workers close to the road.

## **SARASOTA COUNTY**

**I-75 at SR 780/Fruitville Road Interchange (Exit 210):** Construction project: Project will: reconstruct the interchange to a diverging diamond interchange; widen about two miles of I-75, from Palmer Boulevard to north of Fruitville Road, to a six-lane highway with three through lanes per direction; reconstruct or widen I-75 bridges over Fruitville Road, over Palmer Boulevard, and Main A Canal; widen Fruitville Road from Honore Avenue to east of Coburn Road; install seven-foot buffered bike lanes and six-foot sidewalks on Fruitville Road; replace traffic signals and lighting on Fruitville Road; and construct a noise wall on I-75 northbound from Bee Ridge Road on-ramp to just north of Main A Canal. This week, crews will

work on the interchange ramps, stormwater pond, and the I-75 bridges over Main A Canal and Palmer Boulevard.

- Nightly, from Sunday, June 14 to Thursday, June 18, from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m., crews will CLOSE the I-75 southbound off-ramp to Fruitville Road. Motorists can continue on I-75 southbound to Bee Ridge Road (Exit 207) and return to I-75 northbound to Fruitville Road (Exit 210); or identify alternative routes.
- Motorists should anticipate I-75 single-lane closures during the overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. during the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should anticipate I-75 double-lane closures during the overnight hours from 11:30 p.m. to 4:30 a.m. during the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should anticipate I-75 ramp closures during the overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. during the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should anticipate I-75 lane shifts during the duration of construction.
- Motorists should anticipate Fruitville Road single lane closures during the overnight hours from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. during the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should anticipate Fruitville Road double-lane closures during the overnight hours from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. throughout the duration of the construction.
- Motorists should anticipate Fruitville Road lane shifts during the duration of construction.
- Drivers should exercise caution and be aware of construction vehicles entering and exiting the interstate through the duration of the construction.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. Estimated completion is late 2029.

**I-75 at Toledo Blade Boulevard (exit 179) and Sumter Boulevard (exit 82) Interchange Improvements:** FDOT is making improvements to the I-75 at Toledo Blade Boulevard and I-75 at Sumter Boulevard interchanges. Improvements for both interchanges include the installation of signals at both ramp connections, controlled pedestrian crosswalks, intersection lighting, and the addition of northbound I-75 free flow on-ramps from southbound Toledo Blade Boulevard and from southbound Sumter Boulevard. In addition, northbound lanes will be widened to provide two full lanes through the Toledo Blade Boulevard interchange. At the Sumter Boulevard interchange, dual left turn lanes will be added from northbound Sumter Boulevard onto northbound I-75.

*The following activities are subject to change based on weather conditions and unforeseen underground conditions.*

**Sumter Boulevard Interchange:**

- Crews will be working on underground utility work and excavation.

**Toledo Blade Boulevard Interchange:**

- Crews will be working on underground utility work and clearing and grubbing.

**Lane/ramp closure restrictions:**

- When necessary, motorists should anticipate lane closures on the I-75 ramps between 10 p.m. and 4 a.m. and full ramp closures between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. Single lane closures on Sumter Boulevard and Toledo Blade Boulevard can be expected from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. as well as 7 p.m. to 7 a.m., and double lane closures from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. As major closures are added to the schedule, more information will be included in the weekly update.

**Districtwide Movable Bridges (Sarasota County):** Construction Project: The Florida Department of Transportation is installing Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) at various locations in Sarasota County. The following bridges began construction in March 2025:

**US 41 Business Intracoastal Waterway Bridge (Circus),  
US 41 Business Hatchett Creek/Intracoastal Waterway Bridge (KMI),  
SR 758 Sarasota Bay Bridge (Siesta Key),  
SR 72 Intracoastal Waterway Bridge (Stickney Point), and  
SR 789 New Pass Bridge (New Pass)**

- This project includes the installation of pedestrian/bicycle detection systems, conduits and electrical components, and connection to bridge tender buildings.
- Testing began in early February 2026.
- Motorists are advised that there will be intermittent sidewalk and lane closures throughout the duration of construction.
- Motorists should expect lane closures during the nighttime/overnight hours from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

- Motorists are advised to use caution in the construction zone.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway.

**Sarasota Bay Drawbridge No. 170061 (North Bridge) on County Road 758/Siesta Drive:** Construction project: The Florida Department of Transportation has begun normal bridge rehabilitation work to minimize the effects of the aggressive marine environment. This bridge project consists of concrete maintenance, rehabilitation of existing mechanical and electrical systems, and structural steel work and steel coating replacement.

- No lane closures are scheduled during holidays and there will be no lane closures during Fourth of July holiday, Friday, July 3 – Sunday, July 5.
- Overnight lane closures are expected from June 14 – July 24, from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. as crews work on the concrete bridge deck and apply epoxy overlay protection. Crews will work on one lane at a time, alternating sides. (Dates and times may change depending on weather or work schedules.)
  - Crews are currently not scheduled to work on weekends.
  - Motorists may wish to use the South/ Stickney Point Bridge or allow for additional travel time.
  - Flagger, barrels and warning signs will be present to help guide motorists through the construction zone.
  - Pedestrians and bicyclists will be escorted through the work zone.
  - Local residents closest to the bridge should anticipate noise and lights from construction equipment.
- Work will continue underneath the bridge span, Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Pedestrian and bicyclists will continue to have access.
- MARINE TRAFFIC: Bridge openings during June 22 - July 24 will be reduced to four (4) per night to accommodate the curing period needed for cement. Also, a four-hour notice is required for evening bridge openings.
- Expected completion remains late 2026.

**U.S. 301 from Desoto Road to University Parkway:** Construction project: Crews are milling and resurfacing U.S. 301 from Desoto Road to University Parkway in Sarasota County. In addition to resurfacing, crews will perform shoulder

treatment and apply new signing and pavement markings. The project limits cover approximately .5 miles.

- Motorists should expect temporary nighttime lane closures within the project limits starting in late spring.
- Motorists can expect areas of uneven pavement throughout the project area. Please exercise caution when traveling through active construction zones and follow posted speed limits.
- Motorists can expect crews to be intermittently working in and around the project limits during the day.
- Estimated project completion is mid-2026.

**U.S. 41 (S.R. 45) from Martin Luther King Jr. Way to Bayshore Road:** Permit project: The City of Sarasota is continuing Phases 5-7 on its Watermain Replacement project: There will be an alternating intermittent north and southbound inside and outside lane closure on U.S. 41 from Martin Luther King Jr. Way to Bayshore Road during the hours of 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Occasional intermittent nighttime work may be required throughout the project with an estimated completion in July 2027. Please look for lane shifts and construction workers.

**U.S. 41 from West of Lychee Road to South of East Bay Street:** Construction project: Crews are milling and resurfacing U.S. 41 from west of Lychee Road to south of East Bay Street in Sarasota County. In addition to resurfacing, crews will perform shoulder treatment and apply new signing and pavement markings. The project limits cover approximately 3.1 miles.

- Motorists can expect overnight temporary lane closures within the project limits for paving and pavement markings through early July.
- In order to keep the road open during construction, motorists can expect crews to work on alternating sides of road. This may cause uneven pavement on sections of roadway.
- Please use caution when traveling through active construction zones and follow posted speed limits.

Estimated project completion is mid-2026.

**U.S. 41 from West of West Villages Parkway to Woodmere Road:** Construction project: Crews are milling and resurfacing U.S. 41 from west of West Villages Parkway to Woodmere Road. The project limits cover approximately five miles. In addition to resurfacing, crews will perform shoulder treatment, install vehicle detection systems and apply new signing and pavement markings.

- Crews will be present intermittently throughout the project as final operations are completed.

Expected completion is mid-2026.

**U.S. 41 (S.R. 45) from Brimstone Hill Boulevard to Lombardo Boulevard:** Permit project: There will be an intermittent westbound outside lane closure on U.S. 41 from Brimstone Hill Boulevard to Lombardo Boulevard through the end of June from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. A contractor will be constructing a driveway connection entrance with drainage work. Please watch for lane closures and workers in and around the work zone.

**S.R. 789 from Bird Key Drive to Sunset Drive:** Construction project: This project includes the addition of dedicated bicycle and transit lanes on the bridge, drainage upgrades, and raising the seawall cap near Sunset Drive. Other project activities include resurfacing the roadway throughout the project corridor and the installation of new traffic signals at the intersections of Sunset Drive, Golden Gate Drive, and Bird Key Drive. The project also includes relocating palm trees and small shrubs from their current locations on the eastern area of the John Ringling Causeway to medians closer to St. Armands Circle.

This week's work will consist of:

- Delivery of machinery and materials
- Roadway median widening
- Concrete curb installation
- Drainage placement
- Drilled shaft installation
- Median barrier wall installation
- Milling and paving

Pedestrians should use designated paths and follow posted detour signs. Bike lanes are closed due to construction. Cyclists should follow the posted detour.

Lane closures will be in place during various phases of the project. Construction will primarily take place during daytime hours, with occasional nighttime work. Expect nighttime noise from backup alarms, construction equipment, pumps and power tools during daytime and nighttime operations. Drivers are urged to use caution and watch for workers, construction vehicles, pickup trucks, and equipment entering or exiting the travel lanes.

During construction, the speed limit on Gulfstream Avenue and John Ringling Causeway/S.R. 789 will remain 35 mph. Speeding fines are doubled in the construction zone when workers are present. Motorists are urged to drive cautiously and watch for workers, construction vehicles, pickup trucks, and other

equipment entering or exiting travel lanes. The estimated completion date for construction is early 2027.

**S.R. 777 River Road from I-75 to U.S. 41:** Construction project: Road embankment installation continues on the northbound roadway from Aucilla Drive to U.S. 41, and Venice Avenue to I-75. As embankment is completed, drainage installations, subgrade mixing, curb placement, and roadway grading will continue. Sod installation, signal, ITS, and lighting work are ongoing. Trucks will be crossing the road at various locations using intermittent flagging operations. Pothole maintenance will continue as necessary on all current travel ways through the project. Crews will conduct mainline paving operations and permanent sign installation within the project limits. Flagging operations may be used to guide travelers through the work areas as paving corrections occur. Please use caution and follow all road work and regulatory signs when traveling through the project.

**S.R. 776 from W Riverview Avenue to Hosmer Avenue:** Permits project: There will be an intermittent northbound outside lane closure through the end of June, from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. as Sarasota County's contractor installs/replaces five wood poles with concrete poles along S.R. 776. Please watch for lane closures and workers in the area.

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
